RECEIVING CAPACITY

Having a root of CAPACITY demonstrates how much you can contain. Reposition yourself as a receiver. God created you with an infinite capacity to receive-measureless. "Your limitations are not imposed on you, they are accepted by you," Ralph Marston. You only experience limitations when you stop receiving. You have the ability to accumulate more than enough in your container to have an ample supply to be in demand. Learn how to remove the cap so they can reset your boundaries. It is as easy as "biggie-sizing" your measuring cup: you determine the size of the container and when to stretch. You determine the substance for the in-filling. Before you give anything away, you must receive first. You can't give away anything you don't have. Your appetite determines your level of fulfillment. Begin to commit to sow something out of every receipt. Perform premaintenance checks on your container to prevent contents from being lost. It is possible to build a masterpiece with only one piece.
