GIVE GOD BREATHING ROOM TO WORK

Just like God has a personality, so does his mighty and powerful works. Get acquainted with Psalm 111, so you can recognize them: In essence, God's works are invaluable, irresistible, unforgettable, incorruptible, accountable, respectable, honorable, indisputable. Above all, they are distinguishable. You can put yours or someone else's work in his place, but you cannot replace God's. There is no comparison. Psalm 74:12 shows God's work ethic: systematically (thoroughly) and habitually (customarily). Hebrews 4:3 declares his work was finished before the foundation of the world: it requires no assembly. Furthermore, we should be able to recognize his work because it does not come in pieces. It comes as a masterpiece because he begins with the end in mind. Anticipating your return to the Garden of Eden, read Genesis 1st chapter; God made provision before he created Adam and Eve. Since Satan only has earth to work with now, God reversed the order of some of his greatest works so that the enemy stays puzzled. First, God births his vision in the ones who seek his face; then he unveils that vision in parts to protect and preserve his masterpiece. For example, God introduced the blood sacrifice in Genesis after the Fall of Man. Abraham saw God providing himself a lamb in the mount. Isaiah prophesied he is brought as a lamb to the slaughter. John the Baptist said behold the lamb of God cometh that takes away the sin of the world, although he formerly knew him as his cousin. During judgment, Jesus Christ opened not his mouth just like a sheep is dumb before the shearers. Even today, his blood still speaks for you and I. The manifested work of God changed the dynamics when he has breathing room to work. Don't fret about the pieces. The end is better.

JESUS IS ALWAYS SEEN WORKING THE WORKS OF GOD

Luke 10:18-20 confirms Jesus was an eyewitness when Satan was fired from heaven. I John 3:7-8 testifies Jesus fired Satan when he came to earth: the word "destroy" in Greek shows Jesus loosed Satan from a domain that he thought was his, earth. In other words, he dissolved his operations and Chapter 13 was filed. The devil is busy has been replaced by Satan is out of work. He cannot reorganize under the kingdom of God. At the same time, Jesus conferred power and authority to us. Mark 16:20 shows how Jesus worked with his disciples through signs and wonders. Now we have been authorized to do greater works in order to protect and preserve the work Jesus did on the cross.

YOU DO THE GREATER WORKS, NEVER SETTLE FOR LESS

Jeremiah 1:4-11 shows the diversity of our work from rooting out to building up. Replanted in the Garden of Eden, we usher in a way for others to return to the Garden of Eden as well. In raising up the former generations, proper succession is restored. Those we raise up will continue to repair the breach and restore the path back to the Garden of Eden. The assignment includes to wall-in and around with a hedge for protection and create a path back to the starting point with dominion for repossession. Prayer births the supernatural flow of the Holy Spirit to create God's wondrous manifestation of his finished work; it will be by the grace of God, and not the arm of flesh. The lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life keep the works "of" the world system, but walking and living in the Spirit targets the world to be generated into the kingdom of God.

REMOVE Satan's NAME FROM REEMPLOYMENT AND DEPLOYMENT

Satan's motive is found in John 10:10 as a thief, he only comes to steal, kill, and destroy. But he doesn't have to get anything, if you know without a shadow of a doubt that he cannot usurp the authority Jesus conferred to you. Steal means to filch, to draw out, extend, pilfer to take wrongfully from someone. To remain unnoticeable, he tries to take little by little. Kill means to rush in and slaughter for any purpose, causing someone to perish, to lose, or to be marred. Desirous of ruin to get you away from something near...your due season. Daniel 7:21-25 shows his works: 1) speaks against the Most High to wear out the saints—creating energy leaks so you feel exhausted about receiving from God. 2) makes suggestions to change the times and seasons i.e., he wants you to think and speak delay to accuse God for being tardy. 3) makes suggestions to change the laws of God, that is, your authority to decree something and it be established right then is a fallacy. Satan knows royal edicts can't be reversed and that he must bow and confess to the Lordship of Jesus. If you side with him, then what you believe and speak is in error. If you allow Satan to succeed, then you gave away an opportunity for God to help you out. Note: Small "s" in Satan is intentional.

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Thought for Transformation

Often there seems to be much confusion about calling evil, good and good, evil. Did God or Satan do that? Better yet, the devil made me do that, when in reality it may be your own doing. Everyday you may choose from a menu of events, either meat from God or spam from Satan. I apologize if you like spam. However, in the internet world, spam is quite unwanted. As you become more intimately acquainted with God, always keep him innocent. Since Jesus destroyed the works of the devil, why reemploy Satan? When you don't believe that what Jesus did on the cross is sufficient to keep the devil paralyzed, then you are pardoning Satan. Then you will allow him to apply for unemployment benefits. Then you will pay him to work against you. Say aloud, not this time around. Recall James 4:7. "Submit yourself therefore unto God, resist the devil, and he will flee from you". Give Satan no place. Don't give away power you received from the kingdom of God. Instead know the blessings (empowerment to prosper) and the cursing (empowerment to fail) that's outlined in Deuteronomy 28 so you can immediately recognize them. God will not give you a serpent, if you ask for a fish. Nor a stone if you ask for bread. Nor spam if you ask for meat. God knows the difference; be alert to know the distinction too.
