ONE TOUCH ON THE INSIDE CHANGES EVERYTHING ON THE OUTSIDE

We all have been empowered to live by faith. Potentially, we could be out of supply since the demand for it is in perpetual use. The inability of the heart to function properly weighs heavily on the quality and quantity of your faith. In an arrest stage, it lies dormant because of exhaustion. In Greek, the word "faint" in Galatians 6:9 is defined as wiped dry. Faintheartedness derives from weariness. The heart can be restless and yield to clogged reasoning, irregular rhythm, or bruised rhyme. In this state, you can experience different degrees of brokenness: physical or emotional illness, deterioration of sorts, or turn your pain into piercing others. If you have inventoried your lifeflow and find it is out of supply. If the demand that's placed on it is parched like a desert. If your heart can no longer resist attack. As one songwriter penned, "pick up your heart to take it to healing hands". When God heals your heart, whether you receive it instantaneously or processed over years, life stories transform drastically. "He healeth the broken in heart, and bindeth up their wounds," Psalm 147:3. Mark Twain illustrates in his quote how to celebrate life triumphantly instead of succumbing to the trial of your faith. "Dance like no is watching, sing like no one is listening, love like you've never been hurt and live like its heaven on earth." Give yourself permission to be whole.

BE STRONG IN THE LORD AND IN THE POWER OF HIS MIGHT

Your heart has the capacity to believe to receive the impossible, and if it can't do that no matter what the reason may be, you will always live well below God's daily covenant benefits. The Bible records that Abraham was strong in faith. "He did not weaken in faith when he considered... his own [100-year] body, which was as good as dead nor the barrenness of Sarah's deadened womb to conceive a child. No unbelief or distrust concerning the promise of God, but he grew strong and was empowered by faith as he gave praise and glory to God. Fully satisfied and assured that God was able and mighty to keep his Word and to do what He had promised." excerpt from Romans 4:16-25, The Amplified. Abraham was well fortified i.e., he had an impenetrable defense around what he believed. Therefore, he was 1) able to outlast attacks on his faith; 2) not easily subdued or taken in by deceptions; and 3) exercised the great force of the Word within to conquer all the odds – the violent takes by force [because s/he exercises unwavering faith in God to seize possessions].

THE GREATER THE HARVEST, THE GREATER THE WORKING TIME

Let's examine outstanding prayer requests you may have had for years with seemingly no visible signs of breakthrough. The greater the harvest expected, the greater the working time required for the seed, as well as, the greater waiting time there will also be for you. With perfect time, nothing can't be added to it nor taken away from it. If you are baking combread, you don't want to take it out of the oven one minute before time nor one minute after. Although you wait, the cornbread does not have a waiting time, only a working time. Set in motion, it rises all the time. Don't be so intent on opening the oven door that you cause it to fall, then it won't yield fully. Positioning self to "watch the wait" wastes time because it yields to inactivity or intercepts completion. Transform your waiting time into working on yourself so you can move from the "many called by grace" to the "chosen few by favor". If you are given something that is greater than your level of maturity, you will eventually reduce the great harvest to your miniature size and eventually unravel the finished work of God. Deut. 11: warns us of serving a god never known before. This verifies there are new tempters in the promised land. Maturity always predetermines God's way of escape is preeminent. The phrase, "well doing" means to plunge yourself into the finished work by allowing the Holy Spirit to order your steps in the Word for precision and to set his pace for the perfect work. "And I am convinced and sure of this very thing, that He who began a good work in you will continue until the day of Jesus Christ [right up to the time of his return] developing [that good work] and perfecting, and bringing it to full completion in you," Philippians 1:6, The Amplified.

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Thought for Transformation *Live by every word that* proceeds out of God's own mouth, the incorruptible Word that lives and abides forever. Develop your personal profile in all the areas you need overflow. *Commit quality time to* develop spiritually in the Word Intake the Word daily, by praying it aloud until vour heart is resuscitated. As you are filled with the fullness of God, you will be prepared to give to others out of your overflow. Never give out what it takes to keep you operating on full. That's not sacrifice, that's suicide. If not replenished, we won't be able to meas*ure in* — *to hear the voice* of truth nor measure out to speak requests in a finished state. If the Word of God is not kept fresh, what we believe will dissolve into oblivion over time. It's not an abrupt change. You won't notice it has even diminished until you need it and in an undeveloped state it can't be very present help in trouble. "Keep [guard] thy heart with all diligence, for out of it are the issues of life," Proverbs 4:23. In other words, if you let your defenses down, what you produce may end up worthless. Since every transaction originates from the heart, there must be an even exchange for every transition. Proven faith is how

we make our living.
