But for you who welcome him, in whom he dwellseven though you still experience all the limitations of sin—you yourself experience life on God's terms. It stands to reason, doesn't it, that if the alive-and-present God who raised Jesus from the dead moves into your life, he'll do the same thing in you that he did in Jesus, bringing you alive to himself? When God lives and breathes in you (and he does, as surely as he did in Jesus), you are delivered from that dead life. With his Spirit living in you, your body will be as alive as Christ's!" Jesus took the death out of life on earth. Resurrection!

IF WHAT IS IN YOUR HAND SEEMS DAMAGED, BUILD WITH IT ANYWAY

Having supernatural favor, Nehemiah's Spirit-led mission rebuilt the city's walls using the wasteland's charred rocks. Amidst back-to-back adversity, the people restored an impenetrable defense in 52 days. "When Sanballat heard that we were building the wall again... filled with anger he made fun of the Jews. He said..., "What are these weak Jews doing? Are they going to build things again for themselves? Will they give gifts on the altar in worship? Will they finish in a day? Will they get good stones for building from the dust, seeing they are burned?" Tobiah the Ammonite was near him and said, "If a fox would jump on what they build, he would break their stone wall down!," Nehemiah 4:1-3, NLV. Covering us, the Lord preserves us fireproof to stand the heat. Desire restoration? Recall this promise if your dream is under fire. "Look, a righteous King is coming, with honest princes! He will shelter Israel from the storm and wind. He will refresh her as a river in the desert and as the cooling shadow of a mighty rock within a hot and weary land," Isaiah 32:1-2, The Living Bible.
