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"Where the word of a king is, there is power: and who may say unto him, What doest thou?" Ecclesiastes 8:4

PERFECT DESIGN. VISION REALIZED. CRAFTED MASTERPIECE.

God pre-planned all his work when he created the world. His strategic (calculated, clear, concise, comprehensive, and commanding) plan and his tactical (step-by-step) plan can be seen by each meticulous detail. He even established a contingency plan if something was to go wrong, so he never once had to depend on crisis planning i.e., without prior arrangement, so will deal with it if and when a problem arises. He knew one wouldn't be most effective and efficient if s/he would have to try to create a plan during an actual emergency. The Scriptures declare his "before the foundation of the world" assignments: 1) Hebrews 4:3, God finished his work so he would have ample time to fellowship with us. 2) Revelation 13:8, Jesus, the Lamb of God, was slain to cover our mistakes and errors, even deceptions and lies we could potentially fall for... 3) Ephesians 1:4, We were chosen in Jesus Christ to bear his image as the ruling heir. being next in the chain of command... so you were not an afterthought, but a son or daughter of God.

God's greatest tool in planning was his wisdom. Proverbs 8th chapter expounds on the living, breathing, active personality of his wisdom to build with perfection. The Lord always uses a very systematic approach to working the earth's plan: divine order, balance, wholeness, fullness, overflow, and excess. Psalm 74:12 "For God is the King of old, working salvation in the midst of the earth." Translated in the Hebrew language the word "working" is defined as systematically and habitually. Under spiritual guidance, we are to exercise the same model. Psalm 37:23 confirms this. "The steps of a good man are ordered by the Lord: and he delighteth in his way." Psalm 110:3 reveals an inside conversation that God is having with Jesus about our readiness to be abandoned to his will. "Thy people shall be willing in the day of thy power, in the beauties of holiness from the womb of the morning: thou hast the dew of thy youth." The interpretation is simply this: God has ordained our steps to have delight in being reserved for the king's pleasure. In this restored state, our pleasure is therefore God's pleasure so Jesus can live the rest of his earthly life in us.

God used a 7-day window as his pattern for the production line. God's first workplace assignment was to turn on the lights. This gave him clarity into the chaotic state of affairs. He never once stumbled, because he could see things as they really were, and then transform the mass of destruction into a perfect environment, the Garden of Eden. Psalm 97:11, declares, "Light is sown for the righteous...", so you can reap a harvest of clarity. In other words, as an heir you reap where you have not sown. You are a partaker of Jesus' seed as an heir, which means that light is part of your divine inheritance. When clarity is fully manifested, it allows you to see in the dark, just as well as, you can see in the light. Now you can believe that everything that is concealed shall be revealed; and everything that is concealed be manifested. Either you will know that something exists although in the unseen realm and/or you will see it in the physical realm, but you won't be in the dark. Since it has been said that 80% of success is having clarity and the 20% is working it out, you actually have breakthrough once you receive clarity. Clarity is "knowing" the stages behind fulfillment: what to do, when to do it, how to do it, and why you are doing it. While the remaining 20% requires legwork, you can stand fully persuaded that it will be as God placed it in your heart. Just be determined to make the necessary room to accommodate the realized vision. Don't spare any space! Make a whole lot of room because God's assessment from heaven is that he only sees cramped quarters, i.e., there is not enough room to receive his delivery in the earth. Your breakthrough cannot be denied access into the earth, unless you break faith. Your assignment is to draw God's desire out into the open where its fulfillment can be completely expressed.

God spoke life to everything that was empty and void. God left nothing in a non-producing condition. If you know that the word you have kept near and dear to your heart is indeed God-sent, then believe that it is God-sure also. Moreover, God breathed into mankind the empowerment to create the fruit of his lips with his own words: we can speak the Word of God with the authority of Jesus Christ. The result shows everything lining up in order, balance, wholeness, fullness, overflow and excess. You vocalize fulfillment which surpasses desire. You speak of the promise as a finished work, where nothing is fragmented. This is when manifestation overtakes revelation. Begin with the root which is unseen and work your way up. Don't uproot your seed when authoring your faith. Allow your faith to finish the perfect work, which means you will believe to see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living and never be left to "see it to believe it". Read Mark 11:22-24.

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Thought for Transformation

The Lord's desire for you, is to take dominion over all the earth's resources, just like he has dominion over all of heaven. Psalm 115:16 declares, "The heaven, even the heavens, are the Lord's: but the earth hath he given to the children of men." Since he has "given" dominion of the earth to every man, saved or unsaved, he must be granted permission to work his will in it. When you give your life to God and when you pray, you give God permission to work on your behalf to only do good and never evil. If God doesn't have permission from the earth's inhabitants, he would be considered as "on the take" like satan. The more developed your relationship becomes with God, the more you will experience the fulfillment of his covenant partnership as his heir, adopted by your Heavenly Father. You will then come to better understand your easy accessibility into heaven's incorruptible resources that are laid up as you humbly submit to God in a stewardship role. Then reciprocity gives God the right of way into the earth's resources he requires for his divine operation. Since God has given us the best that heaven had to offer, in the person of Jesus Christ, why would anything else be withhold from us in the earth? i.e., Romans 8:32 paraphrased. Since that question has already been answered: God won't withhold his good, acceptable, and perfect will from us.
