King David penned Psalm 21 in the third person; he interceded for the current ruler as well as succeeding royalties. “The king shall joy in Thy strength, O LORD; and in Thy salvation how greatly shall he rejoice! Thou hast given him his heart’s desire, and hast not withholden the request of his lips. Selah. For Thou preventest [advanced] him with the blessings of goodness: Thou settest a crown of pure gold on his head. He asked life of Thee, and Thou gavest it him, even length of days for ever and ever. His glory is great in Thy salvation: honour and majesty hast Thou laid upon him. For Thou hast made him most blessed for ever: Thou hast made him exceeding glad with Thy countenance. For the king trusteth in the LORD, and through the mercy of the most High he shall not be moved,” Psalm 21:1-7, KJV. Be familiar with the good success you have enthroned as you declare the decree.

THE APPLIED WISDOM OF GOD COMES WITH HIS FAVORABLE INFLUENCE

In I Kings 3:5, TLB, “The Lord appeared to [Solomon] in a dream that night and told him to ask for anything he wanted, and it would be given to him!” Solomon’s reply demonstrates honor and humility before the Lord. “Give me an understanding mind so that I can govern Your people well and know the difference between what is right and what is wrong. For who by himself is able to carry such a heavy responsibility?” The Lord was pleased with his reply and was glad that Solomon had asked for wisdom. So He replied, “Because you have asked for wisdom in governing My people and haven’t asked for a long life, or riches for yourself, or the defeat of your enemies—yes, I’ll give you what you asked for! I will give you a wiser mind than anyone else has ever had or ever will have! And I will also give you what you didn’t ask for—riches and honor! And no one in all the world will be as rich and famous as you for the rest of your life! And I will give you a long life if you follow Me and obey My laws as your father David did,” I Kings 3:9-14, TLB. Choosing God’s wisdom means you choose God’s best, whether it is a request or a reply. “Where is the man who fears the Lord? God will teach him how to choose the best,” Psalm 25:12, TLB.

EMPOWERING JESUS: GRANT THE SIRE ALL THE ACCESS HE DESIRES

Entrance into the King’s court: “With gladness and rejoicing shall they be brought: they shall enter into the king’s palace,” Psalm 45:15. Elevation into the inner court. “He that loveth pureness of heart, for the grace of his lips the king shall be his friend,” Proverbs 22:11. Equivalent with the King on the throne. “He withdraweth not His eyes from the righteous: but with kings are they on the throne; yea, He doth establish them for ever, and they are exalted,” Job 36:7. “Don’t you have a King in your midst?...” Micah 4:9, (Voice).

GOD’S PEACE TREATY KEEPS YOU FROM BEING CONQUERED BY ENEMIES

God’s reign through you sanctions peace. “We have heard with our ears, O God, our fathers have told us, what work Thou didst in their days, in the times of old. How Thou didst drive out the heathen with Thy hand, and plantedst them; how Thou didst afflict the people, and cast them out. For they got not the land in possession by their own sword, neither did their own arm save them: but Thy right hand, and Thine arm, and the light of Thy countenance, because Thou hadst a favour unto them. Thou art my King, O God: command deliverances for Jacob. Through Thee will we push down our enemies: through Thy name will we tread them under that rise up against us. For I will not trust in my bow, neither shall my sword save me. But Thou hast saved us from our enemies, and hast put them to shame that hated us,” Psalm 44:1-7. Attempting to rule without God endorses war: “Don’t you remember what happened to the Ethiopians and Libyans and their vast army, with all of their chariots and cavalrymen? But you relied then on the Lord, and He delivered them all into your hand. For the eyes of the Lord search back and forth across the whole earth, looking for people whose hearts are perfect toward Him, so that He can show his great power in helping them. What a fool you have been! From now on you shall have wars,” 2 Chronicles 16:8-9.

Thought for Transformation

Refuse to be chained to unbelief. It prevents you from reigning triumphantly. “A poor, wise youth is better off than an old, foolish king who no longer accepts advice. For example, once a young man marched out of prison to become king; it had not mattered how poor he once had been in his kingdom. I saw all those who live out their lives under the sun flock to the side of a second youth who took the king’s place.” Ecclesiastes 4:13-15, The Voice “[The Lord] lifts the poor up out of the dust, the needy from the trash heap. He raises them to sit with princes and seats them on a glorious throne. For the pillars of the earth are the Eternal One’s, and on them, He has set the world.” I Samuel 2:8, The Voice. Rule in the midst of your enemies, all of them. Don’t live deprived of real faith. Be the authority and power. Be the head, not the tail. Be above only, and not beneath ever.
