HOLY SPIRIT ORCHESTRATES GLOBAL PRAISE FOLLOWED BY HARVEST

Psalm 67 (TPT) are heaven-born possibilities beyond your praise. It's Time to Praise Him. "God, keep us near Your grace-fountain and bless us! And when You look down on us, may Your face beam with joy! Pause in His presence Send us out all over the world so that everyone everywhere will discover Your ways and know who You are and see Your power to save. Let all the nations burst forth with praise; let everyone everywhere love and enjoy You! Then how glad the nations will be when You are their King. They will sing, they will shout, for You give true justice to the people. Yes! You, Lord, are the shepherd of the nations! Pause in His presence. No wonder the peoples praise You! Let all the people praise You more! The harvest of the earth is here! God, the very God we worship, keeps us satisfied at His banquet of blessings. And the blessings keep coming! Then all the ends of the earth will give Him the honor He deserves and be in awe of Him! Now Psalm 149:6-9, (TPT) proves the absolute power behind even babies' praise. No foe can stand; satan bows to say Jesus is Lord! "God's high and holy praises fill their mouths, for their shouted praises are their weapons of war! These warring weapons will bring vengeance on every opposing force and every resistant power—to bind kings with chains and rulers with iron shackles. Praise-filled warriors will enforce the judgment-doom decreed against their enemies. This is the glorious honor He gives to all His godly lovers. Hallelujah! Praise the Lord!"

SATISFACTION FROM THE ENEMY'S CROP FAILURE AND SEED ABORTION

Psalm 21 (KJV) King David invites God to rule in his stead. Speaking in the third person, he intercedes for his reign and succeeding royalty including Jesus Christ and beyond which includes you. He is expecting not to be oblivious to anything the enemy sows; he entreats the Lord to utterly destroy not only the fruit of the enemy, but also his seed. "The king shall joy in Thy strength, O LORD; and in Thy salvation how greatly shall he rejoice! Thou hast given him his heart's desire, and hast not withholden the request of his lips. Selah. For Thou [advanced] him with the blessings of goodness: Thou settest a crown of pure gold on his head. He asked life of Thee, and Thou gavest it him, even length of days forever and ever. His glory is great in Thy salvation: honour and majesty hast Thou laid upon him. For Thou hast made him most blessed forever: Thou hast made him exceeding glad with Thy countenance. For the king trusteth in the LORD, and through the mercy of the most High he shall not be moved. Thine hand shall find out all thine enemies: Thy right hand shall find out those that hate thee. Thou shalt make them as a fiery oven in the time of Thine anger: the LORD shall swallow them up in His wrath, and the fire shall devour them. Their fruit shalt Thou destroy from the earth, and their seed from among the children of men. For they intended evil against Thee: they imagined a mischievous device, which they are not able to perform. Therefore shalt Thou make them turn their back, when Thou shalt make ready Thine arrows upon Thy strings against the face of them. Be Thou exalted, LORD, in Thine own strength: so will we sing and praise Thy power." In Jeremiah 1:10-12 (AMPC), the Lord gives Jeremiah an apostolic and architectural post by vision to voice. This appears to be God's undercover assignment. Jeremiah interprets it as God producing a harvest without a root when the earth is not even ready to sow or reap. "See, I have this day appointed you to the oversight of the nations and of the kingdoms to root out and pull down, to destroy and to overthrow, to build and to plant. Moreover, the word of the Lord came to me, saying, Jeremiah, what do you see? And I said, I see a branch or shoot of an almond tree [the emblem of alertness and activity, blossoming in late winter]. Then said the Lord to me, You have seen well, for I am alert *and* active, watching over My word to perform it."

TO PRAISE? OR NOT TO PRAISE? THAT IS THE QUESTION

Deuteronomy 28:46-48 (TLB) answers the question for those who chose not to praise God; they complained instead. "These horrors shall befall you and your descendants as a warning: You will become slaves to your enemies because of your failure to praise God for all that he has given you. The Lord will send your enemies against you, and you will be hungry, thirsty, naked, and in want of everything. A yoke of iron shall be placed around your neck until you are destroyed!" Psalm 104:10-18 (TLB) is a picturesque landscape demonstrating a noticeable difference when you choose praise. You can see for yourself how God enjoys praise to work by. "[God] placed springs in the valleys and streams that gush from the mountains. They give water for all the animals to drink. There the wild donkeys quench their thirst, and the birds nest beside the streams and sing among the branches of the trees. He sends rain upon the mountains and fills the earth with fruit. The tender grass grows up at His command to feed the cattle, and there are fruit trees, vegetables, and grain for man to cultivate, and wine to make him glad, and olive oil as lotion for his skin, and bread to give him strength. The Lord planted the cedars of Lebanon. They are tall and flourishing. There the birds make their nests, the storks in the firs. High in the mountains are pastures for the wild goats, and rock badgers burrow in among the rocks and find protection there." God thrives in the atmosphere of your praise. Don't stop praising Him!

Thought for Transformation

Don't take your script from contradiction. Habakkuk 3:17-19 (MSG) gives you cues on how to respond to blight. Praise your way until you see the harvest. Let your praise of God be much greater than the infertility you see, hear, touch, taste, or smell. "Though the cherry trees don't blossom and the strawberries don't ripen, Though the apples are worm-eaten and the wheat fields stunted, Though the sheep pens are sheepless and the cattle barns empty, I'm singing joyful praise to GOD. I'm turning cartwheels of joy to my Savior God. Counting on GOD's Rule to prevail, I take heart and gain strength. I run like a deer. I feel like I'm king of the mountain! On the other hand, Psalm 4:5-8 (VOICE) instructs you on how to respond to bounty. Let your praise of God still be much greater than the abundance you see, hear, touch, smell and taste. "From this day forward, offer to God the right sacrifice from a heart made right by God. Entrust yourself to the Eternal. Crowds of disheartened people ask, "Who can show us what is good?" Let Your brilliant face shine upon us, O Eternal One, that we may know the undeniable answer. You have filled me with joy, and happiness has risen in my heart, great delight and unrivaled joy, even more than when bread abounds and wine flows freely. Tonight I will sleep securely on a bed of peace because I trust You, You alone, O Eternal One, will keep me safe. The more you praise God, the more you keep the bounty flowing until blight can't be found in your land at all. That is the effect of the Lord of the Harvest favoring you in His season.
