Reserve tangible space that represents your work of faith is alive, energetic, operative, and proactive, not dead. Refute and refuse all spoken and written contradiction: life and death follows your own words. Remain relentless about your pursuit to repossess what satan has stolen from you and don't compromise. Rest in the finished work of God; then you will be in position to receive the delivery of the promise.

A New Life

Create Space

Unbelieving-Unbeliever: must always see it to believe it

(1828) Unbelief – infidelity; the withholding of belief; incredulous; disbelief of divine revelation (faith-based)

Unbelieve – to discredit; not to believe or trust.

Scoff: derision; ridicule; mockery or reproach, expressed in contempt. Considered weakness; folly; and wickedness

Genesis 18:11-15 Living Bible (TLB)

¹¹ Now Abraham and Sarah were both very old, and Sarah was long since past the time when she could have a baby.

¹² So Sarah laughed silently. "A woman my age have a baby?" she scoffed to herself. "And with a husband as old as mine?"

¹³ Then God said to Abraham, "Why did Sarah laugh? Why did she say 'Can an old woman like me have a baby?'" ¹⁴ Is anything too hard for God? Next year, just as I told you, I will certainly see to it that Sarah has a son."

(1828) Disbelief - Refusal of credit or faith

Disbelieve – not to believe; to hold not to be true or not to exist; to refuse to credit,

¹⁶ And I will bless her (Sarah) and give you (Abraham) a son from her! Yes, I will bless her richly, and make her the mother of nations! Many kings shall be among your posterity."

¹⁷ Then Abraham threw himself down in worship before the Lord, but inside he was laughing in disbelief!^[a] "Me, be a father?" he said in amusement [delight]. "Me—100 years old? And Sarah, to have a baby at 90?"

¹⁸ And Abraham said to God, "Yes, do bless Ishmael!"

Holy Spirit repletes until your hope is fully resuscitated

Crowd out Contradiction

Unbelieving-Believer: Skeptical about seeing what they believe

Cross the Line

Believing-Believer: only sees the future brighter, never having any proof of the finished work. Capture God's vision until it is indelible.

Receiving-Believer: Confidently receives the end of its faith now, so patiently endures until manifestation comes
