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Voice of Triumph

“Therefore I say unto you, What things [promises] soever ye desire [be sure of what you desire and what you don’t desire], when ye pray [in covenant with God], believe [without doubt in your heart] that ye receive them [promises], and ye shall have [own] them.” Hebrews 11:13, KJV, emphasis KJF

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LIVE IN TOTAL DAILY SURRENDER TO THE ONE AND ONLY LIVING GOD

Faith works by love. A proficiency test proves the quality of Abraham’s trust after he asks God for an heir. Will he believe God in the face of a barren womb? At first, Ishmael is a misinterpretation of what’s heaven-born. Afterwards, Abraham receives the promise, Isaac. Then God asks Abraham to sacrifice Isaac. The Lord emphasizes offering the son he loves. Now this is a performance test. God desires Abraham to demonstrate who is his first love. Only what he is willing to sacrifice validates this. This time, will he believe God in the face of a buried tomb to raise him from the dead? The proficiency test reveals His love for you before you receive the promise, while the performance test reveals your love for Him after you receive the promise. Will your love wane for the Lord after you have enjoyed the reality of the promised inheritance for almost two decades? Let God’s love demonstrate how much you received of Him that you willingly sacrifice what He has given to you. Galatians 5:6 (TPT) highlights communion with Jesus Christ; let it be paramount over anyone or anything, even the desires of own your heart. “...All that matters now is living in the faith that is activated and brought to perfection by love.” Always keep your affections qualified.

ADAPTABILITY: RECEIVING ENDORSES OR ENFORCES POSSIBILITIES

Abraham’s faith hosted God’s promise: God made him the father of many nations. His right believing and receiving fills the womb and later empties the tomb. Two Greek words for “received” describe the difference. Heb. 11:17 (AMPC) “By faith Abraham, when he was put to the test [while the testing of his faith was still in progress], had already brought Isaac for an offering; he who had gladly received *and* welcomed [God’s] promises was ready to sacrifice his only son.” Strong’s definition for *anadēchōmai* is “to entertain (as a guest). Vine’s defines it as “to gladly receive.” This is like family and friends welcoming troops home from a tour of duty. *Anadēchōmai* endorses God’s guarantee so Abraham reserves space to accommodate the Lord to fill Sarah’s womb. Heb. 11:19 (AMPC) “For he reasoned that God was able to raise [him] up even from among the dead. Indeed in the sense that Isaac was figuratively dead [potentially sacrificed], he did [actually] receive him back from the dead.” In that verse, the word “received in Strong’s is *kōmizō* which means to “carry off (as if from harm). Vine’s defines it as “to receive back, recover.” This is similar to military troops redeployed to retrieve territory. *Kōmizō* enforces God’s guarantee so Abraham preserves space for his own legacy by emptying the tomb. Live adaptable!

DEVELOP YOUR FAITH TO RECEIVE ON ALL LEVELS

Heaven-born possibilities are born out of impossibilities. Our eternal covenant is based on God making heaven accessible to us and our making earth accessible to God. 1) God accommodates Abraham’s invocation, i.e., exercising faith to conceive seed out of impossibility, a barren womb. Secondly, Abraham accommodates God’s invocation, i.e., exercising his faith to retrieve the harvest out of impossibility, a buried tomb. Yes, there is a paradigm behind receiving your God-given inheritance by faith. Hebrews 11:13-14 (KJV) is a snapshot. “These all died in faith, not having received the promises, but 1) having seen them afar off, and 2) were persuaded of them, and 3) embraced them, and 4) confessed that they were strangers and pilgrims on the earth. For they that say such things declare plainly that they seek a country.” Receive God’s picture. Rehearse it until it is undisputable. Reserve tangible space. Refute spoken contradiction; life and death follows your own words.

GOD’S ETERNAL COVENANT IS IMMUTABLE: EACH PARTNER HAS A PART

Every covenant God made with Abraham aligned him to receive the impossible. Gen. 17:4-8 (KJV) “As for Me, behold, My covenant is with thee, and thou shalt be a father of many nations. Neither shall thy name any more be called Abram, but thy name shall be Abraham; for a father of many nations have I made thee. And I will make thee exceeding fruitful, and I will make nations of thee, and kings shall come out of thee. And I will establish My covenant between me and thee and thy seed after thee in their generations for an everlasting covenant, to be a God unto thee, and to thy seed after thee. And I will give unto thee, and to thy seed after thee, the land wherein thou art a stranger, all the land of Canaan, for an everlasting possession; and I will be their God.” Gen. 17:9-10; 15, 19 (KJV) “And God said unto Abraham, Thou shalt keep My covenant therefore, thou, and thy seed after thee in their generations. This is My covenant, which ye shall keep, between Me and you and thy seed after thee; Every man child among you shall be circumcised. And God said unto Abraham, As for Sarai thy wife, thou shalt not call her name Sarai, but Sarah shall her name be. And God said, Sarah thy wife shall bear thee a son indeed; and thou shalt call his name Isaac: and I will establish My covenant with him for an everlasting covenant, and with his seed after him.” Romans 4:20-21 (TLB) celebrates Abraham’s faith. “But Abraham never doubted. He believed God, for his faith and trust grew ever stronger, and he praised God for this blessing even before it happened. He was completely sure that God was well able to do anything He promised.” Abraham’s worship and praise of God possessed his inheritance; what he voiced confirmed God’s vow, which prevented unbelief.

Thought for Transformation

God is eternally disposed to give you everything. The Triumph of God’s Love. “For God has proved His love by giving us His greatest treasure, the gift of His Son. And since God freely offered Him up as the sacrifice for us all, He certainly won’t withhold from us anything else He has to give,” Romans 8:32 (TPT). Psalm 84:11 (AMPC) also confirms God’s heart “For the Lord God is a Sun and Shield; the Lord bestows [present] grace and favor and [future] glory (honor, splendor, and heavenly bliss)! No good thing will He withhold from those who walk uprightly.”

Be A Wide Receiver

All Jesus is and all He has have been already deposited within you. Just receive! “For out of His fullness (abundance) we have all received [all had a share and we were all supplied with] one grace after another and spiritual blessing upon spiritual blessing and even favor upon favor and gift [heaped] upon gift,” John 1:16 (AMPC).

A Checked Heart Protects

God’s dream is Isaac; He assessed Sarah’s laugh as unbelief against His vowed covenant promise in Gen. 18:9-15 (KJV). “Therefore Sarah laughed within herself, saying, After I am waxed old shall I have pleasure, my lord being old also? And the Lord said unto Abraham, Wherefore did Sarah laugh saying, Shall I of a surety bear a child, which am old? Is anything too hard for the Lord? At the time appointed I will return unto thee, according to the time of life, and Sarah shall have a son. Sarah denied, saying, I laughed not; for she was afraid. And he said, Nay; but thou didst laugh.” God checks hearts so the delivery of His finished work can’t be aborted. Meditate to manifest promises.

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
