### The Tsunami Blessing: Inside and Out, Part 35

Transfer your trust from the "other god, even if it is yourself" to the One and Only, True and Living God. Then your faith in God will be postured with an open heart that is always pure and perfect before the Lord without any potential betrayal. Your constant honor as well as humility before the Lord serves as your way of escape during every temptation. The baptism of God's love casts out the fear of death so you can walk courageously in the fear of the Lord, i.e., your reverence for Him.

Always expect the best. Without any fear of evil foreboding, prepare for the worst. God has a future and hope that is for His glory and your good, never to harm you in anyway. Holy Spirit will show you how to possess the gates of your enemies so satan can't get any access; the devil only bites after he finds a breach. Live determined that satan will not find anything in you that is in common with him or the demonic. Live free all the days of your life, so you live the days of heaven on earth without any oppression, but possession of the enemy's gates.

Restore the Generational Blessing In response to fear, one will fight with it, flee from it, freeze in the face of it, or even feed on it.

Wherever the love of God doesn't rule, fear will exercise dominion through oppression.

- 1) God commanded Israel not to fear the Amorites [steal their command]; but the fear of them caused 7-year oppression.
- 2) Afraid of the Midianites, Gideon was threshing wheat in the winepress, instead of an open field.
- 3) Afraid that God was going to kill him because Gideon saw the face of an angel
- 4) Afraid of the people in his own town, Gideon hid behind his father after he destroyed the idol Baal and the adjacent grove as God directed
- 5) Afraid of trusting God, Gideon asked for two signs to ensure victory from God over the enemies; fleece and wet land and the reverse.
- 6) Afraid, Gideon's son Jether hid behind his father and would not kill the two enemy kings as commanded, even with his father's reinforcement.

# Jesus freed you from oppression and possessed the gates of your enemies.

Hebrews 2:14-15 King James Version (KJV)

<sup>14</sup>Forasmuch then as the children are partakers of flesh and blood, he also himself likewise took part of the same; that through death he might destroy him that had the power of death, that is, the devil;

<sup>15</sup>And deliver them who through fear of death were all their lifetime subject to bondage.

# The blessing that Abraham received from God after he offered Isaac as a living sacrifice includes the gates of the enemies.

### Indication of where the enemy sets

6 Now it came to pass when Sanballat, and Tobiah, and Geshem the Arabian, and the rest of our enemies, heard that I had builded the wall, and that there was no breach left therein; (though at that time I had not set up the doors upon the gates;)

Rev. 9:11 Apollyon [destroyer] is the king that works at the intersection in order to bring death, perish, mar, lose. That is to keep you away from something near in place, time, or relation; you are about to land the promise. The enemy tries to form a weapon to prevent you from the final separation, departure, cessation, completion, or reversal required for you to succeed.

<sup>4</sup>As arrows are in the hand of a mighty man; so are children of the youth.

<sup>5</sup>Happy is the man that hath his quiver full of them: they shall not be ashamed, but they shall speak [destroy, subdue] with the enemies in the gate.

#### Footnotes:

- a. Psalm 127:4 The Hebrew text refers to children as "arrows in the hands of a warrior." Our children will be our future protection and provision. So the more the merrier!
- b. Psalm 127:5 The Hebrew includes a reference to "speaking with your enemies at the gate."
  This is in the context of children being God's way of blessing parents in their old age.

Restore Agricultural Blessing
When Judges 6 begins the Children of Israel were steeped in
idolatry. The Midianites oppressed the Children of Israel at
harvestime for seven years straight. Now the Midianites are
positioned to raid the crops and livestock once again and destroy all

their increase. After the children cried for help, God sent a prophet to help them to understand why they were having a back to back crop failure as well as to send them correction on mending their ways.

#### **God selected Gideon as Priest**

Revelation 1:5-6 King James Version (KJV)

- <sup>5</sup>And from Jesus Christ, who is the faithful witness, and the first begotten of the dead, and the prince of the kings of the earth. Unto him that loved us, and washed us from our sins in his own blood,
- <sup>6</sup>And hath made us kings and priests unto God and his Father; to him be glory and dominion for ever and ever. Amen.

# Judges 6:17-21 - Gideon Made a Meal offering before God 1) The Meal Offerings

The Israelites offered meal (cereals) or vegetables in addition to the animals. Leviticus chapter 2 mentions 4 kinds of cereal offerings and gives cooking instructions for each. The sinner could offer dough from wheat flour baked in an oven, cooked on a griddle, fried in a pan, or roasted to make bread (as in the offering of the first fruits). All meal offerings were made with oil and salt and no honey and leaven were to be used (oil and salt preserved while honey and leaven would spoil). The worshipper was also to bring a portion of incense (frankincense).

The meal offerings were brought to one of the priests, who took it to the altar and cast a "memorial portion" on the fire and he did this also with the incense. The priest ate the remainder unless he was bringing the meal offering for himself where he would burn the whole thing.

The purpose of the meal offering was an offering of gifts and speaks of a life that is dedicated to generosity and giving.

Judges 6:25-26 - Gideon prepared a burnt offering to cover children of Israel sin of idolatry after he destroyed and the adjacent grove. Serving another god was considered the ultimate betrayal because it dishonored their covenant with God. Broken loyalty.

## 2) The Burnt Offerings

The burnt offering was a sacrifice that was completely burnt. None of it was to be eaten at all, and therefore the fire consumed the whole sacrifice. It is also important to note that the fire on the altar was never to go out:

#### Lev 6:13 'A fire shall always be burning on the altar; it shall never go out.

The common Israelite worshipper brought a male animal (a bull, lamb, goat, pigeon, or turtledove depending on the wealth of the worshipper) to the door of the tabernacle.

Lev 1:3 'Let him offer a male without blemish; he shall offer it of his own free will at the door of the tabernacle of meeting before the LORD.

The animal had to be without blemish. The worshipper then placed his hands upon the head of the animal and in awareness that this innocent animal was standing in for the sinner he would seek the Lord for forgiveness and then killed the animal immediately.

Lev 1:4-9 'Then he shall put his hand on the head of the burnt offering, and it will be accepted on his behalf to make atonement for him. 'He shall kill the bull before the LORD; and the priests, Aaron's sons, shall bring the blood and sprinkle the blood all around on the altar that is by the door of the tabernacle of meeting . . . and the priest shall burn all on the altar as a burnt sacrifice, an offering made by fire, a sweet aroma to the LORD.

The priests were also responsible to wash various parts of the animal before putting it on the altar:

Lev 1:6-9 'And he shall skin the burnt offering and cut it into its pieces. 'The sons of Aaron the priest shall put fire on the altar, and lay the wood in order on the fire. 'Then the priests, Aaron's sons, shall lay the parts, the head, and the fat in order on the wood that is on the fire upon the altar; 'but he shall wash its entrails and its legs with water.

Later In Israel's history there were burnt offerings made twice per day, one at morning and one at evening (when the first star appeared:

Num 28:3-4 "And you shall say to them, 'This is the offering made by fire which you shall offer to the LORD: two male lambs in their first year without blemish, day by day, as a regular burnt offering. 'The one lamb you shall offer in the morning, the other lamb you shall offer in the evening"

The Burnt offering was performed to atone for the peoples sins against the Lord and was a dedication offering of ones life before the Lord continually.

Proverbs 25:21-22 Amplified Bible, Classic Edition (AMPC)

<sup>21</sup> If your enemy is hungry, give him bread to eat; and if he is thirsty, give him water to drink;

<sup>22</sup>For in doing so, you will heap coals of fire upon his head, and the Lord will reward you.

#### Footnotes:

a. Proverbs 25:22 This is not to be understood as a revengeful act intended to embarrass its victim, but just the opposite. The picture is that of the high priest (Lev. 16:12) who, on the Day of Atonement, took his censer and filled it with "coals of fire" from off the altar of burnt offering, and then put incense on the coals to create a pleasing, sweet-smelling fragrance. The cloud or smoke of the incense covered the mercy seat and was acceptable to God for atonement. Samuel Wesley wrote:/ "So artists melt the sullen ore of lead,/ By heaping coals of fire upon its head:/ In the kind warmth the metal learns to glow,/ And pure from dross the silver runs below."

### 3) The Peace Offerings

The peace offering was a meal that was shared with the Lord, the priests, and sometimes the common Israelites. The worshipper was to bring a male or female oxen, sheep, or a goat. The ritual was closely compared to the burnt offering up to the point of the actual burning where the animals blood was poured around the edges of the altar. The fat and entrails were burned and the remainder was eaten by the priests and (if it was a free-will offering) by the worshippers themselves. **This sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving was most of the time a voluntary act.** 

The Peace offerings included unleavened cakes. The priests ate all except the memorial portion of the cakes and certain parts of the animal on the same day the sacrifice was made, and when the worshipper joined in and the offering was free-will the worshipper could eat for 2 days of the whole animal except the breast and the right thigh which were eaten by the priests.

Jacob and Laban offered a peace offering when they made their treaty (Gen 31:43 ff). It was required to make offerings while making a vow of ones life to God and thanking Him with praise while free-will offerings were voluntary.

### 4) The Sin Offerings

The sin offering expiated (paid the debt in full) the worshippers unintentional weaknesses and failures before the Lord.

Lev 4:1-4 Now the LORD spoke to Moses, saying, "Speak to the children of Israel, saying: 'If a person sins unintentionally against any of the commandments of the LORD in anything which ought not to be done, and does any of them, 'if the anointed priest sins, bringing guilt on the people, then let him offer to the LORD for his sin which he has sinned a young bull without blemish as a sin offering. 'He shall bring the bull to the door of the tabernacle of meeting before the LORD, lay his hand on the bull's head, and kill the bull before the LORD.

Each class of people had various ordinances to perform:

**Sins of the high priest** required the offering of a bull and the blood was not poured on the altar but sprinkled from the finger of the high priest 7 times on the altar. Then the fat was burnt, and the remainder was burned (never eaten) outside the camp "unto a clean place" where the sacrifice was made and the ashes were poured out.

Lev 4:12 'the whole bull he shall carry outside the camp to a clean place, where the ashes are poured out, and burn it on wood with fire; where the ashes are poured out it shall be burned.

**Sins of the leaders** required the offering of a male goat. the blood was sprinkled only once and the remainder was poured around the altar as with the burnt offering.

**Sins of the common Israelites** required female animals, goats, lambs, turtledoves, or pigeons and in the case of the very poor an offering of grain was acceptable just like a meal offering.

Unintentional sins were difficult to identify and could happen at any time and therefore the priests worked closely as mediators with God and the people and were there to instruct the people as they sought the Lord. In case any sins were not brought before the Lord there were offerings for the nation and for the high priest which covered them all in a collective way. On the Day of Atonement (Yom Kippur) the high priest sprinkled blood on the mercy seat for his own sins and the sins of the nation.

## 5) The Trespass Offerings

The trespass offering was very similar to that of the sin offering but the main difference was that the trespass offering was an offering of money for sins of ignorance connected with fraud. For example if someone unintentionally cheated another out of money or property, his sacrifice was to be equal to the amount taken, plus one-fifth to the priest and to the one offended. Therefore he repaid twice the amount taken plus 40 %.

Lev 6:5-7 "He shall restore its full value, add one-fifth more to it, and give it to whomever it belongs, on the day of his trespass offering. And he shall bring his trespass offering to the LORD, a ram without blemish from the flock, with your valuation, as a trespass offering, to the priest. So the priest shall make atonement for him before the LORD, and he shall be forgiven for any one of these things that he may have done in which he trespasses."

#### **Built an altar Jehovah Shalom**

Altars are mentioned often in the Bible. Ancient altars were raised structures that people placed sacrifices on. In the ancient world the altar was almost exclusively built as a monument to remember or commemorate a divine occurrence which took place at a certain location. In ancient Israel altars were very significant, they symbolized communion with the LORD. They were a place of worship and a place to remember His covenant. The "altar' was a place of "approach", a place to call upon the name of the LORD and remember His glorious promises.

Jehovah shalom (Yahweh shalom) The Lord is Peace

Jehovah shalom is one of three names for God that was actually given to an altar. It happened when the angel of Yahweh (the LORD) visited Gideon to recruit him as a new judge over Israel to deliver the nation from the Midianites. Gideon thought that he would die because he had seen the angel. God spoke to Him and said, "Peace! Do not be afraid. You are not going to die" (Judg. 6:23 NIV). The incident made such an impression on Gideon that he built an altar in Ophrah and gave it the name Jehovah shalom. Altars made of uncut stones lasted for centuries in the relatively dry climate of Israel.

Shalom is not just an absence of noise or strife. The word shalom speaks of wholeness and harmony with oneself and others, and of completion and fulfillment. As Jesus said, it is a peace far beyond the world's peace (John 14:27; 16:33). The ultimate peace is peace with God. The Bible contains a promise about God's peace: "Thou wilt keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on thee: because he trusts in thee" (Isa. 26:3 KJV). Peace comes to us when we focus our lives on God and trust Him. In order to feel peaceful about a God who is perfect and vastly superior to us we must change as Gideon did. Gideon's initial fear of God was laid aside when he heard God speak peace to Him instead of killing him.

### Jesus bequeathed us His peace

John 16:33 Amplified Bible, Classic Edition (AMPC)

<sup>33</sup>I have told you these things, so that in Me you may have [perfect] peace *and* confidence. In the world you have tribulation *and* trials *and* distress *and* frustration; but be of good cheer [take courage; be confident, certain, undaunted]! For I have overcome the world. [I have deprived it of power to harm you and have conquered it for you.]

Exodus 20:1-7 King James Version (KJV)

**20** And God spake all these words, saying,

- <sup>2</sup>I am the LORD thy God, which have brought thee out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage.

Advancing "as one man" shows Gideon had a seamless connection with God as well as for Gideon to envision the enemy as one person, instead of 135,000 destroyers.

The LORD is with thee, thou mighty man of valour.

### Knowing Christ means more love and confidence, less and less fear

<sup>14-16a</sup>We ourselves are eye-witnesses able and willing to testify to the fact that the Father did send the Son to save the world. Everyone who acknowledges that Jesus is the Son of God lives in him, and he lives in God. So we have come to know and trust the love God has for us.

<sup>16b-18</sup> God is love, and the man whose life is lived in love does, in fact, live in God, and God does, in fact, live in him. So our love for him grows more and more, filling us with complete confidence for the day when he shall judge all men—for we realise that our life in this world is actually his life lived in us. Love contains no fear—indeed fully-developed love expels every particle of fear, for fear always contains some of the torture of feeling guilty. This means that the man who lives in fear has not yet had his love perfected.

<sup>19-21</sup>Yes, we love him because he first loved us. If a man says, "I love God" and hates his brother, he is a liar. For if he does not love the brother before his eyes how can he love the one beyond his sight? And in any case it is his explicit command that the one who loves God must love his brother too.

# Righteousness illustrates your capability to believe right about everyone and everything: God, self, friends, family, enemies, and satan.

Never brag or boast about what you've done and you'll prove that you're truly wise. <sup>14</sup> But if there is bitter jealousy or competition hiding in your heart, then don't deny it and try to compensate for it by boasting and being phony. <sup>15</sup> For that has nothing to do with God's heavenly wisdom but can best be described as the wisdom of this world, both selfish<sup>[b]</sup> and devilish.<sup>[c]</sup> <sup>16</sup> So wherever jealousy<sup>[d]</sup> and selfishness are uncovered, you will also find many troubles<sup>[e]</sup> and every kind of meanness.

<sup>17</sup>But the wisdom from above is always pure,<sup>[0]</sup> filled with peace, considerate and teachable.<sup>[0]</sup> It is filled with love<sup>[0]</sup> and never displays prejudice or hypocrisy<sup>[1]</sup> in any form <sup>18</sup> and it always bears the beautiful harvest of righteousness! Good seeds of wisdom's fruit will be planted with peaceful acts by those who cherish making peace.
