1.You are Repositioned by Jesus' Resurrection for Reconciliation

Isaiah 52:13-15 Living Bible (TLB)

¹³See, my Servant^[a] shall prosper; he shall be highly exalted. ¹⁴⁻¹⁵Yet many shall be amazed when they see him—yes, even far-off foreign nations and their kings; they shall stand dumbfounded, speechless in his presence. For they shall see and understand what they had not been told before. They shall see my Servant beaten and bloodied, so disfigured one would scarcely know it was a person standing there. So shall he cleanse^[b] many nations.

Isaiah 53 Living Bible (TLB)

53 But, oh, how few believe it! Who will listen? To whom will God reveal his saving power? ²In God's eyes^[a] he was like a tender green shoot, sprouting from a root in dry and sterile ground. But in our eyes there was no attractiveness at all, nothing to make us want him. ³We despised him and rejected him—a man of sorrows, acquainted with bitterest grief. We turned our backs on him and looked the other way when he went by. He was despised, and we didn't care.

⁴Yet it was *our* grief he bore, *our* sorrows that weighed him down. And we thought his troubles were a punishment from God, for his *own* sins! ⁵But he was wounded and bruised for *our* sins. He was beaten that we might have peace; he was lashed—and we were healed! ⁶*We*—every one of us—have strayed away like sheep! *We*, who left God's paths to follow our own. Yet God laid on *him* the guilt and sins of every one of us!

⁷He was oppressed and he was afflicted, yet he never said a word. He was brought as a lamb to the slaughter; and as a sheep before her shearers is dumb, so he stood silent before the ones condemning him. ⁸From prison and trial they led him away to his death. But who among the people of that day realized it was their sins that he was dying for—that he was suffering their punishment? ⁹He was buried like a criminal, but in a rich man's grave; but he had done no wrong and had never spoken an evil word.

¹⁰But it was the Lord's good plan to bruise him and fill him with grief. However, when his soul has been made an offering for sin, then he shall have a multitude of children, many heirs. He shall live again,^[b] and God's program shall prosper in his hands. ¹¹And when he sees all that is accomplished by the anguish of his soul, he shall be satisfied; and because of what he has experienced, my righteous Servant shall make many to be counted righteous before God, for he shall bear all their sins. ¹²Therefore, I will give him the honors of one who is mighty and great because he has poured out his soul unto death. He was counted as a sinner, and he bore the sins of many, and he pled with God for sinners.

2.You are Repositioned by Jesus' Resurrection for Reconstruction

Isaiah 54 Living Bible (TLB)

54 Sing, O childless woman! Break out into loud and joyful song, Jerusalem,^[a] for she who was abandoned has more blessings* now than she whose husband stayed! ²Enlarge your house; build on additions; spread out your home! ³For you will soon be bursting at the seams! And your descendants will possess the cities left behind during the exile and rule the nations that took their lands.

⁴Fear not; you will no longer live in shame. The shame of your youth and the sorrows of widowhood will be remembered no more, ⁵for your Creator will be your “husband.” The Lord Almighty is his name; he is your Redeemer, the Holy One of Israel, the God of all the earth. ⁶For the Lord has called you back from your grief—a young wife abandoned by her husband. ⁷For a brief moment I abandoned you. But with great compassion I will take you back. ⁸In a moment of anger I turned my face a little while; but with everlasting love I will have pity on you, says the Lord, your Redeemer.

⁹Just as in the time of Noah I swore that I would never again permit the waters of a flood to cover the earth and destroy its life, so now I swear that I will never again pour out my anger on you. ¹⁰For the mountains may depart and the hills disappear, but my kindness shall not leave you. My promise of peace for you will never be broken, says the Lord who has mercy upon you.

¹¹O my afflicted people, tempest-tossed and troubled, I will rebuild you on a foundation of sapphires and make the walls of your houses from precious jewels. ¹²I will make your towers of sparkling agate and your gates and walls of shining gems. ¹³And all your citizens shall be taught by me, and their prosperity shall be great. ¹⁴You will live under a government that is just and fair. Your enemies will stay far away; you will live in peace. Terror shall not come near. ¹⁵If any nation comes to fight you, it will not be sent by me to punish you. Therefore, it will be routed, for I am on your side. ¹⁶I have created the smith who blows the coals beneath the forge and makes the weapons of destruction. And I have created the armies that destroy. ¹⁷But in that coming day, no weapon turned against you shall succeed, and you will have justice against every courtroom lie. This is the heritage of the servants of the Lord. This is the blessing I have given you, says the Lord.

3.You are Repositioned by Jesus’ Resurrection for Retribution

Isaiah 35 Amplified Bible (AMP)

Zion’s Joyful Future

35 The wilderness and the dry land will be glad;
The Arabah (desert) will shout in exultation and blossom

Like the ^[a]autumn crocus.

2

It will blossom abundantly
And rejoice with joy and singing.
The glory of Lebanon will be given to it,
The majesty of [Mount] Carmel and [the plain] of Sharon.
They will see the glory of the LORD,
The majesty *and* splendor of our God.

3

Encourage the exhausted, and make staggering knees firm.

4

Say to those with an anxious *and* panic-stricken heart,
"Be strong, fear not!
Indeed, your God will come with vengeance [for the ungodly];
The retribution of God will come,
But He will save you."

5

Then the eyes of the blind will be opened
And the ears of the deaf will be unstopped.

6

Then the lame will leap like a deer,
And the tongue of the mute will shout for joy.
For waters will break forth in the wilderness
And streams in the desert.

7

And the burning sand (mirage) will become a pool [of water]
And the thirsty ground springs of water;
In the haunt of jackals, ^[b]where they lay resting,
Grass becomes reeds and ^[c]rushes.

8

A highway will be there, and a roadway;
And it will be called the Holy Way.
The unclean will not travel on it,
But it will be for those who walk on the way [the redeemed];
And fools will not wander *on it*.

9

No lion will be there,
Nor will any predatory animal come up on it;
They will not be found there.
But the redeemed will walk *there*.

10

And the ransomed of the LORD will return
And come to Zion with shouts of jubilation,
And everlasting joy will be upon their heads;
They will find joy and gladness,
And sorrow and sighing will flee away.

4.You are Repositioned by Jesus' Resurrection for Restitution

Isaiah 62 Amplified Bible (AMP)

Zion's Glory and New Name

62 For Zion's sake I (Isaiah) will not be silent,
And for Jerusalem's sake I will not keep quiet,
Until her righteousness *and* vindication go forth as brightness,
And her salvation goes forth like a burning torch.

2

The nations will see your righteousness *and* vindication [by God],
And all kings [will see] your glory;
And you will be called by a new name
Which the mouth of the LORD will designate.

3

You will also be [considered] a crown of glory *and* splendor in the hand of
the LORD,
And a royal ^[a]diadem [exceedingly beautiful] in the hand of your God.

4

It will no longer be said of you [Judah], "Azubah (Abandoned),"
Nor will it any longer be said of your land, "Shemamah (Desolate)";
But you will be called, "Hephzibah (My Delight is in Her),"
And your land, "^[b]Married";
For the LORD delights in you,

And *to Him* your land will be married [owned and protected by the LORD].

5

For as a young man marries a virgin [O Jerusalem],

[c]So your sons will marry you;

And as the bridegroom rejoices over the bride,

So your God will rejoice over you.

6

On your walls, O Jerusalem, I have appointed *and* stationed watchmen
(prophets),

Who will never keep silent day or night;

You who profess the LORD, take no rest for yourselves,

7

And give Him no rest [from your prayers] until He establishes Jerusalem
And makes her a praise on the earth.

8

The LORD has sworn [an oath] by His right hand and by His mighty arm,

"I will never again give your grain as food for your enemies,

Nor will [the invading] foreigners drink your new wine for which you have
labored."

9

But they who have harvested it will eat it and praise the LORD,

And they who have gathered it will drink it [at the feasts celebrated] in the
courtyards of My sanctuary.

10

Go through, go through the gates,

Clear the way for the people;

Build up, build up the highway,

Remove the stones, lift up a banner over the peoples.

11

Listen carefully, the LORD has proclaimed to the end of the earth,

Say to the Daughter of Zion, "Look now, your salvation is coming [in
the LORD];

Indeed, His reward is with Him, and His restitution accompanies Him."

12

And they will call them "The Holy People,
The Redeemed of the LORD";
And you will be called "Sought Out, A City Not Deserted."

5.You are Repositioned by Jesus' Resurrection for Reclamation

Isaiah 60 Living Bible (TLB)

60 Arise, my people! Let your light shine for all the nations to see! For the glory of the Lord is streaming from you. ²Darkness as black as night shall cover all the peoples of the earth, but the glory of the Lord will shine from you. ³All nations will come to your light; mighty kings will come to see the glory of the Lord upon you.

⁴Lift up your eyes and see! For your sons and daughters are coming home to you from distant lands. ⁵Your eyes will shine with joy, your hearts will thrill, for merchants from around the world will flow to you, bringing you the wealth of many lands. ⁶Vast droves of camels will converge upon you, dromedaries from Midian and Sheba and Ephah too, bringing gold and incense to add to the praise of God. ⁷The flocks of Kedar shall be given you, and the rams of Nabaioth for my altars, and I will glorify my glorious Temple in that day.

⁸And who are these who fly like a cloud to Israel, like doves to their nests? ⁹I have reserved the ships of many lands, the very best, ^[a] to bring the sons of Israel home again from far away, bringing their wealth with them. For the Holy One of Israel, known around the world, has glorified you in the eyes of all.

¹⁰Foreigners will come and build your cities. Presidents and kings will send you aid. For though I destroyed you in my anger, I will have mercy on you through my grace. ¹¹Your gates will stay wide open around the clock to receive the wealth of many lands. The kings of the world will cater to you. ¹²For the nations refusing to be your allies ^[b] will perish; they shall be destroyed. ¹³The glory of Lebanon will be yours—the forests of firs, pines, and box trees—to beautify my sanctuary. My Temple will be glorious.

¹⁴The sons of anti-Semites will come and bow before you! They will kiss your feet! They will call Jerusalem “The City of the Lord” and “The Glorious Mountain of the Holy One of Israel.”

¹⁵Though once despised and hated and rebuffed by all, you will be beautiful forever, a joy for all the generations of the world, for I will make you so. ¹⁶Powerful kings and mighty nations shall provide you with the choicest of their goods to satisfy your every need, and you will know at last and really understand that I, the Lord, am your Savior and Redeemer, the Mighty One of Israel. ¹⁷I will exchange your brass for gold, your iron for silver, your wood for brass, your stones for iron. Peace and righteousness shall be your taskmasters! ¹⁸Violence will disappear out of your land—all war will end. Your walls will be “Salvation” and your gates “Praise.”

¹⁹No longer will you need the sun or moon to give you light, for the Lord your God will be your everlasting light, and he will be your glory. ²⁰Your sun shall never set; the moon shall not go down—for the Lord will be your everlasting light; your days of mourning all will end. ²¹All your people will be good. They will possess their land forever, for I will plant them there with my own hands; this will bring me glory. ²²The smallest family shall multiply into a clan; the tiny group shall be a mighty nation. I, the Lord, will bring it all to pass when it is time.

Isaiah 60:4-6 Amplified Bible, Classic Edition (AMPC)

⁴Lift up your eyes round about you and see! They all gather themselves together, they come to you. Your sons shall come from afar, and your daughters shall be carried *and* nursed in the arms.

⁵Then you shall see and be radiant, and your heart shall thrill *and* tremble with joy [at the glorious deliverance] and be enlarged; because the abundant wealth of the [Dead] ^[a]Sea shall be turned to you, unto you shall the nations come with their treasures. ^(A)

⁶A multitude of camels [from the eastern trading tribes] shall cover you [Jerusalem], the young camels of Midian and Ephah; all the men from Sheba [who once came to trade] shall come, bringing gold and frankincense and proclaiming the praises of the Lord. ^(B)

Footnotes:

- a. [Isaiah 60:5](#) Prior to well into the twentieth century, scholars could only speculate as to what Isaiah might have meant here by “the abundant wealth of the [Dead] Sea” that would one day be turned over to Jerusalem. Of course, the Dead Sea, which for ages had been considered only a place of death and desolation, was ruled out as a possible meaning. Then suddenly it was discovered that the waters of the Dead Sea contain important chemicals. In A.D. 1935 G.T.B. Davis wrote, “One is almost staggered by the computed wealth of the chemical salts of the Dead Sea. It is estimated that the potential value of the potash, bromine, and other chemical salts of its waters is... four times the wealth of the United States!” (G.T.B. Davis, *Rebuilding Palestine*) Isaiah himself did not know this, but the God who caused the Dead Sea to play a part in His program in the last days knew all about it, and He led the prophet to so prophesy here in this verse.

6.You are Repositioned by Jesus’ Resurrection for Regeneration

Isaiah 65:16-25 Living Bible (TLB)

¹⁶And yet, the days will come^[a] when all who invoke a blessing or take an oath shall swear by the God of Truth; for I will put aside my anger and forget the evil that you did. ¹⁷For see, I am creating new heavens and a new earth—so wonderful that no one will even think about the old ones anymore. ¹⁸Be glad; rejoice forever in my creation. Look! I will re-create Jerusalem as a place of happiness, and her people shall be a joy! ¹⁹And I will rejoice in Jerusalem and in my people; and the voice of weeping and crying shall not be heard there anymore.

²⁰No longer will babies die when only a few days old; no longer will men be considered old at 100! Only sinners will die that young! ²¹⁻²²In those days, when a man builds a house, he will keep on living in it—it will not be destroyed by invading armies as in the past. My people will plant vineyards and eat the fruit themselves—their enemies will not confiscate it. For my people will live as long as trees and will long enjoy their hard-won gains. ²³Their harvests will not be eaten by their enemies; their children will not be born to be cannon fodder. For they are the children of those the Lord has blessed; and their children, too, shall be blessed. ²⁴I will answer them before they even call to me. While they are still talking to me about their needs, I will go ahead and answer their prayers! ²⁵The wolf and lamb shall feed together, the lion shall eat straw as the ox does, and poisonous snakes

shall strike no more!^[b] In those days nothing and no one shall be hurt or destroyed in all my holy mountain, says the Lord.

Galatians 6:10-16 The Passion Translation (TPT)

¹⁰Take advantage of every opportunity to be a blessing to others,^[a] especially to our brothers and sisters in the family of faith!

Summary and Conclusion

¹¹I've written this letter to you with my own handwriting—see how large I have to make the letters?^[b] ¹²All those who insist that you be circumcised are recruiting you so they can boast in their own works. They are attempting to avoid the persecution that comes with preaching the liberating message of the cross of Messiah! ¹³Not even those who are circumcised keep every detail of the written law. Yet they push you to be circumcised so that they can boast that you have become like them.^[c]

¹⁴My only boast is in the crucifixion of the Lord Jesus, our Messiah. In him I have been crucified to this natural realm; and the natural realm is dead to me and no longer dominates my life.

¹⁵Circumcision doesn't mean a thing to me. The only thing that really matters is living by the transforming power of this wonderful new creation life. ¹⁶And all those who live in agreement with this standard will have true peace and God's delight, for they are the Israel of God.

2 Corinthians 5:16-18 The Passion Translation (TPT)

¹⁶So then, from now on, we have a new perspective that refuses to evaluate people merely by their outward appearances. For that's how we once viewed the Anointed One, but no longer do we see him with limited human insight.^[a]

¹⁷Now, if anyone is enfolded into Christ, he has become an entirely new creation. All that is related to the old order has vanished.^[b] Behold, everything is fresh and new.^[c] ¹⁸And God has made all things new,^[d] and reconciled^[e] us to himself, and given us the ministry of reconciling others to God.

7.You are Repositioned by Jesus' Resurrection for Repopulation

Repopulation is the phenomenon of increasing the numerical size of human inhabitants or organisms of a particular species after they had almost gone extinct.

Isaiah 66:5-14 Living Bible (TLB)

⁵Hear the words of God, all you who fear him, and tremble at his words: Your brethren hate you and cast you out for being loyal to my name. "Glory to God," they scoff. "Be happy in the Lord!" But they shall be put to shame.

⁶What is all the commotion in the city? What is that terrible noise from the Temple? It is the voice of the Lord taking vengeance upon his enemies.

⁷⁻⁸Who has heard or seen anything as strange as this? For in one day, suddenly, a nation, Israel, shall be born, even before the birth pains come. In a moment, just as Israel's anguish starts, the baby is born; the nation begins. ⁹Shall I bring to the point of birth and then not deliver? asks the Lord your God. No! Never!

¹⁰Rejoice with Jerusalem; be glad with her, all you who love her, you who mourned for her. ¹¹Delight in Jerusalem; drink deep of her glory even as an infant at a mother's generous breasts. ¹²Prosperity shall overflow Jerusalem like a river, says the Lord, for I will send it; the riches of the Gentiles will flow to her. Her children shall be nursed at her breasts, carried on her hips and dandled on her knees. ¹³I will comfort you there as a little one is comforted by its mother.

¹⁴When you see Jerusalem, your heart will rejoice; vigorous health will be yours. All the world will see the good hand of God upon his people and his wrath upon his enemies.
