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## LOOK THROUGH JESUS' EYES FOR TOTAL SATISFACTION OF ALL DEBT

“Jesus shall see of the travail of His soul, and shall be satisfied: by His knowledge shall My righteous servant justify many; for He shall bear their iniquities,” Isaiah 53:11. In legal terms, satisfied is “having desires fully gratified; made content payment; discharge; as to receive a sum in full satisfaction of a debt; to enter satisfaction on record,” Webster (1828). The blood of Jesus fully satisfied every debt in your bloodline all the way back to Adam.

## GOD'S CONFIRMATION OF SUPERNATURAL TIME REDEMPTION

You may have counted it all lost, but God never forgets any of His covenant promises to you. Psalm 90:15 (TPT) shows them as retroactive. “We’ve been overwhelmed with grief; come now and overwhelm us with gladness. Replace our years of trouble with decades of delight.” God resolves all time lost to dissolve all doubt that He wants you fully satisfied. In Hebrew, the word “years” grant you a second time around. He promised a “do-over” to replace every lost year. Joel 2:17-26 (KJV) satisfies Moses’ petition. “Let the priests, the ministers of the Lord, weep between the porch and the altar, and let them say, Spare Thy people, O Lord and give not Thine heritage to reproach, that the heathen should rule over them: wherefore should they say among the people, Where is their God? Then will the Lord be jealous for His land, and pity His people. Yea, the Lord will answer and say unto His people, Behold, I will send you corn, and wine, and oil, and ye shall be satisfied therewith: and I will no more make you a reproach among the heathen: But I will remove far off from you the northern army, and will drive him into a land barren and desolate, with his face toward the east sea, and his hinder part toward the utmost sea, and his stink shall come up, and his ill savour shall come up, because he hath done great things. Fear not, O land; be glad and rejoice: for the Lord will do great things. Be not afraid, ye beasts of the field: for the pastures of the wilderness do spring, for the tree beareth her fruit, the fig tree and the vine do yield their strength. Be glad then, ye children of Zion, and rejoice in the Lord your God: for he hath given you the former rain moderately, and he will cause to come down for you the rain, the former rain, and the latter rain in the first month. And the floors shall be full of wheat, and the vats shall overflow with wine and oil. And I will restore to you the years that the locust hath eaten, the cankerworm, and the caterpillar, and the palmerworm, my great army which I sent among you. And ye shall eat in plenty, and be satisfied, and praise the name of the Lord your God, that hath dealt wondrously with you: and My people shall never be ashamed. And ye shall know that I am in the midst of Israel, and that I am the Lord your God, and none else: and My people shall never be ashamed.” Limits moved!

## REAPING YOUR HARVEST FROM SEEDS OF SATISFACTION

Sowing satisfaction into others surely reaps satisfaction to the greatest degree. Even the much too many benefits may seem burdensome. Isaiah 58:10-12 (KJV) illustrates this: “And if thou draw out thy soul to the hungry, and satisfy the afflicted soul; then shall thy light rise in obscurity, and thy darkness be as the noon day: And the LORD shall guide thee continually, and satisfy thy soul in drought, and make fat thy bones: and thou shalt be like a watered garden, and like a spring of water, whose waters fail not. And they that shall be of thee shall build the old waste places: thou shalt raise up the foundations of many generations; and thou shalt be called, The repairer of the breach, The restorer of paths to dwell in.” *Sabea* in Hebrew for the word satisfy means to sate i.e., fill to satisfaction (literally or figuratively): have enough; have plenty of; be satiate; satisfy (with); suffice; be weary.

## HONOR AND HUMILITY FOR GOD KEEPS YOU SATISFIED FROM YOURSELF

Jesus’ third temptation is in Psalm 91 (TLB). “We live within the shadow of the Almighty, sheltered by the God who is above all gods. This I declare, that He alone is my refuge, my place of safety; He is my God, and I am trusting Him. For He rescues you from every trap and protects you from the fatal plague. He will shield you with His wings! They will shelter you. His faithful promises are your armor. Now you don’t need to be afraid of the dark anymore, nor fear the dangers of the day; nor dread the plagues of darkness, nor disasters in the morning. Though a thousand fall at my side, though ten thousand are dying around me, the evil will not touch me. I will see how the wicked are punished, but I will not share it. For Jehovah is my refuge! I choose the God above all gods to shelter me. How then can evil overtake me or any plague come near? [satan used] *For He orders His angels to protect you wherever you go. They will steady you with their hands to keep you from stumbling against the rocks on the trail.* You can safely meet a lion or step on poisonous snakes, yes, even trample them beneath your feet! For the Lord says, “Because he loves Me, I will rescue him; I will make him great because he trusts in My name. When he calls on Me, I will answer; I will be with him in trouble and rescue him and honor him. I will satisfy him with a full life and give him My salvation.” The enemy’s plot to ensnare Jesus to jump off an edifice would have been suicide or tempted God to rescue Him after He sinned. If Jesus obeyed satan’s voice, His sacrifice would have been banned and our eternal life would have been barred. Jesus’ loyalty to God and to you was far greater than satan’s lure into low level living. Let Proverbs 14:14, KJV be your way of escape with temptation. “The backslider in heart shall be filled with his own ways: and a good man shall be satisfied from himself.”

## Thought for Transformation

*How powerful is the imagery behind Psalm 23 (KJV). Jesus Christ, our Good Shepherd guides us everywhere He desires us to go. “The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want. He maketh me to lie down in green pastures: He leadeth me beside the still waters. He restoreth my soul: He leadeth me in the paths of righteousness for His name’s sake. Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for Thou art with me; Thy rod and Thy staff they comfort me. Thou preparest a table before me in the presence of mine enemies: Thou anointest my head with oil; my cup runneth over. Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life: and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever.” Since Holy Spirit desires to go before us, why should our lives ever resemble the little lamb that followed Mary to school? Receiving true fulfillment from God only comes when we rest satisfied in His loving arms and stop interrupting the flow of harvest He has already prearranged. Intuitively, a sheep cannot really care for itself. The best position for him is to listen for and listen to the voice of his shepherd who always calls him by his name.*

## Sate God with Ample Space

*God requires more room to spread out in the earth. He can’t live in cramped quarters and still fully express Himself. Don’t say, there isn’t any space left to store anything more. Allow Him to satisfy your mouth with good things. Psalm 145:16 declares, “Thou openest Thine hand, and satisfiest the desire of every living thing.” Since the nations are just a drop in a bucket to God, He has time on His hands to sate more space in your life. Enlarge your heart with His heart to enlarge His territory globally.*

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
