The measure of faith Holy Spirit already deposited into you is more than sufficient enough to believe nothing is impossible to God or to you. Then you can receive heaven-born possibilities with faith as small as a grain of mustard seed. What makes the vast difference is how you actually "mete" what you are expecting from your seed sown.

Remove all limitations from your life by allowing the Spirit of God and the Word of God to enlarge your heart to dream the impossible dream and enlarge your mouth over every enemy. The God-sized dream is the exceeding, abundantly above all you can imagine. Then you can enjoy the abundant life to the full until it overflows like Jesus promised. Repositioning your faith to endorse and enforce "anti-measure" anticipation will usher your rate of return in flood proportions.

³¹ Another parable put he forth unto them, saying, The kingdom of heaven is like to a grain of mustard seed, which a man took, and sowed in his field:

³²Which indeed is the least of all seeds: but when it is grown, it is the greatest among herbs, and becometh a tree, so that the birds of the air come and lodge in the branches thereof.

Mustard bushes reach an average mature height of **between 6 and 20 feet** with a 20-foot spread, although exceptional plants can reach **30 feet tall** under ideal conditions. They have a spreading, multistemmed growth habit with a drooping or weeping branch structure.

Remove any Obstruction that's against Faith's Breakthrough

Taking it to the root you will discover G473 "anti". It refers to the word "opposite." It opposes any restraints, so it is not just opposite. It contrasts having a measure at all and is in direct conflict with it to conquer anything that could try to make it seem confined. In other words, you are free to walk unconfined. Then you won't live in a cramped space. The final outcome is clearly determined for your faith. Is your faith excessive or is it economical?

Perception was lodged in the natural realm, needed Revelation Matthew 16:5-12 Amplified Bible (AMP)

When the disciples reached the other side of the sea, they realized that they had forgotten to bring bread. General Said to them, Watch out and be on your guard against the Eleaven of the Pharisees and Sadducees." They began to discuss this among themselves, saying, "He said that because we did not bring bread." But Jesus, aware of this, said, "You men of little faith, why are you discussing among yourselves that you have no bread? Do you still not understand or remember the five loaves for the five thousand, and how many baskets you picked up? Or the seven loaves for the four thousand, and how many large baskets you picked up? How is it that you fail to understand that I was not talking to you about bread? But beware of the leaven of the Pharisees and Sadducees." Then they understood that He did not tell them to beware of the leaven of bread, but of the [false] teaching of the Pharisees and Sadducees.

Faith Finds a Resting Place

Hebrews 4:1-16 Amplified Bible, Classic Edition (AMPC)

- **4** Therefore, while the promise of entering His rest still holds *and* is offered [today], let us be afraid [ato distrust it], lest any of you should athlink he has come too late *and* has come short of [reaching] it.
- ²For indeed we have had the glad tidings [Gospel of God] proclaimed to us just as truly as they [the Israelites of old did when the good news of deliverance from bondage came to them]; but the message they heard did not benefit them, because it was not mixed with faith (with the leaning of the entire personality on God in absolute trust and confidence in His power, wisdom, and goodness) by those who heard it; the ineither were they united in faith with the ones [Joshua and Caleb] who heard (did believe).
- ³For we who have believed (adhered to and trusted in and relied on God) do enter that rest, [a]in accordance with His declaration that those [who did not believe] should not enter when He said, As I swore in My wrath, They shall not enter My rest; and this He said although [His] works had been completed and prepared [and waiting for all who would believe] from the foundation of the world.
- ⁴For in a certain place He has said this about the seventh day: And God rested on the seventh day from all His works.
- ⁵And [they forfeited their part in it, for] in this [passage] He said, They shall not enter My rest.
- ⁶Seeing then that the promise remains over [from past times] for some to enter that rest, and that those who formerly were given the good news about it *and* the opportunity, failed to appropriate it *and* did not enter because of disobedience,
- ⁷Again He sets a definite day, [a new] Today, [and gives another opportunity of securing that rest] saying through David after so long a time in the words already quoted, Today, if you would hear His voice *and* when you hear it, do not harden your hearts.

⁸[This mention of a rest was not a reference to their entering into Canaan.] For if Joshua had given them rest, He [God] would not speak afterward about another day.

⁹So then, there is still awaiting a full *and* complete Sabbath-rest reserved for the [true] people of God;

¹⁰For he who has once entered [God's] rest also has ceased from [the weariness and pain] of human labors, just as God rested from those labors ^[a]peculiarly His own.

"Let us therefore be zealous *and* exert ourselves *and* strive diligently to enter that rest [of God, to know and experience it for ourselves], that no one may fall *or* perish by the same kind of unbelief *and* disobedience [into which those in the wilderness fell].

¹²For the Word that God speaks is alive and full of power [making it active, operative, energizing, and effective]; it is sharper than any two-edged sword, penetrating to the dividing line of the breath of life (soul) and [the immortal] spirit, and of joints and marrow [of the deepest parts of our nature], exposing *and* sifting *and* analyzing *and* judging the very thoughts and purposes of the heart.

¹³ And not a creature exists that is concealed from His sight, but all things are open *and* exposed, naked *and* defenseless to the eyes of Him with Whom we have to do.

¹⁴Inasmuch then as we have a great High Priest Who has [already] ascended *and* passed through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession [of faith in Him].

¹⁵For we do not have a High Priest Who is unable to understand *and* sympathize *and* have a shared feeling with our weaknesses *and* infirmities *and* liability to the assaults of temptation, but One Who has been tempted in every respect as we are, yet without sinning.

¹⁶Let us then fearlessly *and* confidently *and* boldly draw near to the throne of grace (the throne of God's unmerited favor to us sinners), that we may receive mercy [for our failures] and find grace to help in good time for every need [appropriate help and well-timed help, coming just when we need it].

²⁰⁻²⁶ "I am not praying only for these men but for all those who will believe in me through their message, that they may all be one. Just as you, Father, live in me and I live in you, I am asking that they may live in us, that the world may believe that you did send me. I have given them the honour that you gave me, that they may be one, as we are one—I in them and you in me, that they may grow complete into one, so that the world may realise that you sent me and have loved them as you loved me. Father, I want those whom you have given me to be with me where I am; I want them to see that glory which you have made mine—for you loved me before the world began. Father of goodness and truth, the world has not known you, but I have known you and these men now know that you have sent me.
