- b. John 16:11 In essence, "sin . . . righteousness . . . and judgment are related to three persons." Sin is related to Adam, for it was through Adam that sin entered humanity (Rom. 5:12). Righteousness is related to Christ, because it comes through him, and he has become our righteousness (1 Cor. 1:30). Judgment is related to satan, for the pure works of Christ bring judgment to the works of satan. If we do not embrace Christ's righteousness, we will share satan's judgment.

John 15:1-8 The Passion Translation (TPT)

Jesus the Living Vine

"I am a true sprouting vine, and the farmer who tends the vine is my Father. ²He cares for the branches connected to me by lifting and propping up the fruitless branches and pruning every fruitful branch to yield a greater harvest. ³The words I have spoken over you have already cleansed you. ⁴So you must remain in life-union with me, for I remain in life-union with you. For as a branch severed from the vine will not bear fruit, so your life will be fruitless unless you live your life intimately joined to mine.

⁵"I am the sprouting vine and you're my branches. As you live in union with me as your source, fruitfulness will stream from within you—but when you

live separated from me you are powerless. ⁶ If a person is separated from me, he is discarded; such branches are gathered up and thrown into the fire to be burned. ⁷ But if you live in life-union with me and if my words live powerfully within you—then you can ask whatever you desire and it will be done. ⁸ When your lives bear abundant fruit, you demonstrate that you are my mature disciples who glorify my Father!

Footnotes:

- a. <u>John 15:2</u> The Greek phrase can also be translated "he takes up [to himself] every fruitless branch." He doesn't remove these branches, but he takes them to himself. As the wise and loving farmer, he lifts them up off the ground to enhance their growth. In the context, Christ's endless love for his disciples on the last night of his life on earth seems to emphasize God's love even for those who fail and disappoint him. Peter's denial didn't bring rejection from Jesus.
- b. John 15:2 The Greek word for "pruning," kathairo, can also mean cleansing.
- c. John 15:3 Or "pruned."
- d. John 15:4 Or "grafted into me."
- e. <u>John 15:5</u> See Isa. <u>4:2</u>; <u>11:1-2</u>; <u>Rev. 1:20</u>. The branch of the Lord is now Christ living in his people, branching out through them. The church is now his lampstand with seven branches.
- f. John 15:7 This is the Greek word *rhema*, which refers to the spoken words, or the sayings, of God.
- g. John 15:7 The Aramaic is translated "my words take hold (are strong) within you."

Why? Because the Eternal designated Me

to be His representative to the poor, to preach good news to them.

Luke's audience doesn't divide the world into sacred vs. secular or religious vs. political. For them, life is integrated. And for them, these "religious" words from Isaiah have a powerful and "political" meaning: because they see themselves as oppressed by the Roman occupation, Jesus' words suggest that His "good news" describes a powerful change about to come—a change that will rescue the people from their oppression. His fellow Jews have long been waiting for a savior to free them from Roman oppression. Jesus tells them their hopes are about to be fulfilled. But then, just as people speak well of Jesus, He lets them know their expectations aren't in line with God's plans. He tells them not to expect God to fit into their boxes and suggests the unthinkable: that God cares for the Gentiles, the very people who are oppressing them! They aren't too pleased by this.

He sent Me to tell those who are held captive that they can now be set free, and to tell the blind that they can now see.

He sent Me to liberate those held down by oppression.

¹⁹ In short, the Spirit is upon Me to proclaim that now is the time; this is the jubilee season of the Eternal One's grace. ^[2]

²⁰ Jesus rolled up the scroll and returned it to the synagogue attendant. Then He sat down, as a teacher would do, and all in the synagogue focused their attention on Jesus, waiting for Him to speak. ²¹ He told them that these words from the Hebrew Scriptures were being fulfilled then and there, in their hearing.

Romans 8:1-4 King James Version (KJV)

- ¹There is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit.
- ²For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus hath made me free from the law of sin and death.
- ³ For what the law could not do, in that it was weak through the flesh, God sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh, and for sin, condemned sin in the flesh:
- ⁴That the righteousness of the law might be fulfilled in us, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit.

Completion

- 1 Peter 2 (AMPC)
- ¹ So be done with every trace of wickedness (depravity [corruption], malignity [desire to do evil]) and all deceit and insincerity (pretense, hypocrisy) and grudges (envy, jealousy) and slander *and* evil speaking of every kind.
- ²Like newborn babies you should crave (thirst for, earnestly desire) the pure (unadulterated) spiritual milk, that by it you may be nurtured *and* grow unto [completed] salvation,
- ³Since you have [already] tasted the goodness and kindness of the Lord.
- ⁴Come to Him [then, to that] Living Stone which men [®]tried *and* threw away, but which is chosen [and] precious in God's sight.
- ⁵[Come] and, like living stones, be yourselves built [into] a spiritual house, for a holy (dedicated, consecrated) priesthood, to offer up [those] spiritual sacrifices [that are] acceptable *and* pleasing to God through Jesus Christ.
- ⁶For thus it stands in Scripture: Behold, I am laying in Zion a chosen (honored), precious chief Cornerstone, and he who believes in Him [who adheres to, trusts in, and relies on Him] shall never be disappointed *or* put to shame.

- ⁷To you then who believe (who adhere to, trust in, and rely on Him) is the preciousness; but for those who disbelieve [it is true], The [very] Stone which the builders rejected has become the main Cornerstone,
- ⁸And, A Stone that will cause stumbling and a Rock that will give [men] offense; they stumble because they disobey *and* disbelieve [God's] Word, as those [who reject Him] were destined (appointed) to do.
- But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a dedicated nation, [God's] own operation own the purchased, special people, that you may set forth the wonderful deeds and display the virtues and perfections of Him Who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light.
- ¹⁰Once you were not a people [at all], but now you are God's people; once you were unpitied, but now you are pitied *and* have received mercy.
- ¹¹Beloved, I implore you as aliens and strangers *and* exiles [in this world] to abstain from the sensual urges (the evil desires, the passions of the flesh, your lower nature) that wage war against the soul.
- ¹²Conduct yourselves properly (honorably, righteously) among the Gentiles, so that, although they may slander you as evildoers, [yet] they may by witnessing your good deeds [come to] glorify God in the day of inspection [[10]] when God shall look upon you wanderers as a pastor or shepherd looks over his flock].
- ¹³Be submissive to every human institution *and* authority for the sake of the Lord, whether it be to the emperor as supreme,
- ¹⁴Or to governors as sent by him to bring vengeance (punishment, justice) to those who do wrong and to encourage those who do good service.
- ¹⁵For it is God's will *and* intention that by doing right [your good and honest lives] should silence (muzzle, gag) the ignorant charges *and* ill-informed criticisms of foolish persons.
- ¹⁶[Live] as free people, [yet] without employing your freedom as a pretext for wickedness; but [live at all times] as servants of God.

- "Show respect for all men [treat them honorably]. Love the brotherhood (the Christian fraternity of which Christ is the Head). Reverence God. Honor the emperor.
- ¹⁸[You who are] household servants, be submissive to your masters with all [proper] respect, not only to those who are kind and considerate *and* reasonable, but also to those who are surly (overbearing, unjust, and crooked).
- ¹⁹ For one is regarded favorably (is approved, acceptable, and thankworthy) if, as in the sight of God, he endures the pain of unjust suffering.
- ²⁰[After all] what "kind of glory [is there in it] if, when you do wrong and are punished for it, you take it patiently? But if you bear patiently with suffering [which results] when you do right *and* that is undeserved, it is acceptable *and* pleasing to God.
- ²¹ For even to this were you called [it is inseparable from your vocation]. For Christ also suffered for you, leaving you [His personal] example, so that you should follow in His footsteps.
- ²²He was guilty of no sin, neither was deceit (guile) ever found on His lips.
- ²³When He was reviled *and* insulted, He did not revile *or* offer insult in return; [when] He was abused *and* suffered, He made no threats [of vengeance]; but he trusted [Himself and everything] to Him Who judges fairly.
- ²⁴He personally bore our sins in His [own] body on the tree [11][as on an altar and offered Himself on it], that we might die (cease to exist) to sin and live to righteousness. By His wounds you have been healed.
- ²⁵For you were going astray like [so many] sheep, but now you have come back to the Shepherd and Guardian (the Bishop) of your souls.
