This is what you can expect when you are a habitation of God through Holy Spirit where Jesus Christ remains resident in your heart by faith. Just think about it—100% of God in 100% of you? His abounding grace has a readiness to supply all that God is and all that God has: everything you need; the desires of your heart; and even the abundantly above all that you can imagine.

You have undeniably access by faith to receive God's wisdom, love, and power. With Holy Spirit as your subject matter expert on all occasions, you can host the mind of Christ all the time. He is as close as the air you breathe. Holy Spirit comes alongside of you to magnify the Lord so you can activate the good, acceptable, and perfect will of God. Now do not wander away where you cannot discern His whispers. Never be so distracted where you even disregard His shouts. His presence and power are well able to keep you from falling. Now transfer your trust so every trial of your faith turns in your favor to see the triumph of your faith.

At least twenty-seven traits display the divine nature of the Godhead. They are ever-present for you to discover. Throughout the Scriptures, you see each one exhibited in Abba Father, Jesus Christ, and Holy Spirit because all three operate as one. Each one is empowered to operate independently of the other. When employed collectively, they are interdependent. That is how you are filled with the fullness of God. The mind of Christ can flow through you fluently and fervently. That is the Tsunami Blessing, inside and out.

If you desire to realize the currents of the breakthrough anointing that the mind of Christ reproduces, then you must recognize that "wisdom is the principal thing," Proverbs 4:7. The initial nine include wisdom, understanding, counsel, might, knowledge, reverence (fear of the Lord), righteousness, faithfulness, and glory or glorious. These usher you and your world into divine order, balance, wholeness, fullness, overflow, and excess. That is how you represent the mind of Christ. Then others will be certain you have seen Jesus as He really is because they see His image and likeness in you.

The Nine Character Traits of the Spirit

“And the spirit of the Lord shall rest upon him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the Lord. And righteousness shall be the girdle of his loins, and faithfulness the girdle of his reins. And in that day there shall be a root of Jesse, who shall stand for an ensign of the people; to it shall the Gentiles seek: and his rest shall be glorious.” Isaiah 11:2,5,10

Reputation is what people think you are, but character is actually who you really are. A character trait clearly gives you distinction. In actuality, it sets you apart from others, whether it is good or bad.

Moreover, your character is not fixed or limited as some would suppose. You can be fully restored to exhibit God’s image for His glory. In fact, God will perfect that which concerns you and will not forsake the work of His own hand. God’s Word says that you are a new creation in Christ and old things are dead.

When you allow the Spirit of God a place to rest, you will constantly exhibit His very own character. This clearly is demonstrated in Isaiah 11:2,5,10 when it refers to the awesome character of Jesus Christ. The phrase “rest upon” in verse 2 is defined as “to remain in a place; dwell; or stay.”

The purpose of God’s Spirit in your life is not for visitation alone, but habitation. He wants His Spirit to live in your heart continually. “In whom ye also are builded together for an habitation of God through the Spirit.” Ephesians 2:22

Jesus Christ then can be your constant companion and friend. With the indwelling Holy Spirit resident in you, Jesus will then feel at home in your heart. It is up to you to extend the welcome and give Him the place most dearest to you, your heart. By you constantly fellowshiping with Him, you will become all that He is.

There are nine characteristics of the Spirit: wisdom, understanding, counsel, might, knowledge, reverence [the fear of the Lord], righteousness, faithfulness, and glorious. During pre-flood times, Noah exhibited all nine characteristics. Because they are all prototypic of God, you too can experience them fully if Jesus reigns in your heart.

1-WISDOM - To use the best choices available to you. To have and use good sense. To say and do the right thing in any given situation. To have right actions that are synchronized with right timing. To use tact in all your undertakings. Noah had what it takes to live life successfully, the spirit of wisdom. He made good decisions, with simplicity. What put Noah above the rest is that he allowed God to make the best decisions for him. Because God was his final authority, he chose only what pertained to life and godliness. Each decision was marked by diplomacy, logic, and reasoning. Therefore, Noah was not confused. Nothing was obscure to him. He had clarity in every situation. He had the right perspective. God was his resolve.

Noah did not miss any of God's deadlines. Because Noah walked with God, he moved with precision. Noah did not deviate from what God commanded him to do in anything. Even when life challenges were presented, he still made wise choices.

From one thing to the next, Noah experienced smooth transitions because he simply believed God would accompany him to make an accurate assessment. The result, Noah went from glory to glory. Noah realized that his times were in God's hands and that his steps were already ordered.

Ecclesiastes 3:1 states, "To every thing there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven." Noah allowed God to make everything beautiful in its time. Noah recognized that it was God's season, so he aligned himself to God's plan by using what was available to him, wisdom.

Several examples of wisdom can be found in the 8th chapter of Genesis. For instance, Noah did not unboard the ark until the earth was dried and God gave him the okay. Noah investigated the fruit of the land. Since olive plants are representative of the anointing, he didn't unload the ark until he was certain that God's delivering power was upon that land.

Genesis 8:6-14 "And it came to pass at the end of forty days, that Noah opened the window of the ark which he had made: And he sent forth a raven, which went forth to and fro, until the waters were dried up from off the earth. Also he sent forth a dove from him, to see if the waters were abated from off the face of the ground; But the dove found no rest for the sole of her foot, and she returned unto him into the ark, for the waters were on the face of the whole earth: then he put forth his hand, and took her, and pulled her in unto him into the ark. And he stayed yet another seven days;

and again he sent forth the dove out of the ark; And the dove came in to him in the evening; and, lo, in her mouth was an olive leaf plucked off: so Noah knew that the waters were abated from off the earth. And he stayed yet another seven days; and sent forth the dove, which returned not again unto him anymore. And it came to pass in the six hundredth and first year, in the first month, the first day of the month, the waters were dried up from off the earth: and Noah removed the covering of the ark, and looked, and behold, the face of the ground was dry. And in the second month, on the seven and twentieth day of the month, was the earth dried.”

God gives away all that is His. “For the Lord giveth wisdom...” Proverbs 2:6.

Wisdom is one request away. “If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, that giveth to all men liberally, and upbraideth not; and it shall be given him.” James 1:5.

2-UNDERSTANDING - To know how things are put together after you have taken them apart. Having the ability to turn nothing into something. The ability to disassemble and assemble.

Psalms 127:1 declares, “Except the Lord build [design] the house, they labour in vain that build it...” Noah only used God’s approved blueprint to build the ark. Furthermore, Noah used the recommended building materials. Noah followed the design as it was proposed. The ark had the ample capacity for the expected guest list. The ark floated and no water seeped in nor did it sink. All three stories of the ark had the required loading to accommodate the heavy cargo.

God gave clear instructions and Noah assembled only what the Master ordered. By trade, Noah was not a carpenter. However, Noah was able to see the tree as an ark. Noah did not allow his own understanding to stand in the way of progress. God can give you quick understanding of how things work, regardless of your age, education, race, gender or mental capacity.

The Spirit of God is not limited. Because Noah originally didn’t comprehend the underlying operation, he didn’t think that God didn’t either. He was open to the Spirit of God to conceive the ark. He simply used the spirit of understanding as his standard operating procedures.

Genesis 6:14-16 "Make thee an ark of gopher wood; rooms shalt thou make in the ark, and shalt pitch it within and without with pitch. And this is the fashion which thou shalt make it of: the length of the ark shall be three hundred cubits, the breadth of it fifty cubits, and the height of it thirty cubits. A window shalt thou make to the ark, and in a cubit shalt thou finish it above; and the door of the ark shalt thou set in the side thereof; with lower, second, and third stories shalt thou make it."

God operates on any level of comprehension. "...I am understanding..."
Proverbs 8:14b

Favor abounds where understanding is found. "Good understanding giveth favour..." Proverbs 13:15a

Understanding shows versatility. "That He would grant you, according to the riches of his glory, to be strengthened with might by his Spirit in the inner man; That Christ may dwell in your hearts by faith; that ye being rooted and grounded in love, May be able to comprehend with all saints what is the breadth, and length, and depth, and height; And to know the love of Christ, which passeth knowledge, that ye might be filled with all the fullness of God." Ephesians 3:16-19

3-COUNSEL - To know what to do and why. To obtain and acknowledge God's purpose and plan for every area of your life. To accept and adhere to God's advice.

Jeremiah 29:11 says "For I know the thoughts [plans] I think toward you saith the Lord, thoughts of peace, and not of evil, to give you an expected end." God wanted Noah to use His strategic and tactical plan, so He birthed the end of the project in Noah before it ever began. Noah walked in a consummated work, because all of God's works are finished, dated to the beginning of the world.

It is God's will that none should perish, but all would come to repentance. After seeing the wickedness that was in the earth, God ordered the plan of salvation. God planned to save all those who were in right standing with Him. Merciful as God is, he gave the wicked a space of 120 years to repent. It grieved God that mankind chose wickedness and violence, but Noah found

grace in the sight of God. Therefore, God established His covenant with Noah.

Noah uninterruptedly walked in God's plan and purpose. God's plan was to build the ark for safety, as well as, to use it as a mode of transportation during the flood. God's purpose was to preserve the reproduction of man and beast after the flood. God's plan was to bring enough food to sustain life during the flood. God's purpose was to take Noah to a place of new beginnings.

He etches a thorough scope of work with intricate details for each of us. Always expect God's plan and purpose to always be beneficial, tailor-made, and satisfying for you.

Isaiah 55:8-9 illustrates the distinction between choosing God's plan and purpose over your own. "For my thoughts [plan and purpose] are not your thoughts, neither are your ways [course of life] my ways, saith the Lord. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, and my thoughts than your thoughts." God doesn't despise you because of your own thoughts and ways, but He offers to personally lead you into a more exalted life and an excellent way.

Genesis 6:17-22 "And, behold, I even I, do bring a flood of waters upon the earth to destroy all flesh, wherein is the breath of life, from under heaven; and everything that is in the earth shall die. But with thee will I establish my covenant; and thou shalt come into the ark, thou, and thy sons, and thy wife, and thy sons' wives with thee. And of every living thing of all flesh, two of every sort shalt thou bring into the ark, to keep them alive with thee; they shall be male and female. Of fowls after their kind, and of cattle after their kind, of every creeping thing of the earth after their kind, two of every sort shall come unto thee, to keep them alive. And take unto thee of all food that is eaten, and thou shall gather it to thee; and it shall be for food for thee, and for them. Thus did Noah; according to all that God commanded him, so did he."

God is sovereign over the master plan. "Counsel is mine..." Proverbs 8:14a

Nothing and no one can stop the plan of God. "...My counsel shall stand, and I will do all my pleasure: ...I have spoken it, I will also bring it to pass; I have purposed it, I will also do it." Isaiah 46:10b, 11b.

The counsel of God and understanding work together. "Counsel in the heart of man is like deep water; but a man of understanding will draw it out."
Proverbs 20:5

4-MIGHT - To have the capability to master your environment. Prepared for victory. To be empowered with inexhaustible strength. To possess true power and force. To become invincible.

Gopher wood is a type of material commonly used for construction projects. God ordered Noah to use gopher wood because of its strength and durability, yet it was light enough to remain afloat. The scriptures say, that "yokes are destroyed because of the anointing." Nothing or no one can hold you back because the anointing supports you being advanced. In this instance, gopher wood is representative of the anointing of God.

The prevailing storm could not penetrate this type of wood. Because of its sustaining power, the ark endured the flood with no loss of any of its contents. The ark was in service for over one year without any need for maintenance.

It has been said that the Titanic was built by professionals, but the ark was built by an amateur. Noah may have been an amateur, but the spirit of might enabled him to defeat all odds. If you are going to go far, you must start with a substance that operates under pressure, the spirit of might.

"I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me." Phillipians 4:13. The spirit of might provides the strength and power to guard, attack, seize, desist, and restore. If that same power that raised Jesus Christ from the dead dwells in you, He is able to quicken your bodies to overtake the enemy. If that same power is resident in you, all you can be is a winner.

Being empowered, you won't succumb to your circumstances, even if they may seem insurmountable to you now. No matter how close it may seem to you to experience a total defeat, victory can prevail.

Several scriptures state that the waters prevailed while the ark was in operation. However, the conclusion of the whole matter is that God caused a wind to pass over those same waters to cease troubling the earth. So Noah reached his destination intact and in victory.

God is invincible and has conferred that same status to us. "Daniel answered and said, Blessed be the name of God forever and ever; for wisdom and might are his. I thank thee, and praise thee, O thou God of my fathers, who hast given me wisdom and might, and hast made known unto me now what we desired of thee: for thou hast now made known unto us the king's matter." Daniel 2:20, 23

Recognize God's triumphant power in everything. "Hear, ye that are far off, what I have done; and, ye that are near, acknowledge my might." Isaiah 33:13

You are on the winning team. "...I will cause them to know mine hand and my might; and they shall know that my name is The Lord." Jeremiah 16:21

5-KNOWLEDGE - To be aware that something exists; have accurate and true information. To be linked to optimum intelligence.

Isaiah 43:19 declares, "Behold, I will do a new thing, now it shall spring forth; shall ye not know it?" Because of information technology, God inaugurated witty inventions in the earth. Noah had no prior knowledge of those innovations, simply because they did not exist in the earth. However, a number of noted accomplishments were introduced because Noah had an open heart to receive novel deposits from God.

First, the ark was introduced. Then God mentioned two more innovations: the rain and the flood. Before this period of time, it had never rained on earth. The plants and vegetation were all watered by an underground irrigation method. Under these given circumstances, it was impossible for the earth to flood.

Like most inventions and innovations, scoffers may believe that they won't work. If the invention is God's, it will always work the very first time. Remember, God is always able to support all His claims.

God has firsthand knowledge. "Yea, if thou criest after knowledge, and liftest up thy voice for understanding; If thou seekest her as silver, and searchest for her as for hidden treasures; Then shalt thou understand the fear of the Lord and find the knowledge of God. For the Lord giveth wisdom; out of his mouth cometh knowledge and understanding." Proverbs 2:3-6

The excellency of knowledge is that wisdom gives life. "For wisdom is a defense, and money is a defense; but the excellency of knowledge is, that wisdom giveth life to them that have it." Ecclesiastes 7:12.

God's knowledge brings forth new inventions. "All the words of my mouth are in righteousness; there is nothing crooked or perverse in them. They are all plain to him that understandeth, and right to them that find knowledge. Receive my instruction, and not silver; and knowledge rather than choice gold. I wisdom dwell with prudence, and find out knowledge of witty inventions." Proverbs 8:8-10,12

6-REVERENCE - To hold reverential fear for the Lord. To put first things, first. To honor the Lord with all your substance and the first fruits of your labor. To establish right priorities. To acknowledge and give first place to what's most important in life.

Exodus 20:3 declares, "Thou shalt have no other gods before me." Noah always gave God the preeminence in his life and affairs. Noah walked with God and demonstrated that he had unbroken fellowship with Him.

As soon as Noah unloaded the ark, it was in his heart to pay homage to God. We find this act of worship entered into the nostrils of God as a sweet smelling savor that resulted in continual blessing pronounced upon the earth. This one act made room in God's heart to bless all mankind, because it was equivalent to worship. God highly exalted Jesus, so we exalt Him also with the highest honor. In the words of one of my mentors, God established the chain of command through Jesus. This is confirmed by Jesus in John 14:6, "...I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father but by me."

Honoring Jesus must be at the top of the list of our priorities. Honor the blood of Jesus because of His great sacrifice that established a better covenant. Because you cannot separate His Word and His Name from Jesus, we must commit to give them first place as well.

Genesis 8:20 "And Noah builded an altar unto the Lord; and took of every clean beast, and of every clean fowl, and offered burnt offerings on the altar."

Hebrews 11:7, "By faith Noah being warned of God of things not seen as yet, moved with fear, prepared an ark to the saving of his house, by the which he condemned the world, and became heir of the righteousness which is by faith."

Reverence breeds confidence, assurance, and abundant life. "In the fear of the Lord is strong confidence, and his children shall have a place of refuge. The fear of the Lord is a fountain of life, to depart from the snares of death." Proverbs 14:26-27

The highest form of knowledge is to honor God. "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge: but fools despise wisdom and instruction." Proverbs 1:7

7-RIGHTEOUSNESS - To have actions in accordance to God's set standards. To have God's vision. To agree with the quality of life God desires you to experience in the earth. [The capacity to believe right about everyone and everything.]

Noah was a just man, which is equivalent to him being righteous, faithful to God's original intentions. Noah used God's measuring stick and did not institute his own standards. He did not compromise by lowering his own standard of living to conform to the world's standards. In the midst of a crooked and perverse world, Noah found favor in God's sight. Genesis 7:1 says, "And the Lord said unto Noah, Come thou and all thy house into the ark; for thee have I seen righteous before me in this generation."

2 Peter 2:5, 9 "And spared not the old world, but saved Noah, the eighth person, a preacher of righteousness, bringing in the flood upon the world of the ungodly; The Lord knoweth how to deliver the godly out of temptations, and to reserve the unjust unto the day of judgment to be punished."

God is righteous. "Thy righteousness also, O God, is very high, who hast done great things, O God, who is like unto thee?" Psalm 71:19

His paths lead to His quality of life. "I lead in the way of righteousness, in the midst of the paths of justice: that I may cause those that love me to inherit substance; and I will fill their treasuries." Proverbs 8:20-21

God has a storehouse and security system for His own. "He layeth up sound wisdom for the righteous; he is a shield to those who walk uprightly. He

keepeth the paths of justice, and preserveth the way of his saints. Then shalt thou understand righteousness, and judgment, and equity; yea, every good path." Proverbs 2:7-9

8-FAITHFULNESS - To prove trustworthy. To be where you are ordained to be; doing what you are ordained to do. To complete what you started.

"Being confident of this very thing, that he which hath begun a good work in you will perform it until the day of Jesus Christ." Phillipians 1:6 There is a recurring theme throughout the pre-flood events that is summed up in this verse taken from Genesis 7:5, "Thus did Noah; according to all that God commanded him, so did he."

As a good steward of the vision of God, he was indeed a credible witness. Noah started and completed the ark. Noah preached the gospel until it was time for him and his family to enter into the ark. Noah proved to be a good steward of all God entrusted to him.

Even when he did not see any results of his preaching, he was still steadfast, immovable, always abounding in his assignment. He showed he was consistent and dependable. He approached his tasks with a sense of duty and honor. Noah was not negligent nor was there any record of breach of service during pre-flood times.

God's promises are backed up by his covenant to us. "...Great is thy faithfulness." Lamentations 3:23b "Thy faithfulness is unto all generations; thou hast established the earth, and it abideth." Psalm 119:90

God's plan and purpose are dependable. "O Lord, thou art my God; I will exalt thee, I will praise thy name; for thou hast done wonderful things; thy counsels of old are faithfulness and truth." Isaiah 25:1

God's faithfulness will not fail or falter. "Nevertheless, my loving kindness will I not utterly take from him, nor suffer my faithfulness to fail. My covenant will I not break, nor will I alter the thing that is gone out of my lips." Psalm 89:33-34.

9-GLORIOUS - The works of God exhibit splendor, value, and excellence. They are rare and outstanding in nature. His works are full of truth and integrity. His finished works manifest the quality and quantity of His operations. Both, the natural and the supernatural define his awesome works.

Isaiah 28:29 refers to God as, "...excellent in working." Everything Noah did brought glory to God. The Bible declares Noah was perfect of all his entire generation, that is, he served God with excellence. Noah completed his pre-flood and flood assignment with high honors. Everything Noah did glorified God. For this, God blessed and prospered Noah and his family.

From raw materials to the finished products, everything was authentic and distinguished. Be resolved that God's innovations work as He originally intends for them to work. His results cannot be aborted nor come about prematurely. Neither, does He make promises under false pretense.

Allowing his spirit of glory to rest upon you removes all insecurities and inadequacies. You may have lacked opportunities, had recurring injustices, even perpetual destruction, loss of skill or resources, and failing results. Please know God manifests His word to totally restore everything that is missing or lacking in your life. God gives no leftovers, nor secondhand merchandise.

God is the glory and lifter of my head. "The works of the Lord are great, sought out of all them who have pleasure therein. His work is honorable and glorious, and his righteousness endureth forever. He hath made his wonderful works to be remembered: the Lord is gracious and full of compassion." Psalm 111:2-4

Praise births the glory of the Lord. "Sing forth the honor of his name; make his praise glorious. Say unto God, How awespiring art thou in thy works! Through the greatness of thy power shall thine enemies submit themselves unto thee." Psalm 66:2-3

"For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind [wisdom]." II Timothy 1:7

Each named characteristic is extremely important. However, Proverbs 4:7a declares "Wisdom is the principle thing, so therefore get wisdom." The word principle in this context is equivalent to the "first fruit" in the Hebrew

translation. Wisdom provides the substance to remain at the forefront of everything in your life. Wisdom provides you with the ability to live life successfully when it has the preeminence. Wisdom is equivalent to having a sound mind.

James 3:13-18 says, "Who is a wise man and endued with knowledge among you? Let him shew out of a good conversation his works with meekness of wisdom. This wisdom descendeth not from above, but is earthly, sensual, devilish. But if ye have bitter envying and strife in your hearts, glory not, and lie not against the truth. For where envying and strife is, there is confusion and every evil work. But the wisdom that is from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, and easy to be entreated, full of mercy and good fruits, without partiality, and without hypocrisy."

Wisdom has two natures: divine and worldly/secular. The divinely inspired wisdom comes directly from God above. The worldly/secular nature of wisdom is concocted by the devil.

Wisdom of the world Greek translation

Earthly: Worldly

Sensual: Fallen nature

Devilish: Demonic

Wisdom from above Interpretation

Pure: Unmixed with strife/envy

Peaceable: Calm and tranquil

Proverbs, the 8th chapter shows the versatility of the wisdom that comes from above. Proverbs 8:1-3, 10-12 has been paraphrased to describe how wisdom functions as the Strong Concordance's illustrates. There are three characteristics of wisdom. The wisdom of God gives: skill, stratagem, and support.

The wisdom of God produces skill. Wisdom develops your mind; your words and your actions. Wisdom must be your teacher. It is more valuable and more enduring than gold and silver. It works with prudence and surfaces witty inventions.

The wisdom of God produces the stratagem. Wisdom devises a plan to deceive its enemy. Wisdom speaks of excellent things. Wisdom speaks of right things. Wisdom speaks of both truth and righteousness. Wisdom always honors the Lord. Wisdom will hate the evil way.

The wisdom of God produces support. Wisdom directly supports and sustains an undertaking. Wisdom is the substance behind excellent results. Wisdom provides support in ruling and reigning. Wisdom will usher in riches and honor. Wisdom has fruit that is better than gold, revenue better than choice silver, and it inherits substance and fills treasuries.

Wisdom is awesome all by it itself. To achieve the fullness of God's character, wisdom brings the other eight traits into full operation. When all of the characteristics are fully working together, you will get the best results.
