<sup>8</sup>And when the Philistines heard that David was anointed king over all Israel, all the Philistines went up to seek David. And David heard of it, and went out against them.

<sup>9</sup>And the Philistines came and spread themselves in the valley of Rephaim.

<sup>10</sup>And David enquired of God, saying, Shall I go up against the Philistines? And wilt thou deliver them into mine hand? a. <u>Micah 2:13</u> Over and over again the prophets unveiled the full dimensions of God's judgment and salvation. God must punish His rebellious people but will afterward redeem them. Israel will be carried into captivity, yet a remnant will return. The Messiah, the One who breaks open the way, will lead them back home, and will restore the kingdom of David. Psalm 23 Living Bible (TLB)

<sup>1</sup>Because the Lord is my Shepherd, I have everything I need!

<sup>23</sup>He lets me rest in the meadow grass and leads me beside the quiet streams. He gives me new strength. He helps me do what honors him the most.

<sup>4</sup>Even when walking through the dark valley of death I will not be afraid, for you are close beside me, guarding, guiding all the way.<sup>[a]</sup>

<sup>5</sup>You provide delicious food for me in the presence of my enemies. You have welcomed me as your guest;<sup>[b]</sup> blessings overflow!

John 10:1-18 The Passion Translation (TPT)

The Parable of the Kind Shepherd

<sup>1</sup>*Jesus said to the Pharisees*, "Listen to this eternal truth: The person who sneaks over the wall to enter into the sheep pen, rather than coming through the gate, reveals himself as a thief coming to steal. <sup>2</sup>But the true Shepherd walks right up to the gate, <sup>3</sup>and because the gatekeeper knows who he is, he opens the gate to let him in.<sup>[2]</sup> And the sheep recognize the voice of the true Shepherd, for he calls his own by name and leads them out, for they belong to him. <sup>4</sup>And when he has brought out all his sheep, he walks ahead of them and they will follow him, for they are familiar with his voice. <sup>5</sup>But they will run away from strangers and never follow them because they know it's the voice of a stranger." <sup>6</sup>Jesus told the Pharisees this parable even though they didn't understand a word of what he meant.<sup>[2]</sup>

<sup>7</sup>So Jesus went over it again, "I speak to you eternal truth: I am the Gate for the flock.<sup>[]</sup> <sup>8</sup>All those who broke in before me are thieves who came to

steal,<sup>[4]</sup> but the sheep never listened to them. <sup>9</sup>I am the Gateway.<sup>[4]</sup> To enter through me is to experience life, freedom, and satisfaction.<sup>[1]</sup> <sup>10</sup>A thief has only one thing in mind—he wants to steal, slaughter,<sup>[4]</sup> and destroy. But I have come to *give you everything in abundance, <sup>[4]</sup> more than you expect<sup>[4]</sup>* life in its fullness until you overflow! <sup>11</sup>I am the Good<sup>[4]</sup> Shepherd who lays down my life as a sacrifice for the sheep. <sup>12–13</sup>But the worker who serves only for wages is not a real shepherd. Because he has no heart for the sheep he will run away and abandon them when he sees the wolf coming. And then the wolf mauls the sheep, drags them off, and scatters them.

<sup>14</sup>"I alone am the Good Shepherd, and I know those whose hearts are mine, for they recognize me and know me, <sup>15</sup>just as my Father knows my heart and I know my Father's heart. I am ready to give my life for the sheep.

<sup>16</sup> "And I have other sheep that I will gather which are not of this Jewish flock. And I, their shepherd, must lead them too, and they will follow me and listen to my voice. And I will join them all into one flock with one shepherd.

<sup>17</sup> "The Father has an intense love for me because I freely give my own life to raise it up again. <sup>18</sup>I surrender my own life, and no one has the power to take my life from me. I have the authority to lay it down and the power to take it back again. This is the destiny my Father has set before me."

#### Footnotes:

- a. <u>John 10:3</u> In this parable the gatekeeper would represent John the Baptizer who recognized Jesus as the Shepherd. John opened the gate for him to be introduced to Israel at Jesus' baptism.
- b. John 10:6 They didn't understand this allegory of the Old Testament law as the sheepfold that became the religion of Judaism, like a pen that confined the people. Christ is the gate that not only allowed everyone in, but he let them out in the New Testament to enjoy all the riches of the pasture. The Holy Spirit is the gatekeeper and the false prophets and Pharisees are the thieves and robbers. Remember that this chapter follows the healing of the blind man who was cast out of the "sheep pen" but accepted in Christ. See <u>Gal. 3:23-26</u>. Jesus is the shepherd, the gate, and the pasture.
- c. <u>John 10:7</u> As translated from the Aramaic. There is a word play with "l" *(ena)* and "flock" *(ana)*. As the gateway, he brings us to the Father and his kingdom realm. As the shepherd, he cares for us and shows us his loving heart.
- d. <u>John 10:8</u> The Old Testament refers to the kings of Israel and Judah as "shepherds." These kings along with false prophets are shepherds who don't always have God's heart for the sheep. After the healing of the blind man, the Pharisees refused to acknowledge Jesus' rightful place as shepherd of his flock, so the *thieves coming to steal* would also refer to them.

- e. John 10:9 A sheep pen was an enclosure with walls and no roof that would often have the sheep of an entire village kept within. After the sheep were brought in for the night, it was common for the shepherd to sleep at the entrance so he could protect his sheep. Only the shepherds of the sheep would be recognized by that gatekeeper. Jesus is the one who will remain with his flock and keep his sheep living in peace and safety. His teaching (voice) will guard us from the unreliable teachers who want to steal our hearts and bind us to themselves. They steal and rob the affection that belongs only to Jesus, our kind shepherd.
- f. John 10:9 Or "go in and out and find pasture."
- g. John 10:10 The Greek word *thuo* is not the usual word for "kill." It means "sacrifice," or "slaughter."
- h. John 10:10 Implied in the Aramaic text.
- i. John 10:10 Implied in the Greek text.
- j. John 10:11 The word for "good" in Greek (*kalos*) can also mean "beautiful," "virtuous," "excellent," "genuine," or "better." (See *Strong's Concordance*, Gr. 2570.) Jesus is also called the "Great Shepherd" (<u>Heb. 13:20</u>) and the "Shepherd-King" (<u>1 Peter 5:4</u>).
- k. John 10:16 This "one flock" is the church made up of both Jews and non-Jews. See Ezek. <u>34:23</u>; Eph. 2:11-14.

<sup>31</sup> What shall we then say to these things? If God be for us, who can be against us?

<sup>32</sup> He that spared not his own Son, but delivered him up for us all, how shall he not with him also freely give us all things?

<sup>33</sup> Who shall lay any thing to the charge of God's elect? It is God that justifieth.

<sup>34</sup> Who is he that condemneth? It is Christ that died, yea rather, that is risen again, who is even at the right hand of God, who also maketh intercession for us.

<sup>35</sup> Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword?

<sup>36</sup> As it is written, For thy sake we are killed all the day long; we are accounted as sheep for the slaughter.

<sup>37</sup> Nay, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him that loved us.

<sup>38</sup> For I am persuaded, that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come,

<sup>39</sup> Nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Hebrews 11:23-29 Amplified Bible, Classic Edition (AMPC)

<sup>23</sup> [Prompted] by faith Moses, after his birth, was kept concealed for three months by his parents, because they saw how comely the child was; and they were not overawed *and* terrified by the king's decree.<sup>(A)</sup>

<sup>24</sup> [Aroused] by faith Moses, when he had grown to maturity *and* <sup>[a]</sup>become great, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter,<sup>(B)</sup>

<sup>25</sup> Because he preferred to share the oppression [suffer the hardships] and bear the shame of the people of God rather than to have the fleeting enjoyment of a sinful life.

<sup>26</sup> He considered the contempt and abuse and shame [borne for] the Christ (the Messiah Who was to come) to be greater wealth than all the treasures of Egypt, for he looked forward and away to the reward (recompense).

<sup>27</sup> [Motivated] by faith he left Egypt behind him, being unawed and undismayed by the wrath of the king; for he never flinched but held staunchly to his purpose and endured steadfastly as one who gazed on Him Who is invisible.<sup>(C)</sup>

<sup>28</sup> By faith (simple trust and confidence in God) he instituted *and* carried out the Passover and the sprinkling of the blood [on the doorposts], so that the destroyer of the firstborn (the angel) might not touch those [of the children of Israel].<sup>(D)</sup>

<sup>29</sup> [Urged on] by faith the people crossed the Red Sea as [though] on dry land, but when the Egyptians tried to do the same thing they were swallowed up [by the sea].<sup>(E)</sup>

Exodus 17:1-7 King James Version (KJV)

**17** And all the congregation of the children of Israel journeyed from the wilderness of Sin, after their journeys, according to the commandment of the LORD, and pitched in Rephidim: and there was no water for the people to drink.

<sup>2</sup> Wherefore the people did chide with Moses, and said, Give us water that we may drink. And Moses said unto them, Why chide ye with me? wherefore do ye tempt the LORD?

<sup>2</sup> And there was no water for the congregation: and they gathered themselves together against Moses and against Aaron.

<sup>3</sup> And the people chode with Moses, and spake, saying, Would God that we had died when our brethren died before the LORD!

<sup>4</sup> And why have ye brought up the congregation of the LORD into this wilderness, that we and our cattle should die there?

<sup>9</sup> And Joshua the son of Nun was full of the spirit of wisdom; for Moses had laid his hands upon him: and the children of Israel hearkened unto him, and did as the LORD commanded Moses.

<sup>10</sup> And there arose not a prophet since in Israel like unto Moses, whom the LORD knew face to face,

<sup>11</sup> In all the signs and the wonders, which the LORD sent him to do in the land of Egypt to Pharaoh, and to all his servants, and to all his land,

<sup>13</sup>And it came to pass, when Joshua was by Jericho, that he lifted up his eyes and looked, and, behold, there stood a man over against him with his sword drawn in his hand: and Joshua went unto him, and said unto him, Art thou for us, or for our adversaries?

<sup>14</sup>And he said, Nay; but as captain of the host of the LORD am I now come. And Joshua fell on his face to the earth, and did worship, and said unto him, What saith my Lord unto his servant?

<sup>15</sup>And the captain of the LORD's host said unto Joshua, Loose thy shoe from off thy foot; for the place whereon thou standest is holy. And Joshua did so.

# Joshua 10 King James Version (KJV)

<sup>1</sup>Now it came to pass, when Adonizedec king of Jerusalem had heard how Joshua had taken Ai, and had utterly destroyed it; as he had done to Jericho and her king, so he had done to Ai and her king; and how the inhabitants of Gibeon had made peace with Israel, and were among them;

<sup>2</sup>That they feared greatly, because Gibeon was a great city, as one of the royal cities, and because it was greater than Ai, and all the men thereof were mighty.

<sup>3</sup>Wherefore Adonizedec king of Jerusalem, sent unto Hoham king of Hebron, and unto Piram king of Jarmuth, and unto Japhia king of Lachish, and unto Debir king of Eglon, saying,

<sup>4</sup>Come up unto me, and help me, that we may smite Gibeon: for it hath made peace with Joshua and with the children of Israel.

<sup>5</sup>Therefore the five kings of the Amorites, the king of Jerusalem, the king of Hebron, the king of Jarmuth, the king of Lachish, the king of Eglon, gathered themselves together, and went up, they and all their hosts, and encamped before Gibeon, and made war against it.

<sup>6</sup>And the men of Gibeon sent unto Joshua to the camp to Gilgal, saying, Slack not thy hand from thy servants; come up to us quickly, and save us, and help us: for all the kings of the Amorites that dwell in the mountains are gathered together against us.

<sup>7</sup>So Joshua ascended from Gilgal, he, and all the people of war with him, and all the mighty men of valour.

<sup>8</sup>And the LORD said unto Joshua, Fear them not: for I have delivered them into thine hand; there shall not a man of them stand before thee.

<sup>9</sup>Joshua therefore came unto them suddenly, and went up from Gilgal all night.

<sup>10</sup>And the LORD discomfited them before Israel, and slew them with a great slaughter at Gibeon, and chased them along the way that goeth up to Bethhoron, and smote them to Azekah, and unto Makkedah.

<sup>11</sup>And it came to pass, as they fled from before Israel, and were in the going down to Bethhoron, that the LORD cast down great stones from heaven upon them unto Azekah, and they died: they were more which died with hailstones than they whom the children of Israel slew with the sword.

<sup>12</sup>Then spake Joshua to the LORD in the day when the LORD delivered up the Amorites before the children of Israel, and he said in the sight of Israel, Sun, stand thou still upon Gibeon; and thou, Moon, in the valley of Ajalon.

<sup>13</sup>And the sun stood still, and the moon stayed, until the people had avenged themselves upon their enemies. Is not this written in the book of Jasher? So the sun stood still in the midst of heaven, and hasted not to go down about a whole day.

<sup>14</sup>And there was no day like that before it or after it, that the LORD hearkened unto the voice of a man: for the LORD fought for Israel.

<sup>15</sup>And Joshua returned, and all Israel with him, unto the camp to Gilgal.

<sup>16</sup>But these five kings fled, and hid themselves in a cave at Makkedah.

<sup>17</sup>And it was told Joshua, saying, The five kings are found hid in a cave at Makkedah.

<sup>18</sup>And Joshua said, Roll great stones upon the mouth of the cave, and set men by it for to keep them:

<sup>19</sup>And stay ye not, but pursue after your enemies, and smite the hindmost of them; suffer them not to enter into their cities: for the LORD your God hath delivered them into your hand.

<sup>20</sup> And it came to pass, when Joshua and the children of Israel had made an end of slaying them with a very great slaughter, till they were consumed, that the rest which remained of them entered into fenced cities.

<sup>21</sup> And all the people returned to the camp to Joshua at Makkedah in peace: none moved his tongue against any of the children of Israel.

<sup>22</sup>Then said Joshua, Open the mouth of the cave, and bring out those five kings unto me out of the cave.

<sup>23</sup>And they did so, and brought forth those five kings unto him out of the cave, the king of Jerusalem, the king of Hebron, the king of Jarmuth, the king of Lachish, and the king of Eglon.

<sup>24</sup>And it came to pass, when they brought out those kings unto Joshua, that Joshua called for all the men of Israel, and said unto the captains of the men of war which went with him, Come near, put your feet upon the necks of these kings. And they came near, and put their feet upon the necks of them.

<sup>25</sup> And Joshua said unto them, Fear not, nor be dismayed, be strong and of good courage: for thus shall the LORD do to all your enemies against whom ye fight.

<sup>26</sup> And afterward Joshua smote them, and slew them, and hanged them on five trees: and they were hanging upon the trees until the evening.

<sup>27</sup> And it came to pass at the time of the going down of the sun, that Joshua commanded, and they took them down off the trees, and cast them into the cave wherein they had been hid, and laid great stones in the cave's mouth, which remain until this very day.

<sup>28</sup> And that day Joshua took Makkedah, and smote it with the edge of the sword, and the king thereof he utterly destroyed, them, and all the souls that were therein; he let none remain: and he did to the king of Makkedah as he did unto the king of Jericho.

<sup>29</sup> Then Joshua passed from Makkedah, and all Israel with him, unto Libnah, and fought against Libnah:

<sup>30</sup> And the LORD delivered it also, and the king thereof, into the hand of Israel; and he smote it with the edge of the sword, and all the souls that were therein; he let none remain in it; but did unto the king thereof as he did unto the king of Jericho.

<sup>31</sup>And Joshua passed from Libnah, and all Israel with him, unto Lachish, and encamped against it, and fought against it:

<sup>32</sup>And the LORD delivered Lachish into the hand of Israel, which took it on the second day, and smote it with the edge of the sword, and all the souls that were therein, according to all that he had done to Libnah.

<sup>33</sup>Then Horam king of Gezer came up to help Lachish; and Joshua smote him and his people, until he had left him none remaining.

<sup>34</sup>And from Lachish Joshua passed unto Eglon, and all Israel with him; and they encamped against it, and fought against it:

<sup>35</sup> And they took it on that day, and smote it with the edge of the sword, and all the souls that were therein he utterly destroyed that day, according to all that he had done to Lachish.

<sup>36</sup>And Joshua went up from Eglon, and all Israel with him, unto Hebron; and they fought against it:

<sup>37</sup>And they took it, and smote it with the edge of the sword, and the king thereof, and all the cities thereof, and all the souls that were therein; he left none remaining, according to all that he had done to Eglon; but destroyed it utterly, and all the souls that were therein.

<sup>38</sup> And Joshua returned, and all Israel with him, to Debir; and fought against it:

<sup>39</sup>And he took it, and the king thereof, and all the cities thereof; and they smote them with the edge of the sword, and utterly destroyed all the souls that were therein; he left none remaining: as he had done to Hebron, so he did to Debir, and to the king thereof; as he had done also to Libnah, and to her king.

<sup>40</sup>So Joshua smote all the country of the hills, and of the south, and of the vale, and of the springs, and all their kings: he left none remaining, but utterly destroyed all that breathed, as the LORD God of Israel commanded.

<sup>41</sup>And Joshua smote them from Kadeshbarnea even unto Gaza, and all the country of Goshen, even unto Gibeon.

<sup>42</sup> And all these kings and their land did Joshua take at one time, because the LORD God of Israel fought for Israel.

<sup>43</sup>And Joshua returned, and all Israel with him, unto the camp to Gilgal.

Joshua 11-12 King James Version (KJV)

**11** And it came to pass, when Jabin king of Hazor had heard those things, that he sent to Jobab king of Madon, and to the king of Shimron, and to the king of Achshaph,

<sup>2</sup> And to the kings that were on the north of the mountains, and of the plains south of Chinneroth, and in the valley, and in the borders of Dor on the west,

<sup>3</sup>And to the Canaanite on the east and on the west, and to the Amorite, and the Hittite, and the Perizzite, and the Jebusite in the mountains, and to the Hivite under Hermon in the land of Mizpeh.

<sup>4</sup>And they went out, they and all their hosts with them, much people, even as the sand that is upon the sea shore in multitude, with horses and chariots very many.

<sup>5</sup>And when all these kings were met together, they came and pitched together at the waters of Merom, to fight against Israel.

<sup>6</sup> And the LORD said unto Joshua, Be not afraid because of them: for to morrow about this time will I deliver them up all slain before Israel: thou shalt hough their horses, and burn their chariots with fire.

<sup>7</sup>So Joshua came, and all the people of war with him, against them by the waters of Merom suddenly; and they fell upon them.

<sup>8</sup> And the LORD delivered them into the hand of Israel, who smote them, and chased them unto great Zidon, and unto Misrephothmaim, and unto the valley of Mizpeh eastward; and they smote them, until they left them none remaining.

<sup>9</sup>And Joshua did unto them as the LORD bade him: he houghed their horses, and burnt their chariots with fire.

<sup>10</sup> And Joshua at that time turned back, and took Hazor, and smote the king thereof with the sword: for Hazor beforetime was the head of all those kingdoms.

<sup>11</sup> And they smote all the souls that were therein with the edge of the sword, utterly destroying them: there was not any left to breathe: and he burnt Hazor with fire.

<sup>12</sup> And all the cities of those kings, and all the kings of them, did Joshua take, and smote them with the edge of the sword, and he utterly destroyed them, as Moses the servant of the LORD commanded.

<sup>13</sup> But as for the cities that stood still in their strength, Israel burned none of them, save Hazor only; that did Joshua burn.

<sup>14</sup> And all the spoil of these cities, and the cattle, the children of Israel took for a prey unto themselves; but every man they smote with the edge of the sword, until they had destroyed them, neither left they any to breathe.

<sup>15</sup> As the LORD commanded Moses his servant, so did Moses command Joshua, and so did Joshua; he left nothing undone of all that the LORD commanded Moses.

<sup>16</sup> So Joshua took all that land, the hills, and all the south country, and all the land of Goshen, and the valley, and the plain, and the mountain of Israel, and the valley of the same;

<sup>17</sup> Even from the mount Halak, that goeth up to Seir, even unto Baalgad in the valley of Lebanon under mount Hermon: and all their kings he took, and smote them, and slew them.

<sup>18</sup> Joshua made war a long time with all those kings.

<sup>19</sup> There was not a city that made peace with the children of Israel, save the Hivites the inhabitants of Gibeon: all other they took in battle.

<sup>20</sup> For it was of the LORD to harden their hearts, that they should come against Israel in battle, that he might destroy them utterly, and that they might have no favour, but that he might destroy them, as the LORD commanded Moses.

<sup>21</sup> And at that time came Joshua, and cut off the Anakims from the mountains, from Hebron, from Debir, from Anab, and from all the mountains of Judah, and from all the mountains of Israel: Joshua destroyed them utterly with their cities.

<sup>22</sup> There was none of the Anakims left in the land of the children of Israel: only in Gaza, in Gath, and in Ashdod, there remained.

<sup>23</sup> So Joshua took the whole land, according to all that the LORD said unto Moses; and Joshua gave it for an inheritance unto Israel according to their divisions by their tribes. And the land rested from war.

**12** Now these are the kings of the land, which the children of Israel smote, and possessed their land on the other side Jordan toward the rising of the sun, from the river Arnon unto mount Hermon, and all the plain on the east:

<sup>2</sup> Sihon king of the Amorites, who dwelt in Heshbon, and ruled from Aroer, which is upon the bank of the river Arnon, and from the middle of the river, and from half Gilead, even unto the river Jabbok, which is the border of the children of Ammon;

<sup>3</sup>And from the plain to the sea of Chinneroth on the east, and unto the sea of the plain, even the salt sea on the east, the way to Bethjeshimoth; and from the south, under Ashdothpisgah:

<sup>4</sup> And the coast of Og king of Bashan, which was of the remnant of the giants, that dwelt at Ashtaroth and at Edrei,

<sup>5</sup> And reigned in mount Hermon, and in Salcah, and in all Bashan, unto the border of the Geshurites and the Maachathites, and half Gilead, the border of Sihon king of Heshbon.

<sup>6</sup>Them did Moses the servant of the LORD and the children of Israel smite: and Moses the servant of the LORD gave it for a possession unto the Reubenites, and the Gadites, and the half tribe of Manasseh.

<sup>7</sup> And these are the kings of the country which Joshua and the children of Israel smote on this side Jordan on the west, from Baalgad in the valley of Lebanon even unto the mount Halak, that goeth up to Seir; which Joshua gave unto the tribes of Israel for a possession according to their divisions;

<sup>8</sup> In the mountains, and in the valleys, and in the plains, and in the springs, and in the wilderness, and in the south country; the Hittites, the Amorites, and the Canaanites, the Perizzites, the Hivites, and the Jebusites:

<sup>9</sup>The king of Jericho, one; the king of Ai, which is beside Bethel, one;

<sup>10</sup> The king of Jerusalem, one; the king of Hebron, one;

<sup>11</sup> The king of Jarmuth, one; the king of Lachish, one;

<sup>12</sup> The king of Eglon, one; the king of Gezer, one;
<sup>13</sup> The king of Debir, one; the king of Geder, one;
<sup>14</sup> The king of Hormah, one; the king of Arad, one;
<sup>15</sup> The king of Libnah, one; the king of Adullam, one;
<sup>16</sup> The king of Makkedah, one; the king of Bethel, one;
<sup>17</sup> The king of Tappuah, one; the king of Hepher, one;
<sup>18</sup> The king of Aphek, one; the king of Lasharon, one;
<sup>19</sup> The king of Madon, one; the king of Hazor, one;
<sup>20</sup> The king of Shimronmeron, one; the king of Achshaph, one;
<sup>21</sup> The king of Taanach, one; the king of Megiddo, one;
<sup>22</sup> The king of Kedesh, one; the king of Jokneam of Carmel, one;
<sup>23</sup> The king of Dor in the coast of Dor, one; the king of the nations of Gilgal, one;

<sup>24</sup> The king of Tirzah, one: all the kings thirty and one.

<sup>5</sup> They have corrupted themselves, their spot is not the spot of his children: they are a perverse and crooked generation.

<sup>6</sup> Do ye thus requite the LORD, O foolish people and unwise? is not he thy father that hath bought thee? hath he not made thee, and established thee?

<sup>7</sup> Remember the days of old, consider the years of many generations: ask thy father, and he will shew thee; thy elders, and they will tell thee.

<sup>8</sup> When the Most High divided to the nations their inheritance, when he separated the sons of Adam, he set the bounds of the people according to the number of the children of Israel.

<sup>9</sup> For the LORD's portion is his people; Jacob is the lot of his inheritance.

<sup>10</sup> He found him in a desert land, and in the waste howling wilderness; he led him about, he instructed him, he kept him as the apple of his eye.

<sup>11</sup> As an eagle stirreth up her nest, fluttereth over her young, spreadeth abroad her wings, taketh them, beareth them on her wings:

<sup>12</sup> So the LORD alone did lead him, and there was no strange god with him.

<sup>13</sup> He made him ride on the high places of the earth, that he might eat the increase of the fields; and he made him to suck honey out of the rock, and oil out of the flinty rock;

<sup>14</sup> Butter of kine, and milk of sheep, with fat of lambs, and rams of the breed of Bashan, and goats, with the fat of kidneys of wheat; and thou didst drink the pure blood of the grape.

<sup>15</sup> But Jeshurun waxed fat, and kicked: thou art waxen fat, thou art grown thick, thou art covered with fatness; then he forsook God which made him, and lightly esteemed the Rock of his salvation.

<sup>16</sup> They provoked him to jealousy with strange gods, with abominations provoked they him to anger.

<sup>17</sup> They sacrificed unto devils, not to God; to gods whom they knew not, to new gods that came newly up, whom your fathers feared not.

<sup>18</sup> Of the Rock that begat thee thou art unmindful, and hast forgotten God that formed thee.

 $^{\mathbf{19}}$  And when the LORD saw it, he abhorred them, because of the provoking of his sons, and of his daughters.

<sup>20</sup> And he said, I will hide my face from them, I will see what their end shall be: for they are a very froward generation, children in whom is no faith.

<sup>21</sup> They have moved me to jealousy with that which is not God; they have provoked me to anger with their vanities: and I will move them to jealousy with those which are not a people; I will provoke them to anger with a foolish nation.

<sup>22</sup> For a fire is kindled in mine anger, and shall burn unto the lowest hell, and shall consume the earth with her increase, and set on fire the foundations of the mountains.

<sup>23</sup> I will heap mischiefs upon them; I will spend mine arrows upon them.

<sup>24</sup> They shall be burnt with hunger, and devoured with burning heat, and with bitter destruction: I will also send the teeth of beasts upon them, with the poison of serpents of the dust.

<sup>25</sup> The sword without, and terror within, shall destroy both the young man and the virgin, the suckling also with the man of gray hairs.

<sup>26</sup> I said, I would scatter them into corners, I would make the remembrance of them to cease from among men:

<sup>27</sup> Were it not that I feared the wrath of the enemy, lest their adversaries should behave themselves strangely, and lest they should say, Our hand is high, and the LORD hath not done all this.

<sup>28</sup> For they are a nation void of counsel, neither is there any understanding in them.

<sup>29</sup> O that they were wise, that they understood this, that they would consider their latter end!

<sup>30</sup> How should one chase a thousand, and two put ten thousand to flight, except their Rock had sold them, and the LORD had shut them up?

<sup>31</sup> For their rock is not as our Rock, even our enemies themselves being judges.

<sup>32</sup> For their vine is of the vine of Sodom, and of the fields of Gomorrah: their grapes are grapes of gall, their clusters are bitter:

<sup>33</sup> Their wine is the poison of dragons, and the cruel venom of asps.

<sup>34</sup> Is not this laid up in store with me, and sealed up among my treasures?

<sup>35</sup> To me belongeth vengeance and recompence; their foot shall slide in due time: for the day of their calamity is at hand, and the things that shall come upon them make haste.

<sup>36</sup> For the LORD shall judge his people, and repent himself for his servants, when he seeth that their power is gone, and there is none shut up, or left.

<sup>37</sup> And he shall say, Where are their gods, their rock in whom they trusted,

<sup>38</sup> Which did eat the fat of their sacrifices, and drank the wine of their drink offerings? let them rise up and help you, and be your protection.

<sup>39</sup> See now that I, even I, am he, and there is no god with me: I kill, and I make alive; I wound, and I heal: neither is there any that can deliver out of my hand.

<sup>40</sup> For I lift up my hand to heaven, and say, I live for ever.

<sup>41</sup> If I whet my glittering sword, and mine hand take hold on judgment; I will render vengeance to mine enemies, and will reward them that hate me.

<sup>42</sup> I will make mine arrows drunk with blood, and my sword shall devour flesh; and that with the blood of the slain and of the captives, from the beginning of revenges upon the enemy.

<sup>43</sup> Rejoice, O ye nations, with his people: for he will avenge the blood of his servants, and will render vengeance to his adversaries, and will be merciful unto his land, and to his people.

<sup>44</sup> And Moses came and spake all the words of this song in the ears of the people, he, and Hoshea the son of Nun.

<sup>45</sup> And Moses made an end of speaking all these words to all Israel:

<sup>46</sup> And he said unto them, Set your hearts unto all the words which I testify among you this day, which ye shall command your children to observe to do, all the words of this law.

<sup>47</sup> For it is not a vain thing for you; because it is your life: and through this thing ye shall prolong your days in the land, whither ye go over Jordan to possess it.

<sup>48</sup> And the LORD spake unto Moses that selfsame day, saying,

<sup>49</sup> Get thee up into this mountain Abarim, unto mount Nebo, which is in the land of Moab, that is over against Jericho; and behold the land of Canaan, which I give unto the children of Israel for a possession:

<sup>50</sup> And die in the mount whither thou goest up, and be gathered unto thy people; as Aaron thy brother died in mount Hor, and was gathered unto his people:

<sup>51</sup> Because ye trespassed against me among the children of Israel at the waters of MeribahKadesh, in the wilderness of Zin; because ye sanctified me not in the midst of the children of Israel.

<sup>52</sup> Yet thou shalt see the land before thee; but thou shalt not go thither unto the land which I give the children of Israel.
