The Tsunami Blessing Inside and Out, Part 99 Scriptures

God's Blessing bestows His own advantage upon you to live heaven on life all the days of your life. Holy Spirit is a very present and active force in the lives of receiving-believers. He is empowered to help you to choose the best all the time in everything. Truly, that is the only way you are supernaturally enabled to live in the circle of Blessing, never a cycle of defeat. Even if you feel overtaken by the curse, your way of escape stands ready to pull you successfully into the Blessing.

The curse of the law is polar opposite of the Blessing of the Lord. More importantly, the blood of Jesus Christ redeemed you from the curse, all of it. The price He paid completely covered every sin, iniquity, and even every consequence of the curse. Without any doubt, Jesus rendered the curse powerless to harm you in anyway. The power of the Blessing never stops flowing: in that, Holy Spirit floods the curse both in the visible and invisible realms.

Maximum recovery grants you a "do-over" for every year lost, stolen, or destroyed. It does not matter whose choice, yours or others. The hand of God through Holy Spirit upon you imparts the Blessing of the Lord that makes you rich at the same level of glory. Then you will know for yourself that He adds no sorrow with it. Jesus saved you to the uttermost! There is nothing left out. It remains an all-inclusive everlasting covenant. In the kingdom of God, it is unconstitutional for you to live under the curse.

1. The Blessed blesses God, others, and himself.

Hebrews 5:1-10 The Passion Translation (TPT)

A King-Priest like Melchizedek

5 For every High Priest was chosen from among the people and appointed to represent them before God by presenting their gifts to God and offering sacrifices on their behalf. ² Since the High Priest is also one who is clothed in weakness, he humbles himself^[a] by showing compassion to those who are ignorant of God's ways and stray from them. ³ And for this reason, he has to not only present the sin offerings of others, but also to bring a sin offering for himself. ⁴ And no one takes this honor upon himself by being self-appointed, but God is the one who calls each one, just as Aaron was called.

⁵ So also, Christ was not self-appointed and did not glorify himself by becoming a high priest, but God called and glorified him!^[b] For the Father said to him,

"You are my favored Son. Today I have fathered you." [C]

⁶And in another Scripture he says about this new priestly order,

"You are a Priest like Melchizedek,^[d] a King-Priest forever!"

⁷ During Christ's days on earth^[e] he pleaded with God, praying with passion and with tearful agony that God would spare him from death.^[f] And because of his perfect devotion his prayer was answered and he was delivered. ⁸ But even though he was a wonderful Son,^[g] he learned to listen^[h] and obey through all his sufferings. ⁹ And after being proven perfect in this way he has now become the source of eternal salvation to all those who listen to him and obey. ¹⁰ For God has designated him as the King-Priest who is over the priestly order of Melchizedek.^[i]

The Melchizedek Priesthood

7 ^{1–2} Melchizedek's name means "king of righteousness." He was the King of Peace, because the name of the city he ruled as king was Salem, which means "peace." And he was also a priest of the Most High God. Now when Abraham was returning from defeating many kings in battle, Melchizedek went out to meet him and blessed him. Then Abraham took a tenth of everything he had won in battle and gave it to Melchizedek.^[a]

¹⁰ For let him who wants to enjoy life and see good days [good—whether apparent or not] keep his tongue free from evil and his lips from guile (treachery, deceit).

¹¹Let him turn away from wickedness *and* shun it, and let him do right. Let him search for peace (harmony; undisturbedness from fears, agitating passions, and moral conflicts) and seek it eagerly. [Do not merely desire peaceful relations with God, with your fellowmen, and with yourself, but pursue, go after them!] 12 For the eyes of the Lord are upon the righteous (those who are upright and in right standing with God), and His ears are attentive to their prayer. But the face of the Lord is against those who practice evil [to oppose them, to frustrate, and defeat them].^(A)

¹³Now who is there to hurt you if you are ^[a]zealous followers of that which is good?

¹⁴ But even in case you should suffer for the sake of righteousness, [you are] blessed (happy, to be envied). Do not dread *or* be afraid of their threats, nor be disturbed [by their opposition].

¹⁵ But in your hearts set Christ apart as holy [and acknowledge Him] as Lord. Always be ready to give a logical defense to anyone who asks you to account for the hope that is in you, but do it courteously and respectfully.^(B)

¹⁶ [And see to it that] your conscience is entirely clear (^[b]unimpaired), so that, when you are falsely accused as evildoers, those who threaten you abusively *and* revile your right behavior in Christ may come to be ashamed [of slandering your good lives].

¹⁷ For [it is] better to suffer [unjustly] for doing right, if that should be God's will, than to suffer [justly] for doing wrong.

¹⁸ For Christ [the Messiah Himself] died for sins once ^[c]for all, the Righteous for the unrighteous (the Just for the unjust, the Innocent for the guilty), that He might bring us to God. In His human body He was put to death, but He was made alive in the spirit,

¹² Saying with a loud voice, Worthy is the Lamb that was slain to receive power, and riches, and wisdom, and strength, and honour, and glory, and blessing.

4.Christ has already redeemed you from the curse of the law so the blessing of Abraham can come on you.

Deuteronomy 28:15-68 King James Version (KJV)

¹⁵ But it shall come to pass, if thou wilt not hearken unto the voice of the LORD thy God, to observe to do all his commandments and his statutes which I command thee this day; that all these curses shall come upon thee, and overtake thee:

¹⁶ Cursed shalt thou be in the city, and cursed shalt thou be in the field.

¹⁷ Cursed shall be thy basket and thy store.

¹⁸ Cursed shall be the fruit of thy body, and the fruit of thy land, the increase of thy kine, and the flocks of thy sheep.

⁶¹ Also every sickness, and every plague, which is not written in the book of this law, them will the LORD bring upon thee, until thou be destroyed.

⁶² And ye shall be left few in number, whereas ye were as the stars of heaven for multitude; because thou wouldest not obey the voice of the LORD thy God.

⁶³ And it shall come to pass, that as the LORD rejoiced over you to do you good, and to multiply you; so the LORD will rejoice over you to destroy you, and to bring you to nought; and ye shall be plucked from off the land whither thou goest to possess it.

⁶⁴ And the LORD shall scatter thee among all people, from the one end of the earth even unto the other; and there thou shalt serve other gods, which neither thou nor thy fathers have known, even wood and stone.

⁶⁵ And among these nations shalt thou find no ease, neither shall the sole of thy foot have rest: but the LORD shall give thee there a trembling heart, and failing of eyes, and sorrow of mind:

⁶⁶ And thy life shall hang in doubt before thee; and thou shalt fear day and night, and shalt have none assurance of thy life:

⁶⁷ In the morning thou shalt say, Would God it were even! and at even thou shalt say, Would God it were morning! for the fear of thine heart wherewith thou shalt fear, and for the sight of thine eyes which thou shalt see.

5.Reposition for the blessing to overtake you so the curse has no place to launch or land.
