

## **The Tsunami Blessing Inside and Out, Part 108 Scriptures**

**God is so compassionate and passionate about you having His love He gave you His own heart. Now you host the love that holds you together completely. That is how you become the express carrier of the presence of God into your sphere of influence. You transport with love by the rhythm of His life.**

**With the love of God, you attract the Lord. Living through Jesus Christ, neighbors, even enemies embrace the love of God. Without the love of God, you may attack the Lord, others as well as yourself. Even in dysfunction, Jesus is still here for you. He heals every broken heart and binds up every wound. Holy Spirit pours in His new wine to disinfect every wound followed by His fresh oil to restore you fully.**

**Help from God's countenance is equivalent to the health of your countenance. By Jesus' stripes, you were, therefore are healed, inside and out. A sound heart is life of the flesh granting you the capacity to live in divine health. Translated from Hebrew, "saving health" is all-inclusive. You already inherited the privilege to receive God's help; deliverance; welfare; aid; prosperity; and victory.**

### **The Classic Heart**

1 Corinthians 13:4-8 Amplified Bible, Classic Edition (AMPC)

<sup>4</sup>Love endures long *and* is patient and kind; love never is envious *nor* boils over with jealousy, is not boastful *or* vainglorious, does not display itself haughtily.

<sup>5</sup>It is not conceited (arrogant and inflated with pride); it is not rude (unmannerly) *and* does not act unbecomingly. Love (God's love in us) does not insist on its own rights *or* its own way, *for* it is not self-seeking; it is not touchy *or* fretful *or* resentful; it takes no account of the evil done to it [it pays no attention to a suffered wrong].

<sup>6</sup>It does not rejoice at injustice *and* unrighteousness, but rejoices when right *and* truth prevail.

<sup>7</sup>Love bears up under anything *and* everything that comes, is ever ready to believe the best of every person, its hopes are fadeless under all circumstances, and it endures everything [without weakening].

<sup>8</sup>Love never fails [never fades out or becomes obsolete or comes to an end]. As for prophecy (<sup>[a]</sup>the gift of interpreting the divine will and purpose), it will be fulfilled *and* pass away; as for tongues, they will be destroyed *and* cease; as for knowledge, it will pass away [it will lose its value and be superseded by truth].

<sup>8</sup>But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.

John 3:16 King James Version (KJV)

<sup>16</sup>For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life.

Mark 12:29-31 Amplified Bible, Classic Edition (AMPC)

<sup>29</sup>Jesus answered, The first *and* principal *one of all commands* is: Hear, O Israel, The Lord our God is one Lord;

<sup>30</sup>And you shall love the Lord your God <sup>[a]</sup>out of *and* with your whole heart and out of *and* with all your soul (your <sup>[b]</sup>life) and out of *and* with all your mind (with <sup>[c]</sup>your faculty of thought and your moral understanding) and out of *and* with all your strength. <sup>[d]</sup>*This is the first and principal commandment.*

<sup>31</sup>The second *is like it and* is this, You shall love your neighbor as yourself. There is no other commandment greater than these.

<sup>43</sup>You have heard that it was said, You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy;

<sup>30</sup>I am able to do nothing from Myself [independently, of My own accord—but only as I am taught by God and as I get His orders]. Even as I hear, I judge [I decide as I am bidden to decide. As the voice comes to Me, so I give a decision], and My judgment is right (just, righteous), because I do not seek *or* consult My own will [I have no desire to do what is pleasing to Myself, My own aim, My own purpose] but only the will *and* pleasure of the Father Who sent Me.

John 5:19 Amplified Bible, Classic Edition (AMPC)

<sup>19</sup>So Jesus answered them by saying, I assure you, most solemnly I tell you, the Son is able to do nothing of Himself (of His own accord); but He is able to do only what He sees the Father doing, for whatever the Father does is what the Son does in the same way [in His turn].

John 12:49 Amplified Bible, Classic Edition (AMPC)

<sup>49</sup>This is because I have never spoken on My own authority *or* of My own accord *or* as self-appointed, but the Father Who sent Me has Himself given Me orders [concerning] what to say and what to tell.

John 14:30-31 Amplified Bible, Classic Edition (AMPC)

<sup>30</sup>I will not talk with you much more, for the prince (evil genius, ruler) of the world is coming. And he has no claim on Me. [He has nothing in common with Me; there is nothing in Me that belongs to him, and he has no power over Me.]

<sup>31</sup>But [<sup>[a]</sup>satan is coming and] I do as the Father has commanded Me, so that the world may know (be convinced) that I love the Father and that I do only what the Father has instructed Me to do. [I act in full agreement with His orders.] Rise, let us go away from here.

Luke 23:33-35 The Passion Translation (TPT)

<sup>33</sup>When they came to the place that is known as The Skull, the guards crucified Jesus, nailing him on the center cross between the two criminals. <sup>34</sup>While they were nailing Jesus to the cross, he prayed over and over, "Father, forgive them,<sup>[a]</sup> for they don't know what they're doing."

The soldiers, after they crucified him, gambled over his clothing.<sup>[b]</sup>

<sup>35</sup>A great crowd gathered to watch what was happening. The religious leaders sneered at Jesus and mocked him, saying, "Look at this man! What kind of 'chosen Messiah' is this? He pretended to save others, but he can't even save himself!"

- a. [Luke 23:34](#) The Greek text implies a repetitive action. He did not pray, "forgive me," but "forgive them." As the centurion crushed him to the ground and tied his arms to the crossbeam, Jesus prayed, "Father, forgive them." When the spikes tore through each quivering palm, he prayed again, "Father, forgive them." And when the soldiers parted his garments and gambled for the seamless robe, again Jesus prayed, "Father, forgive them." Only heaven knows how many times that prayer was spoken.
- b. [Luke 23:34](#) Many Greek manuscripts have omitted [v. 34](#).

1 Peter 2:20-25 Amplified Bible, Classic Edition (AMPC)

<sup>20</sup>[After all] what <sup>[a]</sup>kind of glory [is there in it] if, when you do wrong and are punished for it, you take it patiently? But if you bear patiently with suffering

[which results] when you do right *and* that is undeserved, it is acceptable *and* pleasing to God.

<sup>21</sup> For even to this were you called [it is inseparable from your vocation]. For Christ also suffered for you, leaving you [His personal] example, so that you should follow in His footsteps.

<sup>22</sup> He was guilty of no sin, neither was deceit (guile) ever found on His lips.

<sup>23</sup> When He was reviled *and* insulted, He did not revile *or* offer insult in return; [when] He was abused *and* suffered, He made no threats [of vengeance]; but he trusted [Himself and everything] to Him Who judges fairly.

<sup>24</sup> He personally bore our sins in His [own] body on the tree <sup>[b]</sup>[as on an altar and offered Himself on it], that we might die (cease to exist) to sin and live to righteousness. By His wounds you have been healed.

<sup>25</sup> For you were going astray like [so many] sheep, but now you have come back to the Shepherd and Guardian (<sup>[c]</sup>the Bishop) of your souls.

1 John 4:7-19 King James Version (KJV)

<sup>7</sup> Beloved, let us love one another: for love is of God; and every one that loveth is born of God, and knoweth God.

<sup>8</sup> He that loveth not knoweth not God; for God is love.

<sup>9</sup> In this was manifested the love of God toward us, because that God sent his only begotten Son into the world, that we might live through him.

<sup>10</sup> Herein is love, not that we loved God, but that he loved us, and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins.

<sup>11</sup> Beloved, if God so loved us, we ought also to love one another.

<sup>12</sup> No man hath seen God at any time. If we love one another, God dwelleth in us, and his love is perfected in us.

<sup>15</sup>Whosoever shall confess that Jesus is the Son of God, God dwelleth in him, and he in God.

<sup>16</sup>And we have known and believed the love that God hath to us. God is love; and he that dwelleth in love dwelleth in God, and God in him.

<sup>17</sup>Herein is our love made perfect, that we may have boldness in the day of judgment: because as he is, so are we in this world.

<sup>18</sup>There is no fear in love; but perfect love casteth out fear: because fear hath torment. He that feareth is not made perfect in love.

<sup>19</sup>We love him, because he first loved us.

**Peace** H7965 – safe, i.e. well, happy, friendly, welfare, health, prosperity, peace, favor, perfect such as to be at peace, rest, safety, salute [acknowledged], well, x wholly, from 7999

John 14:1, 27 Amplified Bible, Classic Edition (AMPC)

Do not let your hearts be troubled (distressed, agitated). You believe in *and* adhere to *and* trust in *and* rely on God; believe in *and* adhere to *and* trust in *and* rely also on Me.

<sup>27</sup>Peace I leave with you; My [own] peace I now give *and* bequeath to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid. [Stop allowing yourselves to be agitated and disturbed; and do not permit yourselves to be fearful and intimidated and cowardly and unsettled.]

<sup>33</sup>I have told you these things, so that in Me you may have [perfect] peace *and* confidence. In the world you have

tribulation *and* trials *and* distress *and* frustration; but be of good cheer [take courage; be confident, certain, undaunted]! For I have overcome the world. [I have deprived it of power to harm you and have conquered it for you.]

1 Peter 3:4-6 Amplified Bible, Classic Edition (AMPC)

<sup>4</sup>But let it be the inward adorning *and* beauty of the hidden person of the heart, with the incorruptible *and* unfading charm of a gentle and peaceful spirit, which [is not anxious or wrought up, but] is very precious in the sight of God.

<sup>5</sup>For it was thus that the pious women of old who hoped in God were [accustomed] to beautify themselves and were submissive to their husbands [adapting themselves to them as themselves secondary and dependent upon them].

<sup>6</sup>It was thus that Sarah obeyed Abraham [following his guidance and acknowledging his headship over her by] calling him lord (master, leader, authority). And you are now her true daughters if you do right and let nothing terrify you [not giving way to hysterical fears or letting anxieties unnerve you].

<sup>33</sup>“Finally, another man, a Samaritan,<sup>[a]</sup> came upon the bleeding man and was moved with tender compassion for him. <sup>34</sup>He stooped down and gave him first aid, pouring olive oil on his wounds, disinfecting them with wine, and bandaging them to stop the bleeding. Lifting him up, he placed him on his own donkey and brought him to an inn. Then he took him from his donkey and carried him to a room for the night. <sup>35</sup>The next morning he took his own money from his wallet and gave it to the innkeeper with these words: ‘Take care of him until I come back from my journey. If it costs more than this, I will repay you when I return.’<sup>[b]</sup>

### Footnotes:

- a. [Luke 10:33](#) There was racial tension in those days between Jews and Samaritans. The Samaritans were considered to be a mixed race by the religious Jews. A Samaritan would be the most unlikely person to stop and help a Jewish man. The word *Samaritan* does not refer to people who lived in a geographical place, but is the Hebrew-Aramaic word *Samarim*, which means “keeper of the law.”
- b. [Luke 10:35](#) Jesus is the Good Samaritan. He stoops down to touch us, heal us, lift us up, carry us on our journey, and pay our debts, and he promises to return and reward those who do his will.
