

The Tsunami Blessing Inside and Out, Part 140 Scriptures

Follow the Lord of the Breakthrough. Live through Jesus, your Conqueror and you will never lose the battle He has already won for you. Fighting from the place of triumph, you will embrace who God remade you to be, more than a conqueror through Him who loved you. Rest in the same love God rests in. Never concede. Never retreat. Never forfeit. Never be too exhausted to resist. Remain resistless in battle. Follow the force of favor!

The Word of God resonates that we possess the land by the Lord's sword, not our sword. Whet your sword with the bathing of the *logos* Word and the baptism of the *rhema* Word until your command matches our Commander-in-Chief's sword. Lean into Holy Spirit so you can: see what Jesus sees; say what He says; and see what He said. As you memorialize the finished work of Christ say, "The Lord has broken upon my enemies by my hand, like the breaking forth of waters." That is the Tsunami Blessing, Inside and Out!

The kingdom of God operates on an exchange system. Exchange your old life for the new life that is in Christ Jesus. Exchange any bondage for Jesus has made you free indeed. Exchange setting your affection on earthly things that will pass away for the treasures of heaven that can never be extinguished. Exchange your natural strength for the miraculous power of God. Then you will always know for yourself that you have an unfair advantage as His co-partner with God, advancing "as one." Can you hear your battle cry? Exchange yoke Yoke for the Yoke of Jesus

Luke 4:18-21 The Voice (VOICE)

¹⁸The Spirit of the Lord the Eternal One is on Me.

Why? Because the Eternal designated Me

to be His representative to the poor, to preach good news to them.

Luke's audience doesn't divide the world into sacred vs. secular or religious vs. political. For them, life is integrated. And for them, these "religious" words from Isaiah have a powerful and "political" meaning: because they see themselves as oppressed by the Roman occupation, Jesus' words

suggest that His “good news” describes a powerful change about to come—a change that will rescue the people from their oppression. His fellow Jews have long been waiting for a savior to free them from Roman oppression. Jesus tells them their hopes are about to be fulfilled. But then, just as people speak well of Jesus, He lets them know their expectations aren’t in line with God’s plans. He tells them not to expect God to fit into their boxes and suggests the unthinkable: that God cares for the Gentiles, the very people who are oppressing them! They aren’t too pleased by this.

He sent Me to tell those who are held captive that they can now be set free, and to tell the blind that they can now see.

He sent Me to liberate those held down by oppression.

¹⁹*In short, the Spirit is upon Me* to proclaim that now is the time; this is the jubilee season of the Eternal One’s grace.^[a]

²⁰Jesus rolled up the scroll and returned it to the synagogue attendant. Then He sat down, *as a teacher would do*, and all in the synagogue focused their attention on Jesus, *waiting for Him to speak*. ²¹He told them that these words from the Hebrew Scriptures were being fulfilled then and there, in their hearing.

³When the Lord has given you rest from your sorrow *and* pain and from your trouble *and* unrest and from the hard service with which you were made to serve,

⁴You shall take up this [taunting] parable against the king of Babylon and say, How the oppressor has stilled [the restless insolence]! The golden *and* exacting city has ceased!

⁵The Lord has broken the staff of the wicked, the scepter of the [tyrant] rulers,

Put on God's complete armour so that you can successfully resist all the devil's methods of attack. For our fight is not against any physical enemy: it is against organisations and powers that are spiritual. We are up against the unseen power that controls this dark world, and spiritual agents from the very headquarters of evil. Therefore you must wear the whole armour of God that you may be able to resist evil in its day of power, and that even when you have fought to a standstill you may still stand your ground. Take your stand then with truth as your belt, righteousness your breastplate, the Gospel of peace firmly on your feet,

salvation as your helmet and in your hand the sword of the Spirit, the Word of God. Above all be sure you take faith as your shield, for it can quench every burning missile the enemy hurls at you. Pray at all times with every kind of spiritual prayer, keeping alert and persistent as you pray for all Christ's men and women.

¹⁵He shall call upon Me, and I will answer him; I will be with him in trouble, I will deliver him and honor him.

¹⁶With long life will I satisfy him and show him My salvation.

The broken yoke preserves you breachproof as decreed in Isaiah 9:4. The word, "broken" in Hebrew is *châthath*. Strong's Concordance defines broken as: "to prostrate, hence to break down; literally, by violence." Now you can see destruction has come to a perpetual end that can never begin again. Jesus has broken the yoke of your burden and the staff of your shoulder. Jesus has already freed you to enjoy breachproof living in Him alone.

Isaiah 10:27 King James Version (KJV)

²⁷ And it shall come to pass in that day, that his burden shall be taken away from off thy shoulder, and his yoke from off thy neck, and the yoke shall be destroyed because of the anointing.

Moreover, the destroyed yoke gives you breakthrough as decreed in Isaiah 10:27. The word, "destroyed" in Hebrew is *châbal*. Strong's Concordance records the meaning as: "to wind tightly (as a rope); i.e., to bind; figuratively, relates to parturition, writhing in pain as in bringing forth or being delivered of young."

The anointing bound that debilitating yoke from interrupting the full-term delivery of God's babies in the earth. For satan, the pain felt from God's judgment against him is a constant reminder he still is nothing more than a defeated foe. Your release is an outright attack against satan's onslaught; the chains the enemy bound you with are now the chains that bind him.

On the other hand, the anointing of God causes your offspring to freely slip through the birth canal right out past that formerly confining yoke. It lost its power to intercept both accumulated and accelerated births. God anointed Jesus with the Holy Spirit and power. He healed everyone that satan exercised dominion against. Jesus has already freed you to enjoy the breakthrough living in Him alone.

Exchange the peace the world gives for God's peace

Isaiah 9:6-7 King James Version (KJV)

⁶For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace.

⁷Of the increase of his government and peace there shall be no end, upon the throne of David, and upon his kingdom, to order it, and to establish it with judgment and with justice from henceforth even for ever. The zeal of the LORD of hosts will perform this.
