Is there not a King in your midst? Yes, Jesus Christ, the King of Glory! Eminent domain holds absolute dominion that never needs permission. Refuse to allow the glory of God to fade in your life. You represent Jesus Christ, the Lion of Judah. Be wise as a serpent and harmless as a dove since you already inherited His ministry on earth. When you highlight Jesus as King of kings and Lord of lords, this truth that you trust will be broadcasted, "These that have turned the world upside down are come hither also," Acts 17:6, KJV.

By name, the Holy Bible gives us a word picture of the throne of glory and the throne of grace. Jesus Christ perfectly set the distinct roles and diverse responsibilities in motion supernaturally. Serving as King-High Priest, Jesus extended the kingdom of God over every sphere of influence, bringing heaven to earth. His finished work was joined to the riches of God's glory and to the riches of God's grace. As an integral part of Jesus' succession plan, you hold the joint commission as king-priest to appropriate by reigning as well as to advocate by representing so the world system will be generated into the kingdom of God.

God commissions all His ambassadors within the kingdom of God. He appoints and anoints everyone with a dual assignment and agenda. Then each one makes his/her calling and election sure. The duration for fulfillment could be accomplished in just one moment in time or over the course of an entire lifespan. Footnotes:

- a. [Hebrews 2:10](#) The Greek word *prepo* means “to stand out and tower above.”

- b. [Hebrews 2:10](#) Or “trailblazer” or “forerunner.” His perfection through sufferings implies that all his sons will come to glorious perfection through hardships. The Aramaic can be translated “the Prince of Life.”
- c. [Hebrews 2:10](#) Or “bring many children into his glorious state.” Grace gives us the glory that Jesus has. Although it is true that God will not share his glory with another ([Isa. 42:8](#)), but in Christ, we are not “another,” we are one with him. See also [John 17:22](#); [Rom. 8:29-30](#).
