Footnotes:

- a. **6:11** Or “Give us bread [or life] today for the coming day.” Bread becomes a metaphor of our needs (physically, spiritually, and emotionally). Jesus is teaching us to acknowledge Father God as our Provider of all we need each day. Both the Greek and Hebrew Matthew can be translated “Give us this day our bread for tomorrow” (or “our continual bread”).

a. **37:4** The word *delight* means "to be soft or tender."

b. **37:5** The Hebrew word used here can be translated "commit," which means "to roll over your burdens on the Lord."

¹¹⁻¹⁶Make sure you don't forget GOD, your God, by not keeping his commandments, his rules and regulations that I command you today. Make

sure that when you eat and are satisfied, build pleasant houses and settle in, see your herds and flocks flourish and more and more money come in, watch your standard of living going up and up—make sure you don't become so full of yourself and your things that you forget GOD, your God,

the God who delivered you from Egyptian slavery;

the God who led you through that huge and fearsome wilderness, those desolate, arid badlands crawling with fiery snakes and scorpions;

the God who gave you water gushing from hard rock;

the God who gave you manna to eat in the wilderness, something your ancestors had never heard of, in order to give you a taste of the hard life, to test you so that you would be prepared to live well in the days ahead of you.

¹⁷⁻¹⁸ If you start thinking to yourselves, "I did all this. And all by myself. I'm rich. It's all mine!"—well, think again. Remember that GOD, your God, gave you the strength to produce all this wealth so as to confirm the covenant that he promised to your ancestors—as it is today.

¹⁹⁻²⁰ If you forget, forget GOD, your God, and start taking up with other gods, serving and worshiping them, I'm on record right now as giving you firm warning: that will be the end of you; I mean it—destruction. You'll go to your doom—the same as the nations GOD is destroying before you; doom because you wouldn't obey the Voice of GOD, your God.

⁴⁹⁻⁵⁶ Remember what you said to me, your servant—

I hang on to these words for dear life!

⁵⁷⁻⁶⁴ Because you have satisfied me, GOD, I promise
to do everything you say.
I beg you from the bottom of my heart: smile,
be gracious to me just as you promised.
When I took a long, careful look at your ways,
I got my feet back on the trail you blazed.
I was up at once, didn't drag my feet,
was quick to follow your orders.
The wicked hemmed me in—there was no way out—
but not for a minute did I forget your plan for me.

Heaven on earth is reproduced when the Word of God and the Spirit of God are your daily main course.

Let the following message awaken your appetite as the habitat for the Kingdom of God. United, the Spirit of God and the Word of God are your only source, supply, and surplus. Meditate on the following bible verses as food for thought. Let them fill and fuel your heart and flow out of your mouth as, "I never will crave again. I will not lack the capacity to receive from Abba Father, Jesus Christ, and Holy Spirit.

1) "The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want," Psalm 23:1. Jesus Christ is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. Holy Spirit will guide you into all truth as you follow His leading.

2) "Set your affection on things above, not on things on the earth," Colossians 3:2 (KJV). Everything in the earth will pass away, but everything in heaven is forever. Focus your attention more on what the Lord has designed for you to bring heaven to earth.

3) "But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and His righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you," Matthew 6:33 (KJV). The kingdom of God resides within you and Jesus Christ is enthroned in your heart as King of kings and Lord of lords.

4) "Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness: for they shall be filled," Matthew 5:6 (KJV). Only satisfaction is within the kingdom of God. Although the world may crave to be satisfied, it only resides in Christ alone and no place else.

5) "O taste and see that the LORD is good: blessed is the man that trusteth in Him," Psalm 34:8 (KJV). Your quality and quantity of time with Jesus reveals your intimacy. Holy Spirit mirrors what Jesus models when you are in His presence. Then you model what has been mirrored to you, the glory of God.

6) "As newborn babes, desire the sincere milk of the word, that ye may grow thereby: If so be ye have tasted that the Lord is gracious," 1 Peter 2:2-3 (KJV). You have seen babies eat. They gulp down their milk. When they start eating baby food, they never seem to come up for any air. They train

their parents to accommodate their insatiable rhythm for consumption. Something within them says, "I am in my growing season. I have no plans to be one minute behind in sinking my teeth into all the meat I have been smelling."

7) "For when for the time ye ought to be teachers, ye have need that one teach you again which be the first principles of the oracles of God; and are become such as have need of milk, and not of strong meat. For every one that useth milk is unskillful in the word of righteousness: for he is a babe. But strong meat belongeth to them that are of full age, even those who by reason of use have their senses exercised to discern both good and evil," Hebrews 5:12-14 (KJV). At times, we must challenge what we have been using as our source of food to ensure we are expecting God's best, not just experiencing what may come along. Sometimes it can be what worked for us that we stopped doing.

8) In John 4:14, (KJV) Jesus Christ introduced Himself to the woman at the well as her Source and Supply through Holy Spirit. This is what He said to her about the onset of the new birth experience, "But whosoever drinketh of the water that I shall give him shall never thirst; but the water that I shall give him shall be in him a well of water springing up into everlasting life."

9) Then in John 7:38, Jesus Christ introduced Himself as their Surplus through Holy Spirit. This is what He said regarding the overflow of the baptism of the Holy Spirit. "He that believeth on Me, as the scripture hath said, out of his belly shall flow rivers of living water."

10) "Wherefore He is able also to save them to the uttermost that come unto God by Him, seeing He ever liveth to make intercession for them,"

Hebrews 7:25 (KJV). When we approach Jesus, His desire is to save us to the highest point possible. That is the place where nothing else needs to be saved.

11) "He shall see of the travail of His soul, and shall be satisfied: by His knowledge shall My righteous servant justify many; for He shall bear their iniquities," Isaiah 53:11 (KJV). Jesus sees everything He finished on Calvary as completely satisfied. The question remains, Will we live through Jesus so we too can embrace, expect, experience, and enjoy His satisfaction?

12) "He delivers the afflicted by their afflictions, He reveals Himself to them by their suffering. And surely, He drew you from the mouth of distress, to a wide place, unrestricted, and to the comfort of your table filled with rich food," Job 36:15-16 (NET Bible). Jesus prepared His table for you in the presence of your enemies. Celebrate all the time, before, during, and after any trouble. The triumph of your faith trumps any trial of your faith.
