God destined you to be adopted into His family. In fact, you were chosen from the foundation of the world. Jesus Christ redeemed you with His own blood, reconciling you to God. You are an offspring of Jesus, a member of His body, His flesh, and His bones. In purchasing you back, you could have been a slave or just another servant. However, that never entered into the mind of Christ. You are a son of God. That is non-gender specific. Do not stop there because God surnamed you as His heir. Nevertheless, do not stop there either, since God put His own name on you as a joint heir with Jesus Christ. Highly favored as a joint heir, you have the rights of the first-born as well as the double portion. Holy Spirit even helps you to feel comfortable calling God, Abba Father, i.e., Daddy, Daddy.

Visit the sons of God throughout the scriptures: Adam, the first man was created as a living soul from the earth. Jesus Christ became a life-giving spirit from heaven. And yes when you are born again, you too are recognized as a son of God. Your name is already registered as a heaven-born recreation in the earth. That is the only place where you receive ultimate security, the sense of belonging, sufficiency, significance, and satisfaction from God Himself.

As an heir of the world, now own it and occupy it. Let the testimony from Acts 17:6 inspire you: "The ones who turned the world upside down have come here too." That is really right side up. In the kingdom of God, that is a revolution! That is what happens when you live through Jesus Christ and live surrendered to the Spirit of God and the Word of God. That's regeneration! You are in the world, not but of the world. Begin to see Jesus as He really is. That is how you will be as Jesus is in this world. As your "seeing" transforms into "being," you will renounce the old life that is of the world's system: the lusts of the flesh; the lusts of the eyes; and the pride of life. That's the life of God! Abundant life! Resurrection life! Eternal life!

Reconciliation: The Son Born from Heaven

Footnotes:

- a. 20:22 The Greek word used here does not appear elsewhere in the New Testament; however, it is the same word found in the Septuagint for when God "breathed" into Adam's nostrils the breath of life (Gen. 2:7). The beginning of new creation life came from the breath of Jesus. The mighty wind of Acts 2 was for power, the breath Jesus breathed into his disciples in this verse was for life.
- b. 20:22 Or "accept the Sacred Breath."
