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GOD'S ETERNAL COVENANT GIVES YOU HOPE IN HIS VOWED PROMISES

Branded as a Living Hope: “Praise the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. According to His great mercy, He has given us a New Birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead and into an inheritance that is imperishable, uncorrupted, and unfading, kept in heaven for you. You are being protected by God’s power through faith for a salvation that is ready to be revealed in the last time,” 1 Peter 1:3-5 (HCSB). **Christ’s seed are all Heirs of the Promise:** “For the promise that he should be the heir of the world came not to Abraham or to his seed through the law, but through the righteousness of faith. For if those who are of the law be heirs, faith is made void and the promise made of no effect, because the law worketh wrath; for where there is no law, there is no transgression. Therefore it is of faith, that it might be given by grace to the end that the promise might be made sure to all the seed, not to that only which is of the law, but to that also which is of the faith of Abraham, who is the father of us all (as it is written: ‘I have made thee a father of many nations’), in the presence of Him whom he believed, even God, who quickeneth the dead and calleth those things which are not, as though they were. Abraham, against all hope, believed in hope, that he might become the father of many nations, according to that which had been spoken, ‘So shall thy seed be.’ And being not weak in faith, he considered not his own body now dead, when he was about a hundred years old, nor yet the deadness of Sarah’s womb,” Romans 4:13-19, (KJ21). **Reality of your Hope:** “But even if we are speaking in this way, dear friends, we are convinced of better *things* concerning you, and belonging to salvation. For God *is* not unjust, *so as* to forget your work and the love which you demonstrated for His name *by* having served the saints, and continuing to serve *them*. And we desire each one of you to demonstrate the same diligence for the full assurance of *your* hope until the end, in order that you may not be sluggish, but imitators of those who inherit the promises through faith and patience. **Reliability of God’s Vowed Promises:** “For *when* God made a promise to Abraham, since He had no one greater to swear by, He swore by Himself, saying, ‘Surely *I* will greatly bless you, and *I* will greatly multiply you.’ And so, *by* persevering, he obtained the promise. For people swear by what is greater *than themselves*, and the oath for confirmation *is the* end of all dispute for them. In the same way God, *because He* wanted to show even more to the heirs of the promise the unchangeableness of His resolve, guaranteed *it* with an oath, in order that through two unchangeable things, in which *it is* impossible for God to lie, we who have taken refuge may have powerful encouragement to hold fast to the hope set before *us*, which we have like an anchor of the soul, both firm and steadfast, and entering into the inside of the curtain, where Jesus, the forerunner for us, entered, *because He* became a High Priest *forever* according to the order of Melchizedek,” Heb. 6:9-20, (LEB). Jesus settled every vowed promise forevermore.

YOUR FUELING STATION FOR KEEPING HOPE ALIVE FOR YOUR FUTURE

“Since we have been *acquitted and* made right through faith, we are able to experience *true and lasting* peace with God through our Lord Jesus, the Anointed One, *the Liberating King*. Jesus leads us into a place of *radical* grace where we are able to celebrate the hope of experiencing God’s glory. And that’s not all. We also celebrate in seasons of suffering because we know that when we suffer we develop endurance, which shapes our characters. When our characters are refined, we learn what it means to hope *and anticipate* God’s goodness. And hope will never fail to satisfy our deepest need because the Holy Spirit that was given to us has flooded our hearts with God’s love,” Romans 5:1-5, (Voice). This footnote is from the preceding scripture text. “In God’s plan to restore a fallen and disfigured world, Abraham became the father of all of us, the agent of blessing to everyone. Jesus completes what God started centuries before when He established Abraham’s covenant family. Those who put faith in Jesus and call Him “Lord” become part of Abraham’s faith family. Because God is gracious, loving, and merciful, men and women from every corner of the earth are not only declared right, but ultimately are made right as well. It happens through God’s actions—not our efforts—in the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus who was crucified for our misdeeds and raised to repair what has been wrong all along. So the promises of God made long years ago are being realized in men and women who hear the call of faith and answer ‘yes’ to it.” “Yes” to God brands you justified; in Greek, *dikaiōō* means innocent. That is never guilty nor even not guilty. Repentance before God views you as if you have never done any wrong throughout your entire lifetime. Eternally hope in God’s mercy.

Thought for Transformation

*“Now the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, that ye may abound in hope, through the power of the Holy Ghost,” Rom. 15: 13, (KJV). The word “fill” in Greek means “to make full, to complete.” No dismay, delay, or decay can ever thrive in the glory realm. “Fear thou not; for I am with thee: be not dismayed; for I am thy God: I will strengthen thee; yea, I will help thee; yea, I will uphold thee with the right hand of My righteousness,” Is. 41:10, (KJV). “Delayed hope makes one sick at heart, but a fulfilled longing is a tree of life,” Prov. 13: 12 (GW). “that it too would be set free from its bondage to decay and would enjoy the freedom accompanying the glory that God’s children will have,” Rom. 8: 21, (CJB). If you lost hope or if it even lacks, seek Holy Spirit so He can recover or rescue your faith with vowed promises that never return void to God. The Greek word “abound” is *perisseuō*. Its root is from “*perí*,” meaning, “all-around which indicates abundance or surplus) – properly, exceed, go beyond the expected measure, i.e. above and beyond (more than ...); What goes further (more) surpasses,” J. Thayer.*
