

The Tsunami Blessing Inside and Out, Part 255 Scriptures

This is Section T of a multi-part instruction. Similar to a nation sending an ambassador into a territory, Jesus commanded the body of Christ to go into all the world. Although your kingdom of God assignment is in the world system, it is not in you. Jesus Christ is! You are His anointed carrier of the presence of God as well as the power of God. Your appointment is to bring the world into the kingdom of God until it is proof positive that, "those who have turned the world upside down are come here too!" Really, upside down is right side up!

Jesus' succession plan names you as His change agent to serve His divine purpose, plan, and path in one or even all the Seven Mountains: 1) government; 2) business; 3) media; 4) education; 5) arts & entertainment; 6) religion; and 7) family. Every Kingdom of God assignment is established on the Word of God as well as executed by the Spirit of God. If it is not, the mission will be an obstruction against your own breakthrough. Your minimum contribution is by prayer and petition, i.e., to intercede. Your maximum contribution is by practice and participation in the sphere(s) of influence God has chosen for you, i.e., to intervene.

Never give your seat of authority to an already failed world system. Let Holy Spirit reposition you to always "see" Jesus as He really is, the King of kings. Then grant the Lord of lords all the living room He requires, without issuing any eviction clauses. As your space restrictions are demolished, you can "be" as Jesus is in the world, a world overcomer. In other words, you are living on top of the world; it is not living on top of you.

The peace of God must exist within you before it can be seen around you

Daniel 10:19, King James Version

19 And said, O man greatly beloved, fear not: peace be unto thee, be strong, yea, be strong. And when he had spoken unto me, I was strengthened, and said, Let my lord speak; for thou hast strengthened me.

Daniel 11:32, King James Version

32 And such as do wickedly against the covenant shall he corrupt by flatteries: but the people that do know their God shall be strong, and do exploits.

Psalm 101, (AMPC)

A Psalm of David.

1 I will sing of mercy *and* loving-kindness and justice; to You, O Lord, will I sing.

2 I will behave myself wisely *and* give heed to the blameless way—O when will You come to me? I will walk within my house in integrity *and* with a blameless heart.

- ² That Your way may be known upon earth, Your saving power (Your deliverances and Your salvation) among all nations.
- ³ Let the peoples praise You [turn away from their idols] *and* give thanks to You, O God; let all the peoples praise *and* give thanks to You.

The power of peace you have is determined by what you govern, guard, and defended by a garrison

Daily pray for peace for all branches of government as well as those you have authority over you, so you will live in peace

1 Timothy 2:1-6, (KJV)

¹ I exhort therefore, that, first of all, supplications [entreathy, petition, felt need because of a sense of lack], prayers [prayer addressing God], intercessions [intervention by God], and giving of thanks, be made for all men;

² For kings, and for all that are in authority; that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty.

³ For this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Saviour;

⁴ Who will have all men to be saved, and to come unto the knowledge of the truth.

⁵ For there is one God, and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus;

⁶ Who gave himself a ransom for all, to be testified in due time.

Jeremiah 29:1-8, Living Bible

1-2 After Jeconiah the king, the queen mother, the court officials, the tribal officers, and craftsmen had been deported to Babylon by Nebuchadnezzar, Jeremiah wrote them a letter from Jerusalem, addressing it to the Jewish elders, priests, prophets, and to all the people. **3** He sent the letter with Elasar (son of Shaphan) and Gemariah (son of Hilkiah) when they went to Babylon as King Zedekiah's ambassadors to Nebuchadnezzar. And this is what the letter said:

4 The Lord Almighty, the God of Israel, sends this message to all the captives he has exiled to Babylon from Jerusalem:

5 Build homes and plan to stay; plant vineyards, for you will be there many years. **6** Marry and have children, and then find mates for them and have many grandchildren. Multiply! Don't dwindle away! **7** And work for the peace and prosperity of Babylon. Pray for her, for if Babylon has peace, so will you.

8 The Lord Almighty, the God of Israel, says: Don't let the false prophets and mediums who are there among you fool you. Don't listen to the dreams that they invent,

9 for they prophesy lies in my name. I have not sent them, says the Lord.

Jeremiah 29:7, King James Version

7 And seek the peace of the city whither I have caused you to be carried away captives, and pray unto the LORD for it: for in the peace thereof shall ye have peace.

Only authentic peace is conceived from God as well as only artificial peace is concocted by satan. Be quick to acknowledge and repent of any compromise against your covenant of peace with God

Isaiah 33:1-8, 1599 Geneva Bible

God renders judgement against the destroyer as well as the traitor.

33 1 The destruction of them by whom God hath punished his Church.

1 Woe to thee that ^[a]spoilest, and wast not spoiled: and doest wickedly, and they did not wickedly against thee: when thou shalt ^[b]cease to spoil, thou shalt be spoiled: when thou shalt make an end of doing wickedly, ^[c]they shall do wickedly against thee.

Intercession to God

2 ^[d]O Lord, have mercy upon us, we have waited for thee: be thou, *which wast* ^[e]their arm in the morning, our help also in time of trouble.

3 At the noise of the tumult, the ^[f]people fled: at thine ^[g]exalting the nations were scattered.

4 And your spoil shall be gathered *like* the gathering of ^[h]caterpillars: and ^[i]he shall go against him like the leaping of grasshoppers.

Isaiah prophesies

5 The Lord is exalted: for he dwelleth on high: he hath filled Zion with judgment and justice.

6 And there shall be stability of ^[i]the times, strength, salvation, wisdom, and knowledge: *for* the fear of the Lord shall be his treasure.

They thought they could achieve peace

7 Behold, ^[k]their messengers shall cry without, and the ^[l]ambassadors of peace shall weep bitterly.

8 The ^[m]paths are waste: the wayfaring man ceaseth: he hath broken the covenant: he hath contemned the cities: he regardeth no man.

9 The earth mourneth and fainteth: Lebanon is ashamed, and hewn down: ^[a]Sharon is like a wilderness, and Bashan is shaken and Carmel.

10 Now will I ^[b]arise, saith the Lord: now will I be exalted, now will I lift up myself.

11 ^[c]Ye shall conceive chaff, *and* bring forth stubble: the fire of your breath shall devour you.

12 And the people shall be as the burning of lime: *and as* the thorns cut up, shall they be burnt in the fire.

- a. Isaiah 33:1 Meaning, the enemies of the Church, as were the Chaldeans and Assyrians, but chiefly of Sennacherib, but not only.
- b. Isaiah 33:1 When thine appointed time shall come that God shall take away thy power: and that which thou hast wrongfully gotten, shall be given to others, as Amos 5:11.
- c. Isaiah 33:1 The Chaldeans shall do like to the Assyrians, as the Assyrians did to Israel, and the Medes and Persians shall do the same to the Chaldeans.
- d. Isaiah 33:2 He declareth hereby what is the chief refuge of the faithful, when troubles come, to pray, and seek help of God.
- e. Isaiah 33:2 Which helped our fathers so soon as they called upon thee.

¹ Woe to you, Assyrians,^[a] who have destroyed everything around you but have never felt destruction for yourselves. You expect others to respect their promises to you, while you betray them! Now you, too, will be betrayed and destroyed.

² But to us, O Lord, be merciful, for we have waited for you. Be our strength each day and our salvation in the time of trouble. ³ The enemy runs at the sound of your voice. When you stand up, the nations flee. ⁴ Just as locusts strip the fields and vines, so Jerusalem will strip the fallen army of Assyria!^[b]

⁵ The Lord is very great and lives in heaven. He will make Jerusalem the home of justice and goodness and righteousness. ⁶ An abundance of salvation is stored up for Judah in a safe place, along with wisdom and knowledge and reverence for God.

2 Kings 18:14-17, Living Bible

14 King Hezekiah sued for peace and sent this message to the king of Assyria at Lachish: "I have done wrong. I will pay whatever tribute you demand if you will only go away." The king of Assyria then demanded a settlement of \$1,500,000. **15** To gather this amount, King Hezekiah used all the silver stored in the Temple and in the palace treasury. **16** He even stripped off the gold from the Temple doors, and from the doorposts he had overlaid with gold, and gave it all to the Assyrian king.

17 Nevertheless the king of Assyria sent his field marshal, his chief treasurer, and his chief of staff from Lachish with a great army; and they camped along the highway beside the field where cloth was bleached, near the conduit of the upper pool.

I will give you an eye-witness account of a memorial of how the peace of God reproduced a healing

The following account is the breachproof breakthrough my Mom received when the word *tāmam* was voice activated. She received complete freedom from chronic bleeding that first appeared to be never-ending. But Jesus Christ healed Mom and she never bled from the bladder area again.

When Mom began to bleed, one hospital system irrigated her while the other one gave her blood transfusions. I mentioned to someone who had working knowledge in the medical field that the doctors kept trying to show me an image of Mom's bladder and that I did not have any desire to see it in a dysfunctional state.

Out of courtesy, I would always act as if I was looking at the image, but I never captured it in my mind. That party told me to look on the internet for a picture of a healthy bladder so I would know what one looked like.

After that, I was impressed to look up healing bladder cancer on the internet. I came across a YouTube video that showed a bladder cancer healing within three minutes. Although an ultrasound showed a scalable difference visibly, not having any working knowledge of

medicine or medical equipment, I was unable to understand what really occurred. They were also chanting one phrase in a foreign language, which sounded much like an Asian dialect.

Afterward, I entreated the Lord to give me the right word that would ignite healing for my Mom. It was *tâmam*. As my Mom sat at the dining room table quietly praying, I sang one of my originals *Shalom*. I would also intermittently decree *tâmam* instead of the song lyrics. We remained in that posture for approximately an hour offering worship and praise to the Lord.

That glorious time culminated with a vision of Jesus in white apparel walking toward me carrying a new red bladder in both hands. I believe the bladder was red to image what I had previously seen on the internet. Initially, it appeared as an entourage of angels that followed Him since I saw a collection of moving white wings that formed an upside down triangle around His feet.

Although we did not check the bleeding until a couple hours later, I believe Mom was healed instantly. The blood stopped flowing. From that day forward until Mom departed for heaven, she never bled again. Thank you Jesus! Because of my role in her personal care, my testimony is absolutely unquestionable. I solemnly confirm that from the afternoon of August 24, 2017 to the morning of December 5, 2017 my Mom never bled anymore from the bladder area.

I now believe the white wings in the vision represent Malachi 4:1-3 which indicates that even the fringe of Jesus' *tallit* had healing in them. Not just the Old Testament reference for divine healing, but also Luke 8:43-48, Matthew 9:20-22, and Mark 5:25-34 in the New Testament.

Those three scriptures recount the woman who had an issue of blood for twelve years was immediately healed after she touched the hem of Jesus' garments. The flow of blood from her wound stopped when she literally drew the *dunamis* power out of Jesus. In the end, she was supernaturally cured because of her faith in Jesus, the Great Physician, our Healer.
