

## **The Tsunami Blessing Inside and Out, Part 263 Scriptures**

**This is Section AB of a multi-part instruction. Similar to a nation sending an ambassador into a territory, Jesus commanded the body of Christ to go into all the world. Although your kingdom of God assignment is in the world system, it is not in you. Jesus Christ is! You are His anointed carrier of the presence of God as well as the power of God. Your appointment is to bring the world into the kingdom of God until it is proof positive that, "those who have turned the world upside down are come here too!" Really, upside down is right side up!**

**Jesus' succession plan names you as His change agent to serve His divine purpose, plan, and path in one or even all the Seven Mountains: 1) government; 2) business; 3) media; 4) education; 5) arts & entertainment; 6) religion; and 7) family. Every Kingdom of God assignment is established on the Word of God as well as executed by the Spirit of God. If it is not, the mission will be an obstruction against your own breakthrough. Your minimum contribution is by prayer and petition, i.e., to intercede. Your maximum contribution is by practice and participation in the sphere(s) of influence God has chosen for you, i.e., to intervene.**

**Never give your seat of authority to an already failed world system. Let Holy Spirit reposition you to always "see" Jesus as He really is, the King of kings. Then grant the Lord of lords all the living room He requires, without issuing any eviction clauses. As your space restrictions are demolished, you can "be" as Jesus is in the world, a world overcomer. In other words, you are living on top of the world; it is not living on top of you.**

**Here's scriptural proof of God, Jesus, and Holy Spirit known as Elohim, in Hebrew as well as the Godhead in Greek as One, the Trinity i.e., always dynamically, never divisively. 1 John 1:5, AMPC confirms "So there are three witnesses <sup>[a]</sup>in heaven: the Father, the Word and the Holy Spirit, and these three are One;"**

Matthew 26:36-38, The Voice

**It is indeed a dark, bitter night. The disciples are sad and confused, and maybe a little bit prideful. Peter can not believe that he could ever betray his Lord.**

[<sup>43</sup> Then a messenger from heaven appeared to strengthen Him. <sup>44</sup> And in His anguish, He prayed even more intensely, and His sweat was like drops of blood falling to the ground.][<sup>a</sup>]

#### 2nd-Jesus' Face

Isaiah 50:6, The Voice

<sup>6</sup> *But it's been hard.* I offered My back to those who whipped me,  
my cheeks to those who pulled out my beard;  
I did not turn away from humiliation and spitting.

#### 3rd-Jesus' Head

Matthew 27:29-30, The Voice

<sup>29</sup> They gathered some thorny vines, wove them into a crown, and perched that crown upon His head. They stuck a reed in His right hand, and then they knelt before Him, *this inside-out, upside-down King*. They mocked Him *with catcalls*.

**Here's scriptural proof how Jesus' perfect sacrifice made you His ambassador to host the Spirit of God and the Word of God. As a human, you were created as a spirit with a soul in a body. When you are born-again, the supernatural co-habits then inhabits the natural.**

God bless it!'*"

**Here's scriptural proof of Jesus hosting the Wisdom of God. Jesus confirmed you can do the same works that He did plus greater works with Holy Spirit imparting the Wisdom of God.**

Luke 2:39-52, The Voice

<sup>39</sup> After fulfilling their sacred duties according to the law of the Lord, Mary and Joseph returned *with Jesus* to their own city of Nazareth in the province of Galilee. <sup>40</sup> There Jesus grew up, maturing in physical strength and increasing in wisdom, and the grace of God rested on Him.

<sup>41</sup> Every year *during Jesus' childhood*, His parents traveled to Jerusalem for the Passover celebration. <sup>42</sup> When Jesus was 12, He made the journey with them. <sup>43</sup> They spent several days there, participating in the whole celebration. When His parents left for home, Jesus stayed in Jerusalem, but Joseph and Mary were not aware. <sup>44</sup> They assumed Jesus was elsewhere in the caravan *that was traveling together*. After they had already traveled a full day's journey *toward home*, they began searching for Him among their friends and relatives. <sup>45</sup> When no one had seen the boy, Mary and Joseph rushed back to Jerusalem and searched for Him.

<sup>46</sup> After three days of separation, they finally found Him—sitting among a group of religious teachers in the temple—asking them questions, listening to their answers. <sup>47</sup> Everyone was surprised and impressed that a 12-year-old boy could have such deep understanding and could answer questions *with such wisdom*.

<sup>48</sup> His parents, of course, had a different reaction.

**Mary:** Son, why have You treated us this way? Listen, Your father and I have been sick with worry *for the last three days, wondering where You were*, looking everywhere for You.

**Jesus:** <sup>49</sup> Why did you need to look for Me? Didn't you know that I must be working for My Father?

Little is recorded about Jesus' life between His birth and the age of 30. But this one episode tells so much. First, Jesus' family life is a lot like anyone's—full of mishaps and

misunderstandings. Second, as Jesus enters young adulthood, He begins manifesting an extraordinary sense of identity. (Remember, a 12-year-old isn't "just a kid" in Israel—he is becoming a man.) He isn't just "Mary's boy" or "Joseph's stepson." He has a direct relationship with God as His Father, and He knows His life will follow a path of working for God.

<sup>50</sup> Neither Mary nor Joseph really understood what He meant by this. <sup>51</sup> Jesus went back to Nazareth with them and was obedient to them. His mother continued to store these memories like treasures in her heart. <sup>52</sup> And Jesus kept on growing—in wisdom, in physical stature, in favor with God, and in favor with others.

<sup>1</sup> And there shall come forth a rod out of the stem of Jesse, and a Branch shall grow out of his roots:

<sup>3</sup> And shall make him of quick understanding in the fear of the LORD: and he shall not judge after the sight of his eyes, neither reprove after the hearing of his ears:

<sup>4</sup> But with righteousness shall he judge the poor, and reprove with equity for the meek of the earth: and he shall smite the earth: with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips shall he slay the wicked.

<sup>5</sup> And righteousness shall be the girdle of his loins, and faithfulness the girdle of his reins.

<sup>10</sup> And in that day there shall be a root of Jesse, which shall stand for an ensign of the people; to it shall the Gentiles seek: and his rest shall be glorious.

**Isaiah 63:10 an example of what happens when Holy Spirit is vexed. It indicates someone keeps pulling until he completely disconnects**

**from Him to go his own way. "But they rebelled, and vexed His Holy Spirit: therefore He was turned to be their enemy, and He fought against them."**

<sup>16</sup> For where envying and strife is, there is confusion and every evil work.

<sup>17</sup> But the wisdom that is from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, and easy to be intreated, full of mercy and good fruits, without partiality, and without hypocrisy.

<sup>18</sup> And the fruit of righteousness is sown in peace of them that make peace.

**Here's scriptural proof of Jesus hosting the Love of God. Jesus confirmed you can do the same works that He did plus greater works with Holy Spirit imparting the Love of God.**

John 8:1-11, Living Bible

<sup>1</sup> Jesus returned to the Mount of Olives, <sup>2</sup> but early the next morning he was back again at the Temple. A crowd soon gathered, and he sat down and talked to them. <sup>3</sup> As he was speaking, the Jewish leaders and Pharisees brought a woman caught in adultery and placed her out in front of the staring crowd. "Teacher," they said to Jesus, "this woman was caught in the very act of adultery. <sup>5</sup> Moses' law says to kill her. What about it?"

<sup>6</sup> They were trying to trap him into saying something they could use against him, but Jesus stooped down and wrote in the dust with his finger. <sup>7</sup> They kept demanding an answer, so he stood up again and said, "All right, hurl the stones at her until she dies. But only he who never sinned may throw the first!"

<sup>8</sup> Then he stooped down again and wrote some more in the dust. <sup>9</sup> And the Jewish leaders slipped away one by one, beginning with the eldest, until only Jesus was left in front of the crowd with the woman.

<sup>10</sup> Then Jesus stood up again and said to her, "Where are your accusers? Didn't even one of them condemn you?"

<sup>11</sup> "No, sir," she said.

And Jesus said, "Neither do I. Go and sin no more."

Galatians 5:22-23 King James Version (KJV)

<sup>22</sup> But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, <sup>23</sup> Meekness, temperance: against such there is no law.

**Ephesians 4:30 counsels us to not grieve Holy Spirit, so He won't lose any opportunity to express Himself through us. "And grieve not the Holy Spirit of God, whereby ye are sealed unto the day of redemption."**

1 Corinthians 13:4-8, Amplified Bible, Classic Edition

<sup>4</sup> Love endures long *and* is patient and kind; love never is envious *nor* boils over with jealousy, is not boastful *or* vainglorious, does not display itself haughtily.

<sup>5</sup> It is not conceited (arrogant and inflated with pride); it is not rude (unmannerly) *and* does not act unbecomingly. Love (God's love in us) does not insist on its own rights *or* its own way, *for* it is not self-seeking; it is not touchy *or* fretful *or* resentful; it takes no account of the evil done to it [it pays no attention to a suffered wrong].

<sup>6</sup> It does not rejoice at injustice *and* unrighteousness, but rejoices when right *and* truth prevail.

<sup>7</sup> Love bears up under anything *and* everything that comes, is ever ready to believe the best of every person, its hopes are fadeless under all circumstances, and it endures everything [without weakening].

<sup>8</sup> Love never fails [never fades out or becomes obsolete or comes to an end]. As for prophecy (<sup>[a]</sup>the gift of interpreting the divine will and purpose), it will be fulfilled *and* pass away; as for tongues, they will be destroyed *and* cease;

as for knowledge, it will pass away [it will lose its value and be superseded by truth].

**Here's scriptural proof of Jesus hosting the Power of God. Jesus confirmed you can do the same works that He did plus greater works with Holy Spirit imparting the Power of God.**

Acts 10:38, Amplified Bible, Classic Edition

<sup>38</sup> How God anointed *and* consecrated Jesus of Nazareth with the [Holy] Spirit and with strength *and* ability *and* power; how He went about doing good and, <sup>[a]</sup>in particular, curing all who were harassed *and* oppressed by [the power of] the devil, for God was with Him.

1 Corinthians 12:4-11 King James Version (KJV)

<sup>4</sup> Now there are diversities of gifts, but the same Spirit. <sup>5</sup> And there are differences of administrations, but the same Lord. <sup>6</sup> And there are diversities of operations, but it is the same God which worketh all in all. <sup>7</sup> But the manifestation of the Spirit is given to every man to profit withal. <sup>8</sup> For to one is given by the Spirit the word of wisdom; to another the word of knowledge by the same Spirit; <sup>9</sup> To another faith by the same Spirit; to another the gifts of healing by the same Spirit; <sup>10</sup> To another the working of miracles; to another prophecy; to another discerning of spirits; to another divers kinds of tongues; to another the interpretation of tongues: <sup>11</sup> But all these worketh that one and the selfsame Spirit, dividing to every man severally as He will.

**Walking softly before the Lord helps you to discern the move of Holy Spirit to ensure what God has designed can never be extinguished. Live so you never think His divine intervention is an unscheduled interruption you take the option to reject. 1 Thessalonians 5:19 instructs us with these words, "Quench not the Spirit."**

<sup>1</sup> The Spirit of the Lord, the Eternal, is on me.

*The Lord has appointed me for a special purpose.*

He has anointed me to bring good news to the poor.

He has sent me to repair broken hearts,

And to declare to those who are held captive and bound in prison,

*“Be free from your imprisonment!”*

<sup>2</sup> *He has sent me* to announce the year of jubilee, the season of the Eternal’s favor:

*for our enemies* it will be a day of God’s wrath;

For those who mourn it will be *a time of comfort*.<sup>[a]</sup>

<sup>3</sup> As for those who grieve over Zion,

*God has sent me* to give them a *beautiful* crown in exchange for ashes,

To anoint them with gladness instead of sorrow,

to wrap them in *victory, joy, and* praise instead of depression and sadness.

People will call them *magnificent, like great towering trees*

standing for what is right.

They stand to the glory of the Eternal

who planted them.
