The Tsunami Blessing Inside and Out, Part 275 Scriptures

This is Section AN of a multi-part instruction. Similar to a nation sending an ambassador into a territory, Jesus commanded the body of Christ to go into all the world. Although your kingdom of God assignment is in the world system, it is not in you. Jesus Christ is! You are His anointed carrier of the presence of God as well as the power of God. Your appointment is to bring the world into the kingdom of God until it is proof positive that, "those who have turned the world upside down are come here too!" Really, upside down is right side up!

Jesus' succession plan names you as His change agent to serve His divine purpose, plan, and path in one or even all the Seven Mountains: 1) government; 2) business; 3) media; 4) education; 5) arts & entertainment; 6) religion; and 7) family. Every Kingdom of God assignment is established on the Word of God as well as executed by the Spirit of God. If it is not, the mission will be an obstruction against your own breakthrough. Your minimum contribution is by prayer and petition, i.e., to intercede. Your maximum contribution is by practice and participation in the sphere(s) of influence God has chosen for you, i.e., to intervene.

Never give your seat of authority to an already failed world system. Let Holy Spirit reposition you to always "see" Jesus as He really is, the King of kings. Then grant the Lord of lords all the living room He requires, without issuing any eviction clauses. As your space restrictions are demolished, you can "be" as Jesus is in the world, a world overcomer. In other words, you are living on top of the world; it is not living on top of you.

Your Choice of Wisdom

Deuteronomy 30, Living Bible

¹ "When all these things have happened to you—the blessings and the curses I have listed—you will meditate upon them as you are living among the nations where the Lord your God will have driven you. ² If at that time you want to return to the Lord your God, and you and your children have begun wholeheartedly to obey all of the commandments I have given you today, ³ then the Lord your God will rescue you from your captivity! He will

have mercy upon you and come and gather you out of all the nations where he will have scattered you. ⁴ Though you are at the ends of the earth, he will go and find you and bring you back again ⁵ to the land of your ancestors. You shall possess the land again, and he will do you good and bless you even more than he did your ancestors! ⁶ He will cleanse your hearts and the hearts of your children and of your children's children so that you will love the Lord your God with all your hearts and souls, and Israel shall come alive again!

⁷⁻⁸ "If you return to the Lord and obey all the commandments that I command you today, the Lord your God will take his curses and turn them against your enemies—against those who hate you and persecute you. ⁹ The Lord your God will prosper everything you do and give you many children and much cattle and wonderful crops; for the Lord will again rejoice over you as he did over your fathers. ¹⁰ He will rejoice if you but obey the commandments written in this book of the law, and if you turn to the Lord your God with all your hearts and souls.

¹¹ "Obeying these commandments is not something beyond your strength and reach; ¹² for these laws are not in the far heavens, so distant that you can't hear and obey them, and with no one to bring them down to you; ¹³ nor are they beyond the ocean, so far that no one can bring you their message; ¹⁴ but they are very close at hand—in your hearts and on your lips—so obey them.

¹⁵ "Look, today I have set before you life and death, depending on whether you obey or disobey. ¹⁶ I have commanded you today to love the Lord your God and to follow his paths and to keep his laws, so that you will live and become a great nation, and so that the Lord your God will bless you and the land you are about to possess. ¹⁷ But if your hearts turn away and you won't listen—if you are drawn away to worship other gods— ¹⁸ then I declare to

you this day that you shall surely perish; you will not have a long, good life in the land you are going in to possess.

¹⁹ "I call heaven and earth to witness against you that today I have set before you life or death, blessing or curse. Oh, that you would choose life; that you and your children might live! ²⁰ Choose to love the Lord your God and to obey him and to cling to him, for he is your life and the length of your days. You will then be able to live safely in the land the Lord promised your ancestors, Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob."

Your Caliber of Wisdom

Psalm 25, Living Bible

¹ To you, O Lord, I pray. ² Don't fail me, Lord, for I am trusting you. Don't let my enemies succeed. Don't give them victory over me. ³ None of those who have faith in God will ever be disgraced for trusting him. But all who harm the innocent shall be defeated.

⁴ Show me the path where I should go, O Lord; point out the right road for me to walk. ⁵ Lead me; teach me; for you are the God who gives me salvation. I have no hope except in you. ⁶⁻⁷ Overlook my youthful sins, O Lord! Look at me instead through eyes of mercy and forgiveness, through eyes of everlasting love and kindness.

⁸ The Lord is good and glad to teach the proper path to all who go astray; ⁹ he will teach the ways that are right and best to those who humbly turn to him. ¹⁰ And when we obey him, every path he guides us on is fragrant with his loving-kindness and his truth.

¹¹ But Lord, my sins! How many they are. Oh, pardon them for the honor of your name.

¹² Where is the man who fears the Lord? God will teach him how to choose the best. ¹³ He shall live within God's circle of blessing, and his children shall inherit the earth. ¹⁴ Friendship with God is reserved for those who reverence him. With them alone he shares the secrets of his promises. ¹⁵ My eyes are ever looking to the Lord for help, for he alone can rescue me. ¹⁶ Come, Lord, and show me your mercy, for I am helpless, overwhelmed, in deep distress; ¹⁷ my problems go from bad to worse. Oh, save me from them all! ¹⁸ See my sorrows; feel my pain; forgive my sins. ¹⁹ See how many enemies I have and how viciously they hate me! ²⁰ Save me from them! Deliver my life from their power! Oh, let it never be said that I trusted you in vain!

²¹ Assign me Godliness and Integrity as my bodyguards, for I expect you to protect me ²² and to ransom Israel from all her troubles.

The Clarity for Wisdom

WISDOM, noun s as z. [G. See Wise.]

1. The right use or exercise of knowledge; the choice of laudable ends, and of the best means to accomplish them. This is *wisdom* in act, effect, or practice. If *wisdom* is to be considered as a faculty of the mind, it is the faculty of discerning or judging what is most just, proper and useful, and if it is to be considered as an acquirement, it is the knowledge and use of what is best, most just, most proper, most conducive to prosperity or happiness. *wisdom* in the first sense, or practical *wisdom* is nearly synonymous with discretion. It differs somewhat from prudence, in this respect; prudence is the exercise of sound judgment in avoiding evils; *wisdom* is the exercise of sound judgment either in avoiding evils or attempting good. Prudence then is a species, of which *wisdom* is the genus.

²⁻⁴ Don't run from tests and hardships, brothers and sisters. As difficult as they are, you will ultimately find joy in them; if you embrace them, your faith will blossom under pressure and teach you true patience as you endure. And true patience brought on by endurance will equip you to complete the long journey and cross the finish line—mature, complete, and wanting nothing. ⁵ If you don't have all the wisdom needed for this journey, then all you have to do is ask God for it; and God will grant all that you need. He gives lavishly and never scolds you for asking.

Wisdom, as James understands it, is the ability to live life well and make good decisions. Wisdom doesn't come from old age or hard knocks. Wisdom begins with knowing and depending absolutely on God, who is never stingy when it comes to wisdom for those who seek it. He supplies all the wisdom we need when we ask. But when we try to go it alone without God—trouble is around the corner.

⁶ The key is that your request be anchored by your single-minded commitment *to God*. Those who depend only on their own judgment are like *those lost on* the seas, carried away by any wave or picked up by any wind.

¹³ Who is a wise man and endued with knowledge among you? let him shew out of a good conversation his works with meekness of wisdom.

¹⁴ But if ye have bitter envying and strife in your hearts, glory not, and lie not against the truth.

¹⁵ This wisdom descendeth not from above, but is earthly [worldly], sensual [animalistic], devilish [demonic].

¹⁶ For where envying and strife is, there is confusion and every evil work.
¹⁷ But the wisdom that is from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, and easy to be intreated, full of mercy and good fruits, without partiality, and without hypocrisy.

¹⁸ And the fruit of righteousness is sown in peace of them that make peace.

The Comparison between the Wisdom of God and the World's Wisdom

1 Corinthians 1:17-31, The Voice

¹⁷ The mission given to me by the Anointed One is not about baptism, but about preaching good news. The point is not *to impress others by* spinning an eloquent, intellectual argument; that *type of rhetorical showboating* would only nullify the cross of the Anointed.

¹⁸ For people who are stumbling toward ruin, the message of the cross is nothing but a tall tale for fools by a fool. But for those of us who are already experiencing the reality of being rescued *and made right*, it is nothing short of God's power. ¹⁹ This is why the Scripture says:

I will put an end to the wisdom of the so-called wise,

and I will invalidate the insight of your *so-called* experts.^[a] ²⁰ So now, where is the philosopher? Where is the scholar? Where is the skilled debater, the best of your time? Step up, if you dare. Hasn't God made fools out of those who count on the wisdom of this rebellious, broken world? ²¹ For in God's deep wisdom, He made it so that the world could not even begin to comprehend Him through its own style of wisdom; in fact, God took immense pleasure in rescuing people of faith through the foolishness of the message we preach. ²² It seems the Jews are always asking for signs and the Greeks are always on the prowl for wisdom. ²³ *But we tell a different story.* We proclaim a crucified Jesus, God's Anointed. For Jews this is scandalous, for outsiders^[b] this is moronic, ²⁴ but for those of us living out God's call—regardless of our Jewish or Greek heritage—we know the Anointed embodies God's *dynamic* power and God's *deep* wisdom. ²⁵ *You can count on this:* God's foolishness will always be wiser than mere human wisdom, and God's weakness will always be stronger than mere human strength.

The cross challenges human values because no one expects to find freedom through capital punishment. Unlike most of the thousands who faced crucifixion before and after Jesus, He was clearly not a criminal. God uses this contradiction to reveal His power and wisdom: Jesus has offered Himself to death and has been raised to life to bring liberation to others. Those who truly follow this crucified king do not seek power and authority through the normal patterns of the world; they offer themselves in loving sacrifice for others. That is where God's transforming power is truly revealed in the church.

²⁶ Look carefully at your call, brothers and sisters. By human standards, not many of you are deemed to be wise. Not many are considered powerful. Not many of you come from royalty, right? ²⁷ But *celebrate this*: God selected the world's foolish to bring shame upon *those who think they are* wise; likewise, He selected the world's weak to bring disgrace upon *those who think they are* strong. ²⁸ God selected the common and the castoff, whatever lacks status, so He could invalidate the claims of those who think those things are significant. ²⁹ So it makes no sense for any person to boast in God's presence. ³⁰ Instead, credit God with your new situation: you are united with Jesus the Anointed. He is God's wisdom for us and more. He is our righteousness and holiness and redemption. ³¹ As the Scripture says: "If someone wants to boast, he should boast in the Lord."^[a]

The Crystallization of Wisdom

1 Corinthians 2:1-7, The Voice

¹ My brothers and sisters, I did not pose *as an expert with all the answers.* I did not pretend to explain the mystery of God with eloquent speech and *human* wisdom. ² I claimed to know nothing *with certainty* other than *the reality that* Jesus is the Anointed One, *the Liberating King,* who was crucified on our behalf. ³ I was moved to utter despair during my time with you. I would find myself trembling in *dread and* fear. ⁴ The sermons I preached were not delivered with *the kind of* persuasive elegance *some have come to expect*, but they were effective because I relied on God's Spirit to demonstrate God's power. ⁵ If this were not so, your faith would be based on human wisdom and not the power of God.

Christianity is not merely a set of ideas and propositions. One can agree with all the truths in the Bible and still miss the power of God. Paul knows the brothers and sisters in Corinth might attempt to reduce Christianity to a new philosophy based on human understanding, but the power of God cannot be fully grasped by our eight-pound brains. We must approach God humbly as creations, not as those aspiring to fully explain the Creator of the universe.

⁶ However, in the presence of mature believers, we do impart *true* wisdom not the *phony* wisdom typical of this *rebellious* age or of the *hostile* powers who rule this age. *Despite what you may think,* these ruling spirits are losing their grip on this world. ⁷ But we do impart God's mysterious and hidden wisdom. Before the ages began, God graciously decided to use His wisdom for our glory.

1 Corinthians 2:12-16, King James Version

¹² Now we have received, not the spirit of the world, but the spirit which is of God; that we might know the things that are freely given to us of God.

¹³ Which things also we speak, not in the words which man's wisdom teacheth, but which the Holy Ghost teacheth; comparing spiritual things with spiritual.

¹⁴ But the natural man receiveth not the things of the Spirit of God: for they are foolishness unto him: neither can he know them, because they are spiritually discerned.

¹⁵ But he that is spiritual judgeth all things, yet he himself is judged of no man.

¹⁶ For who hath known the mind of the Lord, that he may instruct him? but we have the mind of Christ.

1 Corinthians 3:18-20, The Voice

¹⁸ Don't let anyone deceive himself. If any one of you thinks he is wise in matters pertaining to this world, *he is going to be really disappointed*. In fact, one must be deemed a fool *by worldly standards* in order to become truly wise ¹⁹ because the wisdom of this *rebellious and broken* world looks like foolishness when put next to God. So it stands in Scripture, "He catches the wise in their deceitful plotting."^{[a] 20} And the Scriptures add, "The Lord knows the *highest* thoughts of the wise, and they are worthless."^[b]

Crowned with the Wisdom of God

WISDOM - To use the best choices available to you. To have and use good sense. To say and do the right thing in any given situation. To have right actions that are synchronized with right timing. To use tact in all your undertakings.

Noah had what it takes to live life successfully, the spirit of wisdom. He made good decisions, with simplicity. What put Noah above the rest is that he allowed God to make the best decisions for him. Because God was his final authority, he chose only what pertained to life and godliness. Each decision was marked by diplomacy, logic, and reasoning. Therefore, Noah was not confused. Nothing was obscure to him. He had clarity in every situation. He had the right perspective. God was his resolve. Noah did not miss any of God's deadlines. Because Noah walked with God, he moved with precision. Noah did not deviate from what God commanded him to do in anything. Even when life challenges were presented, he still made wise choices.

From one thing to the next, Noah experienced smooth transitions because he simply believed God would accompany him to make an accurate assessment. The result, Noah went from glory to glory. Noah realized that his times were in God's hands and that his steps were already ordered.

Ecclesiastes 3:1 states, "To every thing there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven." Noah allowed God to make everything beautiful in its time. Noah recognized that it was God's season, so he aligned himself to God's plan by using what was available to him, wisdom.

Several examples of wisdom can be found in the 8th chapter of Genesis. For instance, Noah did not unboard the ark until the earth was dried and God gave him the okay. Noah investigated the fruit of the land. Since olive plants are representative of the anointing, he didn't unload the ark until he was certain that God's delivering power was upon that land.

Genesis 8:6-14 "And it came to pass at the end of forty days, that Noah opened the window of the ark which he had made: And he sent forth a raven, which went forth to and fro, until the waters were dried up from off the earth. Also he sent forth a dove from him, to see if the waters were abated from off the face of the ground; But the dove found no rest for the

sole of her foot, and she returned unto him into the ark, for the waters were on the face of the whole earth: then he put forth his hand, and took her, and pulled her in unto him into the ark. And he stayed yet another seven days; and again he sent forth the dove out of the ark; And the dove came in to him in the evening; and, lo, in her mouth was an olive leaf plucked off: so Noah knew that the waters were abated from off the earth. And he stayed yet another seven days; and sent forth the dove, which returned not again unto him any more. And it came to pass in the six hundredth and first year, in the first month, the first day of the month, the waters were dried up from off the earth: and Noah removed the covering of the ark, and looked, and behold, the face of the ground was dry. And in the second month, on the seven and twentieth day of the month, was the earth dried.

God gives away all that is His. "For the Lord giveth wisdom..." Proverbs 2:6.

Wisdom is one request away. "If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, that giveth to all men liberally, and upbraideth not; and it shall be given him." James 1:5.

Word of wisdom - The Spirit of God reveals the truth about future events. The Spirit of God gave Noah the forthcoming plan of judgment and salvation. A Word of wisdom represents information God reveals about the truth to come. So a word of wisdom can be expected to manifest within a moment's time or even as far away as eternity. The two subsequent scriptures represent the word of wisdom that was given to Noah.

In **Genesis 6:3**, God gave His word 120 years before it was manifested. "And the Lord said, My Spirit shall not always strive with man, for that he also is flesh: yet his days shall be an hundred and twenty years."

In **Genesis 6:17**, God revealed how he was going to accomplish his plan and who would be the recipients of his salvation before it even took place. "And, behold, I, even I do bring a flood of waters upon the earth, to destroy all flesh, wherein is the breath of life, from under heaven; and everything that is in the earth shall die. But with thee will I establish my covenant; and thou shalt come into the ark, thou, and thy sons, and thy wife, and thy sons' wives with thee."

You can't receive a word of wisdom by reading your horoscope, calling the psychic hotline, or going to a reader. These are all counterfeit works of the devil to get your attention on the wisdom of the world.
