The Tsunami Blessing Inside and Out, Part 276 Scriptures

This is Section AO of a multi-part instruction. Similar to a nation sending an ambassador into a territory, Jesus commanded the body of Christ to go into all the world. Although your kingdom of God assignment is in the world system, it is not in you. Jesus Christ is! You are His anointed carrier of the presence of God as well as the power of God. Your appointment is to bring the world into the kingdom of God until it is proof positive that, "those who have turned the world upside down are come here too!" Really, upside down is right side up!

Jesus' succession plan names you as His change agent to serve His divine purpose, plan, and path in one or even all the Seven Mountains: 1) government; 2) business; 3) media; 4) education; 5) arts & entertainment; 6) religion; and 7) family. Every Kingdom of God assignment is established on the Word of God as well as executed by the Spirit of God. If it is not, the mission will be an obstruction against your own breakthrough. Your minimum contribution is by prayer and petition, i.e., to intercede. Your maximum contribution is by practice and participation in the sphere(s) of influence God has chosen for you, i.e., to intervene.

Never give your seat of authority to an already failed world system. Let Holy Spirit reposition you to always "see" Jesus as He really is, the King of kings. Then grant the Lord of lords all the living room He requires, without issuing any eviction clauses. As your space restrictions are demolished, you can "be" as Jesus is in the world, a world overcomer. In other words, you are living on top of the world; it is not living on top of you.

Jesus' testimony of following Heaven-born judgement and justice

³⁰ I am able to do nothing from Myself [independently, of My own accord—but only as I am taught by God and as I get His orders]. Even as I hear, I judge [I decide as I am bidden to decide. As the voice comes to Me, so I give a decision], and My judgment is right (just, righteous), because I do not seek *or* consult My own will [I have no desire to do what is pleasing to

Myself, My own aim, My own purpose] but only the will *and* pleasure of the Father Who sent Me.

- ³⁰ I will not talk with you much more, for the prince (evil genius, ruler) of the world is coming. And he has no claim on Me. [He has nothing in common with Me; there is nothing in Me that belongs to him, and he has no power over Me.]
- ³¹ But [^[a]satan is coming and] I do as the Father has commanded Me, so that the world may know (be convinced) that I love the Father and that I do only what the Father has instructed Me to do. [I act in full agreement with His orders.] Rise, let us go away from here.

Solomon's pursuit of discretion to watch over him, understanding to keep him

- 2 Chronicles 1:10-12, Amplified Bible, Classic Edition
- ¹⁰ Give me now wisdom and knowledge to go out and come in before this people, for who can rule this Your people who are so great?
- ¹¹ God replied to Solomon, Because this was in your heart and you have not asked for riches, possessions, honor, *and* glory, or the life of your foes, or even for long life, but have asked wisdom and knowledge for yourself, that you may rule *and* judge My people over whom I have made you king,

 ¹² Wisdom and knowledge are granted you. And I will give you riches, possessions, honor, *and* glory, such as none of the kings had before you,

and none after you shall have their equal.

First Woman (indicating the other): ¹⁷ My lord, she and I live under the same roof. She was in the house when my child was born. ¹⁸ Three days after my child was born, she had her own child. She and I were alone in the house with our newborns. ¹⁹ One night her baby died because she lay on it during her sleep. ²⁰ She woke up, and after seeing her dead baby, she stole my baby out of my arms while I was sleeping and placed her dead baby in my arms. ²¹ When I woke up the next morning to feed my son, I found him dead. When I took a closer look at him, I saw that it was not the same child who came from my womb.

Second Woman: ²² She lies! My son is alive, and her son is dead!

First Woman: She lies! Her son is dead, and my son is alive!

Solomon: ²³ This woman says, "My son is alive, and your son is dead." The other woman says, "My son is alive, and your son is dead." ²⁴ Bring me a sword.

¹⁶ Two prostitutes visited Solomon asking for a judgment.

- ²⁵ (receiving a sword) Cut the living child in half, and give each woman one of the halves.
- ²⁶ The woman who truly was the mother of the living child was overcome with compassion and pleaded with the king.

First Woman: Please *don't cut the child in half!* Just give the whole child to her! Please do not kill him!

Second Woman: *Nonsense!* The child will belong to neither one of us! Cut him in half!

Solomon: ²⁷ The living child belongs to the first woman. Give the boy to her, and do not harm him. She is the true mother.

²⁸ When the news of the king's wise judgment spread throughout Israel, they all feared him. *They respected him* because they perceived God's wisdom in his just judgment.

Jesus' pursuit of mercy triumphing over judgment

Isaiah 11:3-5, Amplified Bible, Classic Edition

- ³ And shall make Him of quick understanding, *and* His delight shall be in the reverential *and* obedient fear of the Lord. And He shall not judge by the sight of His eyes, neither decide by the hearing of His ears;
- ⁴ But with righteousness *and* justice shall He judge the poor and decide with fairness for the meek, the poor, *and* the downtrodden of the earth; and He shall smite the earth *and* the oppressor with the rod of His mouth, and with the breath of His lips He shall slay the wicked.
- ⁵ And righteousness shall be the girdle of His waist and faithfulness the girdle of His loins.

Pharisees: ⁴ Teacher, this woman was caught in the act of adultery. ⁵ Moses says in the law that we are to kill such women by stoning. What do You say about it?

⁶ This was all set up as a test for Jesus; His answers would give them grounds to accuse Him *of crimes against Moses' law*. Jesus bent over and wrote something in the dirt with His finger. ⁷ They persisted in badgering Jesus, so He stood up straight.

Jesus: Let the first stone be thrown by the one among you who has not sinned.

⁸ Once again Jesus bent down to the ground and resumed writing with His finger. ⁹ The Pharisees who heard Him *stood still for a few moments and then* began to leave slowly, one by one, beginning with the older men. Eventually only Jesus and the woman remained, ¹⁰ and Jesus looked up.

Jesus: *Dear* woman, where is everyone? *Are we alone?* Did no one step forward to condemn you?

Woman Caught in Adultery: ¹¹ Lord, no one has condemned me.

Jesus: Well, I do not condemn you either; all I ask is that you go and from now on avoid the sins that plague you.] [a]

Our plea of innocence before the Heavenly Father, as Judge at the throne of grace fully recognized

- ¹ I will praise You, O Lord, with my whole heart; I will show forth (recount and tell aloud) all Your marvelous works *and* wonderful deeds!
- ² I will rejoice in You and be in high spirits; I will sing praise to Your name, O Most High!
- ³ When my enemies turned back, they stumbled and perished before You.
- ⁴ For You have maintained my right and my cause; You sat on the throne judging righteously.
- ⁵ You have rebuked the nations, You have destroyed the wicked; You have blotted out their name forever and ever.
- ⁶ The enemy have been cut off *and* have vanished in everlasting ruins, You have plucked up *and* overthrown their cities; the very memory of them has perished *and* vanished.
- ⁷ But the Lord shall remain *and* continue forever; He has prepared *and* established His throne for judgment.
- ⁸ And He will judge the world in righteousness (rightness and equity); He will minister justice to the peoples in uprightness.

- ¹¹ Sing praises to the Lord, Who dwells in Zion! Declare among the peoples His doings!

- ¹² For He Who avenges the blood [of His people shed unjustly] remembers them; He does not forget the cry of the afflicted (the poor and the humble).
- ¹³ Have mercy upon me *and* be gracious *to me*, O Lord; consider how I am afflicted by those who hate me, You Who lift me up from the gates of death,
- ¹⁴ That I may show forth (recount and tell aloud) all Your praises! In the gates of the Daughter of Zion I will rejoice in Your salvation *and* Your saving help.
- ¹⁵ The nations have sunk down in the pit that they made; in the net which they hid is their own foot caught.
- ¹⁶ The Lord has made Himself known; He executes judgment; the wicked are snared in the work of their own hands. Higgaion [meditation]. *Selah* [pause, and calmly think of that]!
- ¹⁷ The wicked shall be turned back [headlong into premature death] into Sheol (the place of the departed spirits of the wicked), even all the nations that forget *or* are forgetful of God.
- ¹⁸ For the needy shall not always be forgotten, and the expectation *and* hope of the meek *and* the poor shall not perish forever.
- ¹⁹ Arise, O Lord! Let not man prevail; let the nations be judged before You.
- ²⁰ Put them in fear [make them realize their frail nature], O Lord, that the nations may know themselves to be but men. *Selah* [pause, and calmly think of that]!
