

The Tsunami Blessing Inside and Out, Part 297 Scriptures

This is Section J of a multi-part instruction. The only ones who have the right to claim Preeminent Domain is Elohim and those who were called and elected to inherit and inhabit the earth, i.e., every member of the Body of Christ. Build your capacity to receive the exceeding, abundantly, above all that you can imagine through the Word of God and the Spirit of God.

Recognize you are heavily endorsed and reinforced by the kingdom of God that is already within you. Always remain in the position of honor and humility before the Lord. Realize you are supernaturally endowed with *exousia* authority and *dunamis* power. Release your God-given dominion to work in you at the fullest strength to govern the earth by faith. Recover all lost, stolen, and destroyed territory and take new ground.

Enlarge your territory to bring Heaven to Earth. Enlarge your heart to receive God's vision and provision. Enlarge your mouth over the enemy and give him no room to cause any division. Make it impossible for satan to ever breach your property line. Be the triple threat that employs: 1) the Word of God, both logos and rhema; 2) the blood of the Lamb; and 3) the name of Jesus.

YOUR FORMAL INTRODUCTION TO ABBA FATHER

You may be inquisitive about the phrase Abba Father. In Greek, Abba is an endearing name for "Daddy." When you are reborn, you receive a Spirit of adoption. Yes, you have been officially adopted by your Heavenly Father.

Now, you can see Abba Father not just yours in heaven. You are a habitation of God, i.e., Abba Father through Holy Spirit where Jesus Christ lives in your heart by faith. Therefore, your Heavenly Father resides on earth as well.

Jesus Christ is identified as "the Everlasting Father" in Isaiah 9:6. Jesus is the One who birthed the family of God on earth giving Abba the privilege of having all the sons and the daughters He always desired. That is why Jesus instructs His disciples, including you in the Lord's Prayer to address God as "Our Father which art in Heaven" in Matthew 6:9.

When I first started praying, I would acknowledge Abba Father only as God. It was so formal that I could have easily called Him, Mr. God instead. The root cause was that I didn't know as I am known by the love of God.

Please know, it was never Abba Father's desire, but my elected distance from Him. Still, my friend ignited the change in me. I could hear the endearment in her voice at the mention of His name, Daddy. When my intimacy with my Heavenly Father began to flourish, I started calling my Heavenly Father, Abba with great ease.

Whether your status is a present son or daughter of God, a potential offspring, or a prodigal child, Abba Father remains approachable no matter how touching or toxic your relationship may have been or even be right now.

In Luke 15:20-32, Jesus settles the matter that you can always expect Abba Father to respond to you as the most merciful Parent. On record, Jesus unveils Abba Father's heart during His parable about the prodigal son. Knowing that alone, you will discover His compassion, i.e., His desire to help you even more than you may desire to have His help.

Abba Father's constant affection extends in both directions. You are always welcome to come to Him as your loving Father just as you are, no matter the relational attachment or detachment. Also, He works behind the scenes so you can hear Him beckoning you tenderly as well. He will continue to draw you to Him because of His lovingkindness. At the moment you begin to move toward Him, He takes off running toward you to embrace you enthusiastically.

Before you call, Abba Father is present to answer you and even while you are yet speaking He hears you. By Abba Father's warm embrace, you will also discover His passion, i.e., His fervency to express His love toward you even more than you may desire to express your love for Him.

Luke 15:20-32 King James Version (KJV)

²⁰ And he arose, and came to his father. But when he was yet a great way off, his father saw him, and had compassion, and ran, and fell on his neck, and kissed him.

²¹ And the son said unto him, Father, I have sinned against heaven, and in thy sight, and am no more worthy to be called thy son.

- ²² But the father said to his servants, Bring forth the best robe, and put it on him; and put a ring on his hand, and shoes on his feet:
- ²³ And bring hither the fatted calf, and kill it; and let us eat, and be merry:
- ²⁴ For this my son was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found. And they began to be merry.
- ²⁵ Now his elder son was in the field: and as he came and drew nigh to the house, he heard musick and dancing.
- ²⁶ And he called one of the servants, and asked what these things meant.
- ²⁷ And he said unto him, Thy brother is come; and thy father hath killed the fatted calf, because he hath received him safe and sound.
- ²⁸ And he was angry, and would not go in: therefore came his father out, and intreated him.
- ²⁹ And he answering said to his father, Lo, these many years do I serve thee, neither transgressed I at any time thy commandment: and yet thou never gavest me a kid, that I might make merry with my friends:
- ³⁰ But as soon as this thy son was come, which hath devoured thy living with harlots, thou hast killed for him the fatted calf.
- ³¹ And he said unto him, Son, thou art ever with me, and all that I have is thine.
- ³² It was meet that we should make merry, and be glad: for this thy brother was dead, and is alive again; and was lost, and is found.

THE IDENTITY OF A FATHER'S INFLUENCE

Fatherhood as experienced on earth leaves an indelible impression on each child. Each offspring may become just like his/her father or the polar opposite of him. That imprint may influence a child's belief system about having or even desiring a Heavenly Father at all. That representation may cause God's pure character and perfect conduct to be questionable to that offspring.

That is why Jesus showed the disciples the Father by not only demonstrating His Words but also His Works. Jesus is the "perfect imprint and very image of God's nature." He displayed like Father, like Son.

Hebrews 1:3, Amplified Bible, Classic Edition

- ³ He is the sole expression of the glory of God [the Light-being, the ^[a]out-raying or radiance of the divine], and He is the perfect imprint *and* very image of [God's] nature,

upholding *and* maintaining *and* guiding *and* propelling the universe by His mighty word of power. When He had *by offering Himself* accomplished *our* cleansing of sins *and* riddance of guilt, He sat down at the right hand of the divine Majesty on high,

Think about how you would answer the following inquiry. "Is the Heavenly Father a replica of what I experienced growing up?" How that question is answered by each child will shade and shape all his or her initial or even ongoing interactions with Abba. That could still apply whether or not the paternal relationship is or was good, bad, ugly, really ugly, or the mixture of them all.

Let's briefly examine four distinct categories an offspring may experience through a relationship with his/her earthly father. The earthly father can show defining traits of being: 1) approachable, 2) abusive, 3) absentee, and/or 4) admissable.

If the father is or was approachable like our Heavenly Father, the child probably had a healthy lifestyle growing up: there was order; balance; wholeness; fullness; and overflow that sprang out of the father's love for his offspring. From that nourishing and cherishing experience, it may be easy to bond with Abba.

On the other hand, if the father is or was abusive, the child may anticipate only cruel treatment from the Heavenly Father as well. Yes, God will discipline us as His children, but God is never an abusive Father toward you as His child. The Lord reserves His assaults against your enemies alone, satan.

If the father is or was an absentee parent, the child may have a fear of being abandoned someday, on occasion, or all of the time. God is not an absentee Father because He already vowed to never leave you or forsake you.

If the father is or was admissible, the child may attempt to manipulate the relationship to the extreme. That offspring may have been allowed to do whatever he wanted to do and never received any direction or correction at all. From that experience, the child will tend to accuse others while always excusing himself from any responsibility. God is not an admissable Father either. His comprehensive training covers what is acceptable as well as what is unacceptable to Him from the onset. Because your Heavenly Father

already blessed you, He teaches you how to avoid the curse altogether.

HOLY SPIRIT IS IDENTIFIED AS THE SPIRIT OF ADOPTION

Holy Spirit is the One who ushers you into your formal introduction to your Heavenly Father, Abba as shown in Galatians 4:1-7. Holy Spirit even teaches you how to address your Heavenly Father by acknowledging Him as Abba.

Let's expound on its Greek meaning. "Abbá is defined as Father, also used as the term of *tender endearment* by a beloved child – i.e. in an *affectionate, dependent* relationship with their father; *daddy, papa.*" Then God will be no longer just Mr. God to you. Holy Spirit helps you to live comfortably as Abba's adopted son or adopted daughter, not just a servant and never a slave.

Holy Spirit also brings you to the realization of your preferred status of not just being an heir of God but also a joint heir with Jesus Christ. You see, the word "joint" grants you mutual access to your shared heavenly inheritance. Your God-given heritage begins on earth with your New Birth. In other words, you now receive the rights of the first-born as well as the double portion of the blessing. Your equal share is discovered in Christ alone.

Galatians 4:1-7 King James Version (KJV)

- ¹ Now I say, That the heir, as long as he is a child, differeth nothing from a servant, though he be lord of all;
- ² But is under tutors and governors until the time appointed of the father.
- ³ Even so we, when we were children, were in bondage under the elements of the world:
- ⁴ But when the fulness of the time was come, God sent forth his Son, made of a woman, made under the law,
- ⁵ To redeem them that were under the law, that we might receive the adoption of sons.
- ⁶ And because ye are sons, God hath sent forth the Spirit of his Son into your hearts, crying, Abba, Father.
- ⁷ Wherefore thou art no more a servant, but a son; and if a son, then an heir of God through Christ.

Furthermore, Holy Spirit ushers you into real intimacy with Abba as seen in Romans 8:14-17. Jesus Christ gave you own His Spirit, i.e.,

Holy Spirit. The undisputable leadership of Holy Spirit begins at our New Birth. Holy Spirit confirms our divine status as children, heirs, and joint-heirs. He resides within us and with us at all times to teach us all things.

Holy Spirit is a very present and active force in our lives as we yearn for and yield to Him all the time, whether the situation may look advantageous or not. Holy Spirit is your only source for revelation knowledge in the earth. Holy Spirit testifies of Jesus, reminds us what He said, shows us things to come, and guides us into all truth.

Holy Spirit is our permanent Professor who knows all the answers. Knowing that gives you confidence that you can pass every proficiency and performance test. Holy Spirit never leaves you during any trial. He helps you to avoid yielding to any temptation. In the end, you will still be standing strong possessing the winning position.

Jesus introduced Holy Spirit as a Comforter to His disciples. Either Holy Spirit consoles, coaches, counsels, consults, or choreographs your pathway to bring you into the good, acceptable, and perfect will of God. When He orders your steps, victory is preserved. You never have to succumb to premature defeat because God recreated you to be more than a conqueror through Christ who loved you so much that He couldn't leave you in that fallen state.

Romans 8:14-17 King James Version (KJV)

¹⁴ For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God.

¹⁵ For ye have not received the spirit of bondage again to fear; but ye have received the Spirit of adoption, whereby we cry, Abba, Father.

¹⁶ The Spirit itself beareth witness with our spirit, that we are the children of God:

¹⁷ And if children, then heirs; heirs of God, and joint-heirs with Christ; if so be that we suffer with him, that we may be also glorified together.

JESUS GIVES US A WORD PICTURE OF HOLY SPIRIT TO PROVE HE HAS RECEIVED THE ENDORSEMENT OF ABBA

The role of the Holy Ghost doesn't stop there. Holy Spirit leads you into making your invocation before Abba Father successfully as well. Therefore, Jesus directs us to first of all ask Abba for the gift of Holy Spirit in Luke 11:13.

Luke 11:13, King James Version

¹³ If ye then, being evil, know how to give good gifts unto your children: how much more shall your heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to them that ask him?

Jesus' instructions in Matthew 7:7-12 ensure you that when you pray to Abba to receive something good He will never respond to you with anything evil. God knows the distinction between good and evil and He is always disposed to be good to you all the time.

Matthew 7:7-12 King James Version (KJV)

⁷ Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you:

⁸ For every one that asketh receiveth; and he that seeketh findeth; and to him that knocketh it shall be opened.

⁹ Or what man is there of you, whom if his son ask bread, will he give him a stone?

¹⁰ Or if he ask a fish, will he give him a serpent?

¹¹ If ye then, being evil, know how to give good gifts unto your children, how much more shall your Father which is in heaven give good things to them that ask him?

¹² Therefore all things whatsoever ye would that men should do to you, do ye even so to them: for this is the law and the prophets.

In John 14:26, John 14:16-17, and John 16:13, Jesus illustrates Holy Spirit's express capability to bridge the past, the present, and the prospective to blend them into eternity without any potential error. You will see that your perception of time without end will be forever revolutionized as you create space to have, hold on to, and host the mind of Christ, the very intellect of Jesus.

Knowledge of Eternity Past

John 14:26 King James Version (KJV)

²⁶ But the Comforter, which is the Holy Ghost, whom the Father will send in My name, He shall teach you all things, and bring all things to your remembrance, whatsoever I have said unto you.

Knowledge of Eternity Present

John 14:16-17 King James Version (KJV)

¹⁶ And I will pray the Father, and He shall give you another Comforter, that He may abide with you forever; ¹⁷ Even the Spirit of truth; whom the world cannot receive, because it seeth Him not, neither knoweth him: but ye know Him; for He dwelleth with you, and shall be in you.

Knowledge of Eternity Prospective

John 16:13 King James Version (KJV)

¹³ Howbeit when He, the Spirit of truth, is come, He will guide you into all truth: for He shall not speak of Himself; but whatsoever He shall hear, that shall He speak: and He will shew you things to come.

EVERY VOID CRAMMED WHEN YOU ARE FILLED WITH THE FULLNESS OF GOD THROUGH HOLY SPIRIT

Holy Spirit saturates you with at least twenty-seven capabilities that are compartmentalized within the following three main categories: Wisdom; Love; and Power. 2 Timothy 1:6-7 names the three diverse groups for you to activate them completely through Holy Spirit alone. With each one fully operational, you are flooded with God Himself. That gives Jesus every opportunity to fully express Himself without any limitations.

2 Timothy 1:6-7 King James Version (KJV)

⁶ Wherefore I put thee in remembrance that thou stir up the gift of God, which is in thee by the putting on of my hands. ⁷ For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind [i.e., wisdom].

In the Wisdom class, the first nine are from Isaiah 11:2-5, 10. They are 1) wisdom, 2) understanding, 3) counsel, 4) might, 5) knowledge, 6) fear of the Lord [reverence], 7) righteousness, 8) faithfulness, and 9) glorious [glory].

Resting in the Lord allows them to have maximum habitation in you, not just visitation. Holy Spirit rested on Jesus and never departed from Him. Jesus never vexed, quenched, or grieved Him at all.

Isaiah 63:10 is an example of what happens when Holy Spirit is vexed. It indicates someone keeps pulling until he completely disconnects from Him to go in a different direction and diverse destination. "But they rebelled, and vexed His Holy Spirit: therefore He was turned to be their enemy, and He fought against them."

Isaiah 11:2, 5, 10 King James Version (KJV)

² And the spirit of the LORD shall rest upon Him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the LORD; ⁵ And righteousness shall be the girdle of His loins, and faithfulness the girdle of His reins. ¹⁰ And in that day there shall be a root of Jesse, which shall stand for an ensign of the people; to it shall the Gentiles seek: and His rest shall be glorious.

In the Love class, the next nine are from Galatians 5:22-23. They include 1) love, 2) joy, 3) peace, 4) longsuffering, 5) gentleness, 6) goodness, 7) faith, 8) meekness, and 9) temperance.

Yielding to Holy Spirit, there is both protection and preservation. God's seal of endorsement rests upon both Jesus Christ and Holy Spirit. Therefore, the fruit of the Spirit that is in you as well as operates through you is sealed making you supernaturally impenetrable as well. That is similar to coating fruit with natural wax to protect it from rotting. Then His fruitfulness can be clearly tasted and seen that the Lord is good indeed.

Ephesians 4:30 counsels us to not grieve Holy Spirit, so He won't lose any opportunity to fully express Himself through us. "And grieve not the Holy Spirit of God, whereby ye are sealed unto the day of redemption."

Galatians 5:22-23 King James Version (KJV)

²² But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, ²³ Meekness, temperance: against such there is no law.

In the Power class, the remaining nine are from I Corinthians 12:8-11. They encompass 1) the word of wisdom [different from wisdom], 2) the word of knowledge, 3) the gift of faith [different from the fruit of faith], 4) the gifts of healing, 5) the working of miracles, 6) prophecy, 7) discerning of spirits, 8) divers kinds of tongues, and 9) interpretation of tongues.

Walking softly before the Lord helps you to discern the move of Holy Spirit to ensure what God has designed can never be extinguished.

Live so you never think His divine intervention is an unscheduled interruption you take the option to reject. 1 Thessalonians 5:19 instructs us with these words, "Quench not the Spirit."

1 Corinthians 12:4-11 King James Version (KJV)

⁴ Now there are diversities of gifts, but the same Spirit. ⁵ And there are differences of administrations, but the same Lord. ⁶ And there are diversities of operations, but it is the same God which worketh all in all. ⁷ But the manifestation of the Spirit is given to every man to profit withal. ⁸ For to one is given by the Spirit the word of wisdom; to another the word of knowledge by the same Spirit; ⁹ To another faith by the same Spirit; to another the gifts of healing by the same Spirit; ¹⁰ To another the working of miracles; to another prophecy; to another discerning of spirits; to another divers kinds of tongues; to another the interpretation of tongues: ¹¹ But all these worketh that one and the selfsame Spirit, dividing to every man severally as He will.

DEVELOPING INTIMACY WITH ABBA FATHER AS HIS FAVORITE

I will share my perception of having a secure and mature relationship with Abba Father. I was born third out of four siblings. At one time or another, I was repositioned as the oldest, the youngest, the middle, and even the only. I even carried the tormenting thought that I had been adopted until I was around age eighteen.

Although both my parents and all my siblings were present in our home, I emotionally abandoned them all. I felt I never belonged to the point that I dreaded the day my parents would come and tell me they were not my birth parents at all. What should have been a clue to me that I believed fabricated evidence appearing real is that I was certain my Mom's mother, "Big-Ma" was my grandmother indeed. That is what occurs when satan's deception takes deep root in the soil of your heart.

Unfortunately, that stronghold of abandonment did not help me to enjoy a close-knit relationship with Abba who desired to be my loving Heavenly Father. Many times, I would abandon Him or have thoughts He had abandoned me. Until the Spirit of God and the Word of God transformed from the inside, out, the absolute truth I absolutely trusted changed everything else. I no longer believe the lie I told myself was truth.

Since Holy Spirit has healed my insecurities supernaturally, my story has been uniquely transformed. I now realize retaining emotional health is just as important as receiving your inner healing initially. Holy Spirit can cure any insecurity that may be agitating and aggravating you and/or others knowingly or unknowingly.

The presence and power of Holy Spirit can keep you in a state of living curative before Abba. Dr. Roy Hicks' book entitled, "Healing your Insecurities" is spiritually empowered to help you receive your complete inner healing in nine significant areas.

Now I am convinced that Abba graciously adopted me into His family through Jesus' finished work on Calvary. I rest satisfied knowing I am Abba's favorite. Yes, our Heavenly Father's favorite! You are His favorite too! In the Greek language, the word "elect" from Romans 8:33 is interpreted as "favorite."

Since the Holy Bible confirmed your status as a favorite, you might as well get familiar with who you are to your Heavenly Father too. Say aloud, "Abba Father, I am Your favorite! I know as I am known by the love of God! Thank you, Jesus!" If you have any problem articulating your divine standing, keep saying it over and over again aloud until you are totally convinced in your heart.

Romans 8:33 New King James Version (NKJV)

³³Who shall bring a charge against God's elect? *It is* God who justifies.

John 17:23 even testifies that Abba Father loves you just as much as He loves Jesus. Jesus' indisputable testimony verifies your preferred status as God's favorite even in His prayer to Abba. This indicates Jesus who was the only begotten Son of God selflessly shared His right of sonship with you, that's non-gender specific.

Because of that, Jesus is now the firstborn among many brothers and sisters, which includes you. Holy Spirit enlarged Jesus' womb through the tomb as our Everlasting Father on earth. That brought about multiple births better known as the family of God, which includes you.

John 17:23 King James Version (KJV)

²³I in them, and thou in me, that they may be made perfect in one; and that the world may know that thou hast sent me, and hast loved them, as thou hast loved me.

David's testimony of his assurance of God's presence is recorded in Psalm 27:9-10. He was certain of being adopted by Abba Father. David was just as sure that God would never abandon him, even when his earthly parents physically or even emotionally had.

You too can rest satisfied in having an intimate relationship with God, no matter the presence and/or absence of anyone else. Make a practice of daily meditating on the promises of God whereby you expect to reside in His presence 24/7/365 and 366 days in a leap year.

Psalm 27:9-10 Amplified Bible, Classic Edition

⁹ Hide not Your face from me; turn not Your servant away in anger, You Who have been my help! Cast me not off, neither forsake me, O God of my salvation!

¹⁰ Although my father and my mother have forsaken me, yet the Lord will take me up [adopt me as His child].

Isaiah 65:24 is one of God's vowed promises to you. Abba Father is awaiting the express opportunity to answer your prayers favorably. He is committed to answering you even before you call Him. He is even ready to deliver the answer at the same time you begin to convey the secret petition of your heart or voice-activate the first word of your request.

Isaiah 65:24 King James Version (KJV)

²⁴ And it shall come to pass, that before they call, I will answer; and while they are yet speaking, I will hear.
