### The Tsunami Blessing Inside and Out, Part 321 Scriptures

This is Section AH of a multi-part instruction. The only ones who have the right to claim Preeminent Domain is Elohim and those who were called and elected to inherit and inhabit the earth, i.e., every member of the Body of Christ. Build your capacity to receive the exceeding, abundantly, above all that you can imagine through the Word of God and the Spirit of God.

Recognize you are heavily endorsed and reinforced by the kingdom of God that is already within you. Always remain in the position of honor and humility before the Lord. Realize you are supernaturally endowed with exousia authority and dunamis power. Release your God-given dominion to work in you at the fullest strength to govern the earth by faith. Recover all lost, stolen, and destroyed territory and take new ground.

Enlarge your territory to bring Heaven to Earth. Enlarge your heart to receive God's vision and provision. Enlarge your mouth over the enemy and give him no room to cause any division. Make it impossible for satan to ever breach your property line. Be the triple threat that employs: 1) the Word of God, both logos and rhema; 2) the blood of the Lamb; and 3) the name of Jesus.

Jesus' the only begotten Son of God entry into the earth as the Son of Man

Before Jesus departed heaven, He was perfectly convinced He was the only begotten Son of God. He was prepared for the work He was to finish on earth even from the foundation of the world. He knew His perfect sacrifice unto God was required to save the entire world from sin.

Destined to be our Redeemer, His broken body and spilled blood would pay the total price to reconcile us back to Abba. Jesus' finished work would give Abba the desire of His heart. That was to not just have one Son alone but to embrace an entire family, which includes you.

In heaven, Jesus absolutely knew He was God's only begotten Son. Born into the world, the Spirit of God and the Word of God perfectly relayed to Jesus everything required for Him to have perfect recall. From that vantage point, Jesus was absolutely sure Abba was His Heavenly Father at twelve years old, which is just one year shy of being considered an adult as observed by the Jewish culture.

There was not one detail that could have taken Jesus by surprise. Being reacquainted with His Heavenly Father, Jesus remained passionate about the vision that resonated in His heart. He never allowed anyone or anything to talk Him out of His calling and election. He knew without a shadow of a doubt, Jesus who He was, is, and always will be to God indeed. Therefore, Jesus had, hosted, and held on to the mind of Christ, His very intellect as given to Him by Abba.

Jesus was even bold enough to perfectly express it to His earthly parents, Joseph and Mary. Why? Jesus' uninterrupted fellowship with His Heavenly Father caused Him to know as He was known by the love of God. He knew it was the absolute truth He could absolutely trust because of His intimacy with His Heavenly Father, Abba even on earth.

Now let's ponder on the events that occurred with Jesus' transition into the earth. Jesus was procreated as the seed of His Heavenly Father into Mary's womb by Holy Spirit. Growing up Jesus had to become familiar with Abba but this time as a spirit with a soul in a body. Jesus' entry into the world was exactly like every human being, except for Him being initially downloaded from heaven by faith without the natural sperm of a mortal man.

Abba's incorruptible seed impregnated Mary's womb through the dunamis power of Holy Spirit through the logos Word of God and the rhéma Word of God. As a baby, Jesus knew nothing about His divine pedigree. Every bit of wisdom, knowledge, understanding, and revelation Jesus was once proficient in practicing perfectly in heaven, was now hidden within His DNA.

Jesus had to reconnect to God as His Abba Father to retrieve His earthly assignment and agenda. Jesus accurately downloaded His calling and election through the leadership of the Spirit of God and the lens of the logos Word of God and the rhéma Word of God.

Consider the following as Jesus' scenario: Although as the eternal Son of God who resided in heaven, He temporarily served as the Son of man on earth. Jesus' perfect union with Abba was restored to hear and listen to and for the voice of God perfectly. That is how Jesus downloaded revealed truth.

Jesus' perfect union with Abba Father was renewed and revived so He recognized and realized the voice of God perfectly. One online research disclosed when a baby fetus starts to hear. "Around eighteen weeks of pregnancy, your little one hears their very first sounds. By twenty-four weeks, those little ears are rapidly developing. Your baby's sensitivity to sound will improve even more as the weeks pass."

Can you imagine our Heavenly Father already knowing that since Elohim created every human being on earth? Likewise, can you envision our Heavenly Father having the unfair advantage to ensure Jesus even in Mary's womb heard His tender, loving voice before anyone else? Ever so softly, Abba whispers to Jesus, "Yeshuah, Yeshuah, this is Abba, your Heavenly Father!!!"

Even now, I can hear Abba wooing me with His soft voice, "Kathryn Joy Yeshuah, this is Abba, your Heavenly Father!!!" Now, can you visualize our Heavenly Father having pursued you in your mother's womb and even now to unfold your destiny that is in your DNA? Webster's 1828 edition defines destiny "invincible necessity." In other words, the other way your destiny cannot happen is if you are a no-show. Stay fixed to the end so you can see just who God recreated you to be, His masterpiece, never just a piece of work.

God putting His name upon you invokes His blessing upon you

Numbers 6:22-27, (KJV) <sup>22</sup> And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying, <sup>23</sup> Speak unto Aaron and unto his sons, saying, On this wise ye shall bless the children of Israel, saying unto them, <sup>24</sup> The LORD bless thee, and keep thee: <sup>25</sup> The LORD make his face shine upon thee, and be gracious unto thee: <sup>26</sup> The LORD lift up his countenance upon thee, and give thee peace.<sup>27</sup> And they shall put my name upon the children of Israel, and I will bless them.

You may remember that when God pronounced His blessing over Israel that He concluded it with "And they shall put My name upon the children of Israel, and I will bless them," Numbers 6:27, (KJV). The word "put" in Hebrew from the aforementioned verse is "sum or sim" which is literally defined as "to put, place, set. Figuratively, put means to set, ordain, establish, found, appoint, constitute, make, determine, fix."

Jesus was ever so proud to wear His Heavenly Father's name on His, Yeshuah, i.e., Yeshua and Hei. Acknowledged in the book of Revelation, the third chapter records the One who has the key of David. It is Jesus who reveals the truth behind the newness of life in heaven to the Apostle John in verse 12.

Jesus will write God's name on each overcomer and the name of the city of God, the New Jerusalem. But Jesus didn't stop there. Jesus also disclosed that He would write His new name too. That helps us all to better understand that Jesus is our Heavenly Father's name indeed because Abba is never mentioned as receiving a new name.

Otherwise, why Jesus would need to have a new name at all? That verifies God put His own name on Jesus, *Yeshuah*. Scripturally certified, the name of Jesus is forever sovereign in heaven, in earth, and under the earth. Thus, Abba ordained Jesus to wear His surname in all three spheres of influence. That is why when we decree or declare, we are authorized to use the name of Jesus.

Revelation 3:12, New American Standard Bible 1995

12 He who overcomes, I will make him a pillar in the temple of My God, and he will not go out from it anymore; and I will write on him the name of My God, and the name of the city of My God, the new Jerusalem, which comes down out of heaven from My God, and My new name.

From Joseph and Mary's initial response to Jesus announcing God as His Heavenly Father, they never mentioned anything to Jesus about His divine pedigree. That is your confirmation of the absolute truth you can absolutely trust as well. Now Holy Spirit is your source, supply, and surplus who will give you perfect recall of God's design for your destiny on earth. What is written in your book in heaven's chronicles, Holy Spirit will teach you just as He coached Jesus to acclimate to Abba, His Father in heaven.

Beforehand, Jesus even knew He would give His unquestionable testimony as the Resurrection and the Life for the Apostle John to author the book of Revelation. His Resurrection conquered His Crucifixion indeed. "I am He that liveth, and was dead; and, behold, I am alive for evermore, Amen; and have the keys of hell and of death," Revelation 1:18.

Jesus realized in heaven He was "...the Lamb slain from the foundation of the world" as Revelation 13:8 quotes. Moreover, He relied on Holy Spirit to remind Him of His destiny to be fulfilled on earth. Holy Spirit revealed to Jesus that He was the only begotten Son of God in heaven. Also, that Jesus came to earth to give His life as the Savior for the whole world.

At the close of His earthly life and ministry, Jesus sacrificially paved the way for Abba, Father to have the family He always desired. Jesus served as our Everlasting Father on earth who gave our Heavenly Father the right of adoption. That is when Jesus became the firstborn among many brothers and sisters. God has chosen you as His adopted son or His adopted daughter from the foundation of the world as well. Therefore, you were never an afterthought in the heart of Abba, Father. That is your confirmation of the absolute truth you can absolutely trust too.

Holding the express honor as the Son of God, Jesus humbled Himself to fulfill His divine purpose, plan, and path as the Son of man. In essence, Jesus stripped Himself of all the glory, honor and majesty God adorned Him with as the only begotten Son of God to accomplish God's divine assignment on earth as the Son of man.

Jesus, the Mastering Son of God became the Ministering Servant for God. Philippians 2:5-11 illustrates just how God honored Jesus' humility. That gives us a bona fide example of how to live honorably in the presence of the Lord in all humility. You are wearing God's name too.

<sup>5</sup> Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus: <sup>6</sup> Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God: <sup>7</sup> But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men: <sup>8</sup> And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross. <sup>9</sup> Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name: <sup>10</sup> That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth;

<sup>11</sup> And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

<sup>14</sup> And God said to Moses, I Am Who I Am *and* What I Am, *and* I WILL BE WHAT I WILL BE; and He said, You shall say this to the Israelites: I Am has sent me to you!

<sup>15</sup> God said also to Moses, This shall you say to the Israelites: The Lord, the God of your fathers, of Abraham, of Isaac, and of Jacob, has sent me to you! This is My <sup>[a]</sup>name forever, and by this name I am to be remembered to all generations.

Exodus 3:15 To know the name of God is to witness the manifestation of those attributes and apprehend that character which the name denotes (Exod. 6:3; I Kings 8:33ff.; Ps. 91:14; Isa. 52:6; 64:2; Jer. 16:21) (John D. Davis, *A Dictionary of the Bible*). God's name is His self-revelation (Charles Ellicott, *A Bible Commentary*). The name signifies the active presence of the person in the fullness of the revealed character (J.D. Douglas et al., eds., *The New Bible Dictionary*).

¹ And all the congregation of the children of Israel journeyed from the wilderness of Sin, after their journeys, according to the commandment of the LORD, and pitched in Rephidim: and there was no water for the people to drink. ² Wherefore the people did chide with Moses, and said, Give us water that we may drink. And Moses said unto them, Why chide ye with me? wherefore do ye tempt the LORD? ³ And the people thirsted there for water; and the people murmured against Moses, and said, Wherefore is this that thou hast brought us up out of Egypt, to kill us and our children and our cattle with thirst? ⁴ And Moses cried unto the LORD, saying, What shall I do unto this people? they be almost ready to stone me. ⁵ And the LORD said unto Moses, Go on before the people, and take with thee of the elders of

### Gideon called that place Jehovahshalom, Yahweh is completeness, soundness, welfare, peace

Judges 6:23-24, Amplified Bible

<sup>23</sup> The LORD said to him, "Peace to you, do not be afraid; you shall not die." <sup>24</sup> Then Gideon built an altar there to the LORD and named it The LORD is Peace. To this day it is still in Ophrah, of the Abiezrites.

Judges 6:1-24, (KJV)

<sup>1</sup> And the children of Israel did evil in the sight of the LORD: and the LORD delivered them into the hand of Midian seven years. <sup>2</sup> And the hand of Midian prevailed against Israel: and because of the Midianites the children of Israel made them the dens which are in the mountains, and caves, and strong holds. <sup>3</sup> And so it was, when Israel had sown, that the Midianites came up, and the Amalekites, and the children of the east, even they came up against them; <sup>4</sup> And they encamped against them, and destroyed the increase of the earth, till thou come unto Gaza, and left no sustenance for Israel, neither sheep, nor ox, nor ass. <sup>5</sup> For they came up with their cattle and their tents, and they came as grasshoppers for multitude; for both they and their camels were without number: and they entered into the land to destroy it. <sup>6</sup> And Israel was greatly impoverished because of the Midianites; and the children of Israel cried unto the LORD. <sup>7</sup> And it came to pass, when the children of Israel cried unto the LORD because of the Midianites, 8 That the LORD sent a prophet unto the children of Israel, which said unto them, Thus saith the LORD God of Israel, I brought you up from Egypt, and brought you forth out of the house of bondage; 9 And I delivered you out of the hand of the Egyptians, and out of the hand of all that oppressed you, and drave them out from before you, and gave you their land; 10 And I said unto you, I am the LORD your God; fear not the gods of the Amorites, in whose land ye dwell: but ye have not obeyed my voice. 11 And there came an angel of

the LORD, and sat under an oak which was in Ophrah, that pertained unto Joash the Abiezrite: and his son Gideon threshed wheat by the winepress, to hide it from the Midianites. 12 And the angel of the LORD appeared unto him, and said unto him, The LORD is with thee, thou mighty man of valour. 13 And Gideon said unto him, Oh my Lord, if the LORD be with us, why then is all this befallen us? and where be all his miracles which our fathers told us of, saying, Did not the LORD bring us up from Egypt? but now the LORD hath forsaken us, and delivered us into the hands of the Midianites. 14 And the LORD looked upon him, and said, Go in this thy might, and thou shalt save Israel from the hand of the Midianites: have not I sent thee? 15 And he said unto him, Oh my Lord, wherewith shall I save Israel? behold, my family is poor in Manasseh, and I am the least in my father's house. 16 And the LORD said unto him, Surely I will be with thee, and thou shalt smite the Midianites as one man. <sup>17</sup> And he said unto him, If now I have found grace in thy sight, then shew me a sign that thou talkest with me. <sup>18</sup> Depart not hence, I pray thee, until I come unto thee, and bring forth my present, and set it before thee. And he said, I will tarry until thou come again. 19 And Gideon went in, and made ready a kid, and unleavened cakes of an ephah of flour: the flesh he put in a basket, and he put the broth in a pot, and brought it out unto him under the oak, and presented it. 20 And the angel of God said unto him, Take the flesh and the unleavened cakes, and lay them upon this rock, and pour out the broth. And he did so. <sup>21</sup> Then the angel of the LORD put forth the end of the staff that was in his hand, and touched the flesh and the unleavened cakes; and there rose up fire out of the rock, and consumed the flesh and the unleavened cakes. Then the angel of the LORD departed out of his sight. 22 And when Gideon perceived that he was an angel of the LORD, Gideon said, Alas, O LORD God! for because I have seen an angel of the LORD face to face. <sup>23</sup> And the LORD said unto him, Peace be unto thee; fear not: thou shalt not die. 24 Then Gideon built an altar there

unto the LORD, and called it **Jehovahshalom**: unto this day it is yet in Ophrah of the Abiezrites.
