

The Tsunami Blessing Inside and Out, Part 333 Scriptures

This is Section B of a multi-part instruction. Dominion grants you the authority and power over satan and his entire kingdom. It is where everything is under your feet, never over your head. Don't permit the enemy to talk you out of your God-ordained reign. Always deny the defeated foe the right to rule over you and your territory.

Heaven is God's throne and earth is His footstool. Jesus, the Great Shepherd prepares the table before you in the presence of your captured enemies. Although the enemy may be near, not even once can he dine with Jesus and you. Since God already judged satan i.e., condemned and punished, he is forced to serve as your footstool.

Live relentlessly about treading down the wicked. Wearing Abba's boots of peace, God crushes satan into irreconcilable pieces under your feet in the name of Jesus. Under no circumstances give the devil any wiggle room. Keep your feet on the neck of the enemy at all times. The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, our Conqueror ignites you to arise as more than a conqueror through Him who loves you.

The devil looks for access through unguarded areas. Ecclesiastes 10:8 (KJV) confirms his stratagem is to stay focused on biting, not breaching. Once satan bites, then he can steal, kill, and/or destroy if you give him your territory. The enemy lusts for anyone to give him the breakthrough. "He that diggeth a pit shall fall into it; and whoso breaketh an hedge, a serpent shall bite him."

1 Samuel 30:1-8, (TLB)

¹ Three days later, when David and his men arrived home at their city of Ziklag, they found that the Amalekites had raided the city and burned it to the ground, ² carrying off all the women and children. ³ As David and his men looked at the ruins and realized what had happened to their families, ⁴ they wept until they could weep no more. ⁵ (David's two wives, Ahinoam and Abigail, were among those who had been captured.) ⁶ David

was seriously worried, for in their bitter grief for their children, his men began talking of killing him. But David took strength from the Lord.

¹⁷ The words of wise men are heard in quiet more than the cry of him that ruleth among fools.

⁵ If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, that giveth to all men liberally, and upbraideth not; and it shall be given him.

¹³ Who is a wise man and endued with knowledge among you? let him shew out of a good conversation his works with meekness of wisdom.

Refuse the wisdom of the world with the mind of Christ, the very intellect of Jesus

1 Corinthians 1:19-21, (TLB)

¹⁹ For God says, "I will destroy all human plans of salvation no matter how wise they seem to be, and ignore the best ideas of men, even the most brilliant of them." ²⁰ So what about these wise men, these scholars, these brilliant debaters of this world's great affairs? God has made them all look foolish and shown their wisdom to be useless nonsense. ²¹ For God in his wisdom saw to it that the world would never find God through human brilliance, and then he stepped in and saved all those who believed his message, which the world calls foolish and silly.

1 Corinthians 2:1-8, (TLB)

¹ Dear brothers, even when I first came to you I didn't use lofty words and brilliant ideas to tell you God's message. ² For I decided that I would speak only of Jesus Christ and his death on the cross. ³ I came to you in weakness—timid and trembling. ⁴ And my preaching was very plain, not with a lot of oratory and human wisdom, but the Holy Spirit's power was in my words, proving to those who heard them that the message was from God. ⁵ I did this because I wanted your faith to stand firmly upon God, not on man's great ideas. ⁶ Yet when I am among mature Christians I do speak with words of great wisdom, but not the kind that comes from here on earth, and not the kind that appeals to the great men of this world, who are doomed to fall. ⁷ Our words are wise because they are from God, telling of God's wise plan to bring us into the glories of heaven. This plan was hidden in former times, though it was made for our benefit before the world began. ⁸ But the great men of the world have not understood it; if they had, they never would have crucified the Lord of Glory.

1 Corinthians 3:18-20, (TLB)

¹⁸ Stop fooling yourselves. If you count yourself above average in intelligence, as judged by this world's standards, you had better put this all aside and be a fool rather than let it hold you back from the true wisdom from above. ¹⁹ For the wisdom of this world is foolishness to God. As it says in the book of Job, God uses man's own brilliance to trap him; he stumbles over his own "wisdom" and falls. ²⁰ And again, in the book of Psalms, we are told that the Lord knows full well how the human mind reasons and how foolish and futile it is.

The Wisdom of God always mirrors and models the mind of Christ, the very intellect of Jesus

Proverbs 8, (KJV)

¹ Doth not wisdom cry? and understanding put forth her voice? ² She standeth in the top of high places, by the way in the places of the paths. ³ She crieth at the gates, at the entry of the city, at the coming in at the doors. ⁴ Unto you, O men, I call; and my voice is to the sons of man. ⁵ O ye simple, understand wisdom: and, ye fools, be ye of an understanding heart. ⁶ Hear; for I will speak of excellent things; and the opening of my lips shall be right things. ⁷ For my mouth shall speak truth; and wickedness is an abomination to my lips. ⁸ All the words of my mouth are in righteousness; there is nothing froward or perverse in them. ⁹ They are all plain to him that understandeth, and right to them that find knowledge. ¹⁰ Receive my instruction, and not silver; and knowledge rather than choice gold. ¹¹ For wisdom is better than rubies; and all the things that may be desired are not to be compared to it. ¹² I wisdom dwell with prudence, and find out knowledge of witty inventions. ¹³ The fear of the LORD is to hate evil: pride, and arrogancy, and the evil way, and the froward mouth, do I hate.

¹⁴ Counsel is mine, and sound wisdom: I am understanding; I have strength.
¹⁵ By me kings reign, and princes decree justice. ¹⁶ By me princes rule, and nobles, even all the judges of the earth. ¹⁷ I love them that love me; and those that seek me early shall find me. ¹⁸ Riches and honour are with me; yea, durable riches and righteousness. ¹⁹ My fruit is better than gold, yea, than fine gold; and my revenue than choice silver. ²⁰ I lead in the way of righteousness, in the midst of the paths of judgment: ²¹ That I may cause those that love me to inherit substance; and I will fill their treasures.
²² The LORD possessed me in the beginning of his way, before his works of old. ²³ I was set up from everlasting, from the beginning, or ever the earth was. ²⁴ When there were no depths, I was brought forth; when there were no fountains abounding with water.

²⁵ Before the mountains were settled, before the hills was I brought forth:
²⁶ While as yet he had not made the earth, nor the fields, nor the highest part of the dust of the world. ²⁷ When he prepared the heavens, I was there: when he set a compass upon the face of the depth: ²⁸ When he established the clouds above: when he strengthened the fountains of the deep: ²⁹ When he gave to the sea his decree, that the waters should not pass his commandment: when he appointed the foundations of the earth: ³⁰ Then I was by him, as one brought up with him: and I was daily his delight, rejoicing always before him; ³¹ Rejoicing in the habitable part of his earth; and my delights were with the sons of men. ³² Now therefore hearken unto me, O ye children: for blessed are they that keep my ways. ³³ Hear instruction, and be wise, and refuse it not. ³⁴ Blessed is the man that heareth me, watching daily at my gates, waiting at the posts of my doors.
³⁵ For whoso findeth me findeth life, and shall obtain favour of the LORD.
³⁶ But he that sinneth against me wrongeth his own soul: all they that hate me love death.

⁷ Wisdom is the principal thing; therefore get wisdom: and with all thy getting get understanding. ⁸ Exalt her, and she shall promote thee: she shall bring thee to honour, when thou dost embrace her. ⁹ She shall give to thine head an ornament of grace: a crown of glory shall she deliver to thee.

Psalms 25:12-14, (TLB)

¹² Where is the man who fears the Lord? God will teach him how to choose the best. ¹³ He shall live within God's circle of blessing, and his children shall inherit the earth. ¹⁴ Friendship with God is reserved for those who reverence him. With them alone he shares the secrets of his promises.

Accessibility - **THE MASTER OF SURVEILLANCE**

If you are going to always win and never lose, decide to always stand ready to supernaturally resist any battle at the onset. In author Sun Tau's book "The Art of War," he explores the importance of military prowess. He acknowledges the following four strategies.

First, if you know yourself and know your enemy, you will always win. Secondly, if you don't know yourself or your enemy, you will always lose every time. Thirdly, even if you know yourself but don't know your enemy, you will still lose. And lastly, if you don't know yourself, but know the enemy, you will still lose.

The above scenarios remain true not only in natural combat where you know yourself and know your enemy but also in spiritual warfare. Begin to expect, embrace, experience, and enjoy supernatural military success as well. Superimpose the following paradigm for winning every battle, every time. When you know God, you will always win, and satan will always lose. When you know God, you will never lose, and satan will never win. That is a breachproof breakthrough.

Never forget no matter how much you may think you know about yourself or the enemy, if you don't know God you will lose the battle that has already been won for you by Jesus Christ. You are more than a conqueror through Christ who loved you so much that He did not leave you without a Savior. Now you can live undefeated through Jesus because He is forever the Conqueror over satan; that includes principalities; powers; spiritual wickedness in high places; rulers of darkness of this world; anti-Christ; and the false prophets.

Be resolved that you will not be your own worst enemy. To do that, stay open to truly knowing yourself as God recreated you to be in Jesus Christ. Also, surrender the right of way to the Spirit of God and to the Word of God to assist you in discovering what you can't see yet.

Each life experience has the potential to change us for the better or even for the worse. You can become haughty because of having success or become humiliated after experiencing a failure. In some cases, you may not be able to even discern the damage. You may be surprised when you discover that you do not know the absolute truth about yourself that you can absolutely trust. Align with your design. God desires you to know as you are known by His love.
