

The Tsunami Blessing Inside and Out, Part 334 Scriptures

This is Section C of a multi-part instruction. Dominion grants you the authority and power over satan and his entire kingdom. It is where everything is under your feet, never over your head. Don't permit the enemy to talk you out of your God-ordained reign. Always deny the defeated foe the right to rule over you and your territory.

Heaven is God's throne and earth is His footstool. Jesus, the Great Shepherd prepares the table before you in the presence of your captured enemies. Although the enemy may be near, not even once can he dine with Jesus and you. Since God already judged satan i.e., condemned and punished, he is forced to serve as your footstool.

Live relentlessly about treading down the wicked. Wearing Abba's boots of peace, God crushes satan into irreconcilable pieces under your feet in the name of Jesus. Under no circumstances give the devil any wiggle room. Keep your feet on the neck of the enemy at all times. The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, our Conqueror ignites you to arise as more than a conqueror through Him who loves you.

Boots on the Ground

When someone arrives home, footwear may be the first item to slip out of. However, engaged in spiritual warfare, the whole armor must be worn at all times, including your feet "studded with hobnails" that carry the gospel of peace. If you just happen to put your feet up, make sure the enemy is your footstool. That is the prepared table in the presence of your enemies Jesus Christ already set for you. The defeated foe may be in the vicinity but is seized, shut up, and sealed up. You are more than a conqueror. God has already given you the victory that causes you to always triumph. Take dominion and keep satan subdued!

Royal Bloodline Dominion

Created: "What is man, that Thou art mindful of him? and the son of man, that Thou visitest him? For Thou hast made him a little lower than the angels [Elohim], and hast crowned him with glory and honour. Thou madest

him to have dominion over the works of Thy hands; Thou hast put all things under his feet: All sheep and oxen, yea, and the beasts of the field; The fowl of the air, and the fish of the sea, and whatsoever passeth through the paths of the seas,” Ps. 8:4-8. Confirmed: “Yes” returned Jesus, “I was watching and saw satan fall from heaven like a flash of lightning! It is true that I have given you the power to tread on snakes and scorpions and to overcome all the enemy’s power—there is nothing at all that can do you any harm. Yet it is not your power over evil spirits which should give such joy, but the fact that your names are written in Heaven,” Lu 10:18-20 (Phillips). Conquered: “Thou shalt tread upon the lion and adder: the young lion and the dragon shalt thou trample under feet,” Ps. 91:13. Don’t run! Don’t hide. Set your feet to defeat!

THE CHAIN OF COMMAND REALIZES KINGDOM OF GOD DOMINION

Authority in Jesus’ possession: “I am He that liveth, and was dead; and, behold, I am alive for evermore, Amen; and have the keys of hell and of death,” Rev. 1:18 (KJV). God’s designated authority to Jesus: “Thou hast put all things in subjection under His feet. For in that He put all in subjection under Him, He left nothing that is not put under Him. But now we see not yet all things put under Him. But we see Jesus, who was made a little lower than the angels [Elohim] for the suffering of death, crowned with glory and honour; that He by the grace of God should taste death for every man,” Heb. 2:8-9 (KJV). Jesus’ assignment fulfilled: “Forasmuch then as the children are partakers of flesh and blood, He also Himself likewise took part of the same; that through death He might destroy [*katargeó* to render inoperable; abolish] him that had the power of death, that is, the devil; And

deliver [*apallassó* – to remove or release] them who through fear of death were all their lifetime subject to bondage,” Heb. 2:14-15 (KJV). “He that committeth sin is of the devil; for the devil sinneth from the beginning. For this purpose the Son of God was manifested, that He might destroy [*luó* – to undo, loose, annul] the works of the devil,” 1 John 3:8 (KJV). Jesus’ delegated authority surrendered to God: “Then cometh the end, when He shall have delivered up the kingdom to God, even the Father; when He shall have put down all rule and all authority and power. For He must reign, till He hath put all enemies under His feet. The last enemy that shall be destroyed is death. For He hath put all things under His feet. But when He saith all things are put under Him, it is manifest that He is excepted, which did put all things under Him,” 1 Cor. 15:24-27 (KJV). Jesus’ conferred authority to you: “Heal the sick, cleanse the lepers, raise the dead, cast out devils: freely ye have received, freely give,” Mat. 10:8 (KJV).

The same time God cursed the serpent, satan, He also blessed mankind with the promise of triumph through Jesus. “And the Lord God said to the serpent, Because you have done this, you are cursed above all [domestic] animals and above every [wild] living thing of the field; upon your belly you shall go, and you shall eat dust [and what it contains] all the days of your life. And I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and her Offspring; He will bruise *and* tread your head underfoot, and you will lie in wait *and* bruise His heel,” Gen. 3:14-15 (AMPC). 2019 CNN news report: “Snakes had back legs for 70 million years before losing them, new fossil shows. Snake evolution has intrigued scientists for years because they knew that these complex vertebrates once had limbs and adapted over time to live without them in dramatic fashion. Over the years, theories have suggested that these limbs were merely a transient phase

before snakes quickly adapted to their current limbless form. But newly discovered and well-preserved fossils of snakes, particularly snake skulls, suggest they had back legs for an extended period,” according to a new study published Wednesday in the Science Advances journal. “Our findings support the idea that the ancestors of modern snakes were big-bodied and big-mouthed – instead of small burrowing forms as previously thought,” Fernando Garberoglio in a statement, Fundación Azara at Universidad Maimónides, in Buenos Aires, AR. “The study also reveals that early snakes retained their hind limbs for an extended period of time before the origin of modern snakes which are for the most part, completely limbless.” “Yahweh said to my Lord, the Messiah: Sit with Me as enthroned Ruler while I subdue your every enemy. BOOTS ON THE GROUND ALWAYS BRING THE KINGDOM OF GOD PEACE

Jesus is the Prince of Peace: “For unto us a Child is born, unto us a Son is given: and the government shall be upon His shoulder: and His name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace. Of the increase of His government and peace there shall be no end, upon the throne of David, and upon His kingdom, to order it, and to establish it with judgment and with justice from henceforth even forever. The zeal of the LORD of hosts will perform this,” Isaiah 9:6-7 (KJV). God is the Author of Peace: “And the God of peace shall bruise satan under your feet shortly [hastily]. The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you. Amen,” Romans 16:20 (KJV). Your armor-activating peace: “and having strapped on YOUR FEET THE GOSPEL OF PEACE IN PREPARATION [to face the enemy with firm-footed stability and the readiness produced by the good news],” Ephesians 6:15 (AMP). Footnotes: “A reference to the Roman soldiers’ shoes

which were studded with hobnails to give them stability on the battlefield.”

A hobnail is a short heavy-headed nail to reinforce the soles of the boots. It is a nail with a large head.

A song. A Psalm of David.

¹ O God, my heart is fixed (steadfast, in the confidence of faith); I will sing, yes, I will sing praises, even with my glory [all the faculties and powers of one created in Your image]! ² Awake, harp and lyre; I myself will wake very early—I will waken the dawn! ³ I will praise *and* give thanks to You, O Lord, among the peoples; and I will sing praises unto You among the nations.

⁴ For Your mercy *and* loving-kindness are great *and* high as the heavens!
