"Christ hath redeemed us from the curse of the law, being made a curse for us: fo<mark>r it is written,</mark> Cursed is every one that hangeth on a tree: That the blessing of Abraham might come on the Gentiles through Jesus Christ; that we might receive the promise of the Spirit through faith," Gal. 3:13-14. Jesus already redeemed your life from the curse of the law. Being made a curse for you, Jesus gave you ample room to receive the blessing of Abraham. What God has blessed, no one can curse. YOU ARE IN THE BLOODLINE OF JUDAH TOO BECAUSE OF JESUS CHRIST

Take a closer look at the prayer of Jabez beginning with his mother's state of being. Any trauma or drama while Jabez was still in her womb and/or the time of his delivery could have instigated his condition. "And Jabez was more honourable than his brethren: and his mother called his name Jabez, saying, Because I bare him with sorrow. And Jabez called on the God of Israel, saying, Oh that Thou wouldest bless me indeed, and enlarge my coast, and that Thine hand might be with me, and that Thou wouldest keep me from evil, that it may not grieve me! And God granted him that which he requested," 1 Chron. 4:9-10. Knowing birth names carry an offspring's distinction, she was quite unsettled to destine her baby boy "sorrow." 1828 Webster's dictionary defines sorrow as: "the uneasiness or pain of mind which is produced by the loss of any good; or of frustrated hopes of good, or expected loss of happiness; to grieve; to be sad." Everything that happened to Jabez's mother could have potentially affected him as well because he grieved. Not just being labeled "sorrow," but potentially his spirit, soul, and/or body could have been distressed. I believe Jabez could have suffered prenatal wounds that just don't go away after the delivery, triggering arrested development, dramatically or discreetly. Honorable in Hebrew is polar opposite. One side expresses being "glorified" and on the other side, "grave." Before Jabez prayed, he knew his life inside and out was cursed, not blessed. Grief can persist if not settled even up to two decades. Jabez refused to stay the same. Intuitively, he knew he was bigger than it because His God was bigger than all things. Jabez received revealed truth that the larger his territory, the greater his options. After all, Jabez was a descendant from the tribe of Judah. Jacob pronounced this blessing over Judah. "Judah, thou art he whom thy brethren shall praise: thy hand shall be in the neck of thine enemies; thy father's children shall bow down before thee. Judah is a lion's whelp: from the prey, my son, thou art gone up: he stooped down, he couched as a lion, and as an old lion; who shall rouse him up? The sceptre shall not depart from Judah, nor a lawgiver from between his feet, until Shiloh come; and unto Him shall the gathering of the people be. Binding His foal unto the vine, and His ass's colt unto the choice vine; He washed His garments in wine, and His clothes in the blood of grapes: His eyes shall be red with wine, and His teeth white with milk," Gen. 49:8-12. The scepter, i.e., the mark of authority was still Jabez's to own and occupy because the Lion of Judah—Jesus Christ—the Messiah had not arrived yet. Something got big in Jabez! He realized all the sorrow on the inside and outside was under his dominion. He reclaimed his authority to tread sorrow under his feet in defeat forever. Also Moses conferred a blessing over Judah. "And this is the blessing of Judah: and he said, Hear, LORD, the voice of Judah, and bring him unto his people: let his hands be sufficient for him; and be Thou an help to him from his enemies," Deut. 33:7. Sufficient in Hebrew is "abundance, elder, exceedingly, full, master, plenteous..." That is the much too much blessing that showed Jabez, you're bigger than it! Jabez became so passionate about his supernatural transformation, from grave to glorious. He was resolved that his compassionate God could and would answer him favorably, further and faster. Jabez knew his God would graciously and generously do the exceeding, abundantly, above all that he could ever imagine. Jabez spiritually discerned he was destined to walk unconfined on earth, so he released God from the cramped space to work for him in every area of his life, inside and out.

VOICE-ACTIVATE GOD'S WORD FOR YOUR ENLARGEMENT INSIDE AND OUT

Grant God an open invitation to make the impossible, inevitable. Confess God's commanded vowed promises enlarging your territory. "Enlarge the place of thy tent, and let them stretch forth the curtains of thine habitations: spare not, lengthen thy cords, and strengthen thy stakes; For thou shalt break forth on the right hand and on the left; and thy seed shall inherit the Gentiles, and make the desolate cities to be inhabited," Is. 54:2 -3. Enlarge your heart to believe the impossible is inevitable. "I will run the way of Thy commandments, when Thou shalt enlarge my heart," Ps. 119:32. Enlarge your mouth over your enemies, keeping them conquered. "... My heart rejoiceth in the LORD, mine horn is exalted in the LORD: my mouth is enlarged over mine enemies; because I rejoice in Thy salvation," I Sam. 2:1. Now enlarge your steps to keep you from falling after you receive your manifestation. "Thou hast enlarged my steps under me, that my feet did not slip," Ps. 18:36. "The Spirit of God is arousing us within. We're also feeling the birth pangs. These sterile and barren bodies of ours are yearning for full deliverance. That is why waiting does not diminish us, any more than waiting diminishes a pregnant mother. We are enlarged in the waiting. We, of course, don't see what is enlarging us.
