

The Tsunami Blessing Inside and Out, Part 408 Scriptures

This is Section AY of a multi-part instruction. Holy Spirit was first introduced in the book of Genesis as the Third Person of the Godhead, Elohim. Throughout the Old Testament, you can see the empowerment of Holy Spirit demonstrated. This fixes our focus, not on our own power or might, but by the Spirit of the Lord Most High. Holy Spirit fills us to overflowing so we can expect Him to come in like a flood to make miraculous changes in the world through us.

Holy Spirit supervened Mary's womb by impregnating her with Jesus. Our Heavenly Father, Abba anointed Jesus with Holy Spirit and dunamis power. Jesus baptizing you with Holy Spirit and the fire of God grants you an unfair advantage to fulfill your destiny on earth.

Jesus introduced Holy Spirit as the One to lead God's succession plan on earth after His ascension. Jesus commissioned the Body of Christ to do the same works He performed on earth giving us our invitation to inherit and inhabit His anointing. Jesus also promised the Body of Christ that greater works will even be performed because of the presence and power of Holy Spirit upon us so we are filled with the fullness of God. You are a habitation of God through Holy Spirit where Jesus Christ lives in your heart by faith. That's how the Tsunami Blessing, Inside and Out will become a heaven-born reality.

The devil Tempts Jesus

Jesus' Public Ministry

¹⁴ Then Jesus went back to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and the news about Him spread through the entire region.

Why? Because the Eternal designated Me

to be His representative to the poor, to preach good news to them.

Luke's audience doesn't divide the world into sacred vs. secular or religious vs. political. For them, life is integrated. And for them, these "religious" words from Isaiah have a powerful and "political" meaning: because they see themselves as oppressed by the Roman occupation, Jesus' words suggest that His "good news" describes a powerful change about to come—a change that will rescue the people from their oppression. His fellow Jews have long been waiting for a savior to free them from Roman oppression. Jesus tells them their hopes are about to be fulfilled. But then, just as people speak well of Jesus, He lets them know their expectations aren't in line with God's plans. He tells them not to expect God to fit into their boxes and suggests the unthinkable: that God cares for the Gentiles, the very people who are oppressing them! They aren't too pleased by this.

He sent Me to tell those who are held captive that they can now be set free,
and to tell the blind that they can now see.

He sent Me to liberate those held down by oppression.

¹⁹ *In short, the Spirit is upon Me* to proclaim that now is the time;
this is the jubilee season of the Eternal One's grace.^[a]

hath laid on him the iniquity of us all. ⁷ He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth: he is brought as a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is dumb, so he openeth not his mouth. ⁸ He was taken from prison and from judgment: and who shall declare his generation? for he was cut off out of the land of the living: for the transgression of my people was he stricken. ⁹ And he made his grave with the wicked, and with the rich in his death; because he had done no violence, neither was any deceit in his mouth. ¹⁰ Yet it pleased the LORD to bruise him; he hath put him to grief: when thou shalt make his soul an offering for sin, he shall see his seed, he shall prolong his days, and the pleasure of the LORD shall prosper in his hand. ¹¹ He shall see of the travail of his soul, and shall be satisfied: by his knowledge shall my righteous servant justify many; for he shall bear their iniquities. ¹² Therefore will I divide him a portion with the great, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong; because he hath poured out his soul unto death: and he was numbered with the transgressors; and he bare the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors.

In Romans 8:11, the Apostle Paul gives a word picture of the indwelling Holy Spirit after the New Birth experience.

¹¹ But if the Spirit of him that raised up Jesus from the dead dwell [cohabit] in you, he that raised up Christ from the dead shall also quicken your mortal bodies by his Spirit that dwelleth [inhabit] in you.

2 Corinthians 5:17 confirms that our re-creation is indeed a new creation. The old life has perished and our new life is because we have a fresh, original formation.

2 Corinthians 5:17 King James Version (KJV)

¹⁷Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature [fresh original formation]: old things are passed away [perished]; behold, all things are become new.

Ephesians 5:23, 30 illustrates that Jesus Christ is the Head and we are His body. We are members of His body, His flesh, and His bones.

²³For the husband is the head of the wife, even as Christ is the head of the church: and he is the saviour of the body.

³⁰For we are members of his body, of his flesh, and of his bones.

Because of our New Birth, we become a habitation of God through Holy Spirit where Jesus Christ lives in our heart by faith. Ephesians 3:11-19 shows the Triune God, i.e., God, the Father; God, the Son; and God, the Holy Spirit.

¹¹According to the eternal purpose which he purposed in Christ Jesus our Lord: ¹²In whom we have boldness and access with confidence by the faith of him. ¹³Wherefore I desire that ye faint not at my tribulations for you, which is your glory. ¹⁴For this cause I bow my knees unto the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, ¹⁵Of whom the whole family in heaven and earth is named, ¹⁶That he would grant you, according to the riches of his glory, to be strengthened with might by his Spirit in the inner man; ¹⁷That Christ may dwell in your hearts by faith; that ye, being rooted and grounded in love, ¹⁸May be able to comprehend with all saints what is the breadth, and length, and depth, and height; ¹⁹And to know the love of Christ, which passeth knowledge, that ye might be filled with all the fulness of God.

1 Corinthians 15:45-49 details the transformation from creation to the re-creation. It shows the change from first man, Adam to the last man, Jesus Christ. It shows the change from old life to the new

life, from carnality to spirituality. It shows God's purpose is to mirror just what Jesus modeled. Along with this makeover, our assignment is to usher heaven to earth.

⁴⁵Thus it is written, The first man Adam became a living being (an individual personality); the last Adam (Christ) became a life-giving Spirit [restoring the dead to life]. ⁴⁶But it is not the spiritual life which came first, but the physical and then the spiritual. ⁴⁷The first man [was] from out of earth, made of dust (earthly-minded); the second Man [is] *the Lord* from out of heaven. ⁴⁸Now those who are made of the dust are like him who was first made of the dust (earthly-minded); and as is [the Man] from heaven, so also [are those] who are of heaven (heavenly-minded). ⁴⁹And just as we have borne the image [of the man] of dust, so shall we *and so* ^[a]*let us* also bear the image [of the Man] of heaven.

The Word of God, in Hebrews 4:12 is the term *logos* in Greek. This scripture illustrates that the Word of God is living and empowered to discern between what is spirit, soul, and body. Therefore, Word of God is relevant for all times, in all things. It helps you to detect what the Spirit of God desires to reveal to you at that moment in time.

¹²For the Word that God speaks is alive and full of power [making it active, operative, energizing, and effective]; it is sharper than any two-edged sword, penetrating to the dividing line of the ^[a]breath of life (soul) and [the immortal] spirit, and of joints and marrow [body] [of the deepest parts of our nature], exposing *and* sifting *and* analyzing *and* judging the very thoughts and purposes of the heart.

Psalms 19:7-14 names each one's content distinction along with its correct definition as published by Strong's Concordance: 1) laws i.e., law, direction, instruction, 2) testimonies, only noted as such, but can be explained as verifications, witnesses, proofs; 3) statutes i.e.,

precepts, 4) commandments i.e., code of wisdom; and 5) judgments i.e., justice.

Moreover, our reverence before the Lord determines if all of the five or none of the categories will ever be fulfilled in our lives. The aforementioned scriptures also name the fear of the Lord, i.e., reverence, among the other five areas.

God has already given the fear of the Lord an honorable mention because of its significance in sustaining our loyalty to Him. In reality, it is the sixth designation in the Word of God that perpetually influences all of the other five. The fear of the Lord keeps us aligned and inclined to what is pure and perfect in God's sight.

The resurrected assembly of the dry bones in Ezekiel 37:1-14 give an image of what God can do in your life to resurrect not only the dead things, but things buried dead or buried alive as well. His honorable intention is to ensure that every joint supplies, knitting you together with His perfect love. That is to give you more proof that nothing can separate you from His love. Then you will know as you are known by the love of God.

The Lord co-partnered with the Prophet Ezekiel to put together a massive army on its feet. Can the resurrection power of Christ bring about life from the dissembling of death? Absolutely! Learn to see on earth as God sees in heaven. Nothing is missing, nothing lacking, and nothing broken in heaven at all.

Next, only decree and declare on earth, what God has already decreed and declared in heaven. Allow God to fully express Himself in your life to make deposits into your heart that come out of your mouth to keep you whole and well. Only and always agree with God.

With His Word in your mouth, prophesy for God as His mouthpiece on earth. Refuse to rehearse anything that may be just factual but not the absolute truth as deemed by God that you can absolutely trust. Don't leave the Lord powerless in your life by assembling any contradiction.

The Lord works habitually and systematically in the earth so plan to be the credible witness of the glory of God. Restoration always begins and ends with what God first breathed. Listen to and for His

voice! Refuse to take your script from any contradiction.
