

The Tsunami Blessing Inside and Out, Part 429 Scriptures

This is Section C of a multi-part instruction. The Mountain of the Dynasty of the LORD is the highest mountain where you are co-seated in heavenly places in Christ above all Seven Mountains. ¹And at the last days the mountain of the Lord shall be manifest, established on the tops of the mountains, and it shall be exalted above the hills; and the peoples shall hasten to it. ²And many nations shall go, and say, Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, and to the house of the God of Jacob; and they shall shew us His way, and we will walk in His paths: for out of Sion shall go forth a law, and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem,” Micah 4:1-2, Brenton Septuagint Translation.

Jesus authorizes you with God’s authority and power to remove any mountain that is an obstruction to your breakthrough. Through Holy Spirit, speak the Word of God with the voice of Jesus! ²² And Jesus answering saith unto them, Have faith in God. ²³ For verily I say unto you, That whosoever shall say unto this mountain, Be thou removed, and be thou cast into the sea; and shall not doubt in his heart, but shall believe that those things which he saith shall come to pass; he shall have whatsoever he saith. ²⁴ Therefore I say unto you, What things soever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that ye receive them, and ye shall have them,” Mark 11:22-24, King James Version

UNSHAKEN! Don’t be moved if the mountain seems to be a giant. It’s in plain sight so you won’t miss the cue that there is colossal treasure hiding behind it. Change your perception. Only see the mountain as “raised earth” that God already has given its dominion over to you. Stop wasting energy climbing it or walking around it. Its removal is voice-activated when you exercise your faith in God. Focus your unflinching command. Speak to the mountain. Watch God’s supernatural power—as your reinforcement—remove that impossibility for you. That’s mountain-moving faith!

THE FAITH OF GOD HAS EYES TO SEE HIS VISION FOR YOUR LIFE

Professional Believer - Pour it In, Watch it Flow

1-PROFESSIONAL BELIEVER

Hebrews 10:23 says, "Let us hold fast the profession of our faith without wavering (for he is faithful that promised)." We are called professional believers within the kingdom of God.

Faith is more than just a function; it becomes the occupation and lifestyle of the believer. Romans 1:17 confirms this when it says, "The just shall live by faith." We then can experience everything in life with God. Moreover, from each life experience to the next, we can go from one level of faith to the next.

At one time or another, your heart has displayed one of the four following traits. The state of the heart reflects your degree of faith. If you clearly understand your posture of belief in every area of life, your heart will never be the mountain that hinders you from receiving from God.

State of the Heart	Trait of the Heart
Unbelieving-Unbelievers	Must always see it to believe it
Unbelieving-Believers	Skeptical about seeing what they believe
Believing-Believers	Only sees the future brighter, never having any proof of the finished work
Receiving-Believers	Confidently receives the end of its faith now, so patiently endures until manifestation comes

Press toward becoming a Receiving-Believer! To encourage you to receive by faith, Hebrews 11:13 provides four principles to help you believe to see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living:

Although invisible, your heart sees the promise from afar and has a clear image of it.

Although inconceivable, your heart is persuaded that the promise is already in your possession.

Although intangible, your heart embraces the promise as if you could touch it.

Although indefinable, your mouth calls the promise by its name.

Let's take a closer look at Hebrews 11:13-16 to see why some never received the promises of God. "These all died in faith, not having received the promises but having seen them afar off, and were persuaded of them, and embraced them, and confessed that they were strangers and pilgrims on the earth. "For they that say such things declare plainly that they seek a country. And truly, if they had been mindful of that country from which they came out, they might have had opportunity to return. But now they desire a better country, that is, an heavenly: wherefore God is not ashamed to be called their God; for he hath prepared for them a city."

- **First, their heart had a clear image of the promises they were to receive in the earth, but it had a clearer vision of the prepared city in heaven.**

- **Secondly, their heart was persuaded of the promises, they were to receive on earth; but it was even more convinced of the prepared city in heaven.**

- **Thirdly, their heart embraced the promises they were to receive on earth; but it held the title deed to the prepared city in heaven.**

- **So their mouth reproduced what impacted their heart the most, This world is not my home. Heaven is my home. So they died having not received the promises.**

Yes, heaven is a much better place; but they never received their earthly promises because of what they continually practiced with their own mouth. Consequently, their own confession overrode the adopted vision and conviction.

They allowed a mountain to impair their vision. They allowed a mountain to hinder their quality of life in the earth. They allowed a mountain to stop what they could own in the earth because they never made room for it. At this time, God needs us to complete His work in the earth. He doesn't need us in heaven.

POUR IT IN, WATCH IT FLOW

"So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God." Romans 10:17. God causes us to hear with ears of "faith" when His Word is preached and taught under the anointing and power of the Holy Spirit.

There are many voices in the world. Many resound fear, terror, and unbelief. For this reason, you should begin to filter everything you see, hear, say, and believe through the Word of God. Mark 4:23-24 says, "If any man have ears to hear, let him hear. And he said unto them, Take heed what ye hear; with what measure ye mete; it shall be measured to you; and unto you that hear shall more be given."

"...and hearing by the word of God." Isaiah 50:4b-5 confirms that God has the power to "wakeneth morning by morning mine ear to hear as the learned [*professional believer and follower of Christ*]. The Lord God hath opened mine ear, and I was not rebellious [*nor revolt against the truth*], neither turned away back [*but obeyed the commandments that I heard*]. Be open daily to only hear words of faith and to act on what you have heard. It is the Word of God that fuels our faith to remove mountains.

So, expect to hear words that will ignite our faith to a new level on a daily basis. When your ears hear faith, it replaces the facts that you are facing with the truth of the gospel. The more of the "Word" you deposit in your heart, the more faith will be nurtured. The more your heart is encouraged with the promises of God, the less pressure you will experience when your faith is being proven. Moreover, that word of faith applies pressure to the problem. Therefore, it minimizes all odds against victory. Ultimately, Jesus Christ will be magnified in your life as Lord and you are therefore destined to win.

Praying the Word of God coupled with biblical fasting helps remove fleshly responses. In this, your listening skills will greatly improve. When you have developed a keen sense of hearing to the soft, small

voice of God within, precision will fully manifest and it will be hard to miss his pre-planned deliverance. The results you receive will show you have surpassed the believing stage. Now you know for yourself.

The Word of God is the main ingredient to develop your faith in God. If you use God's Word then your success will be based on His point of view alone, instead of what you or others may think about your situation. You cannot separate what you say or write from your person because it is the very expression of who you are. So it is with God also, you cannot separate Him from His Word either. The Word of God helps you to see the Lord as He really is.

Faith in God cannot be effectively exercised without the presence of the Word in you. The Word of God must be the foundation that frames your world. Hebrews 11:3 says, "Through faith we understand that the worlds were framed by the word of God, so that things which are seen were not made of things which do appear." So the thing that is not seen is words.

Faith [the invisible, intangible Word] forms flesh [the visible, tangible Word]. John 1:1-2, 14 confirms that "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. The same was in the beginning with God. And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father), full of grace and truth."

Your level of faith in God is determined by the life and energy of His Word in you. For the Word to become living and powerful, mediate

on the Word of God all the time and let it permeate your very soul so that you can be like Jesus Christ was in the world.

The *Hebrew Honey* defines the word “meditate” as one speaking to himself in a low voice, to think out loud on something. This is done in order to keep the mind on what would be a proper word or answer. Yes, rehearsing the Word will increase your level of concentration as well as help you stay focused on victory instead of the mountain.

Joshua 1:8 declares, “This book of the law shall not depart out of thy mouth; but thou shalt meditate therein day and night, that thou mayest observe to do according to all that is written therein: for then thou shalt make thy way prosperous, and then thou shalt have good success.”

Do not just recite the Word alone. Read the Word of God just like you were eating a meal. You cannot live on the memory of natural food, neither can you thrive on the memory of the Word. “...Man doth not live by bread only but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of the Lord doth man live.” Deuteronomy 8:3b. Read it and pray it out loud every day and every time.

For your faith in God to expand, allow the Word, in a specific area, to have free course in your innermost being, i.e., your mind, will, and emotions. Transform what you think, feel, and desire into the express image of what Jesus Christ thinks, feels, and desires for you in that area.

To do so, discover and deposit scriptures that parallel the subject matter you are facing. Appropriate relevant scriptures that coincide with the nature of the request. Apply identical scriptures that image the results you need or desire daily. Usually one or two scriptures on that topic will ignite your faith.

However, to build your defense for the battle of the mind, you need to store up an artillery. Only you can determine that amount. Whatever it takes for you to remain in faith is the number of scriptures you need to deposit. When the word is always your response instead of rehearsing the mountain, you have overcoming faith.
