

The Tsunami Blessing Inside and Out, Part 433 Scriptures

This is Section G of a multi-part instruction. The Mountain of the Dynasty of the LORD is the highest mountain where you are co-seated in heavenly places in Christ above all Seven Mountains. “¹And at the last days the mountain of the Lord shall be manifest, established on the tops of the mountains, and it shall be exalted above the hills; and the peoples shall hasten to it. ²And many nations shall go, and say, Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, and to the house of the God of Jacob; and they shall shew us His way, and we will walk in His paths: for out of Sion shall go forth a law, and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem,” Micah 4:1-2, Brenton Septuagint Translation.

Jesus authorizes you with God’s authority and power to remove any mountain that is an obstruction to your breakthrough. Through Holy Spirit, speak the Word of God with the voice of Jesus! “²² And Jesus answering saith unto them, Have faith in God. ²³ For verily I say unto you, That whosoever shall say unto this mountain, Be thou removed, and be thou cast into the sea; and shall not doubt in his heart, but shall believe that those things which he saith shall come to pass; he shall have whatsoever he saith. ²⁴ Therefore I say unto you, What things soever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that ye receive them, and ye shall have them,” Mark 11:22-24, King James Version

UNSHAKEN! Don’t be moved if the mountain seems to be a giant. It’s in plain sight so you won’t miss the cue that there is colossal treasure hiding behind it. Change your perception. Only see the mountain as “raised earth” that God already has given its dominion over to you. Stop wasting energy climbing it or walking around it. Its removal is voice-activated when you exercise your faith in God. Focus your unflinching command. Speak to the mountain. Watch God’s supernatural power—as your reinforcement—remove that impossibility for you. That’s mountain-moving faith!

POWER OF THE HOLY GHOST

“Now the God of hope fill you with all joy and [all] peace in believing that ye may abound in hope through the power of the Holy Ghost,” Romans 15:13.

God has great expectations for your future. He assists your faith by virtually pouring joy and peace to empower you while you are yet believing to receive His promises. This launches the Holy Spirit to lead you successfully into the future because your faith is complete in Jesus Christ. In fact, you can have all joy and all peace even when there is no manifestation in sight, because of the working of the Holy Spirit.

Romans 5:3 says, “Tribulation worketh patience; patience, experience, and experience hope and hope maketh not ashamed...” The anchor of hope can sustain you through trials. Hope helps you see triumph when you are facing a mountain. Hope helps you forget those things that are behind. Hope keeps you focused on the future. Hope helps you to endure until the end. It helps you have successful experiences in using your faith. Ultimately, you will see the glory of God manifested in your life.

All joy in believing is the goal. To maintain a state of joy until manifestation comes. “...In thy presence is fulness of joy...,” Psalm 16:11. If you desire only joy in your joy, meditate on the Word of God. The Word of God provides fellowship so gloom, despair, agony, sorrow, and mourning will flee from you so they cannot interrupt your joy. The better your fellowship is with Jesus Christ, the fuller

your joy will become so you can experience God's delight even while you are waiting.

All peace in believing is the other goal. To maintain a state of peace until manifestation comes. "Thou shalt keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on thee, because he trusteth in thee," Isaiah 26:3. If you desire only peace in your peace, then stay focused on Jesus the Prince of Peace. You will remove any distraction from your worship. The more focused you are on Jesus, and not the problem, the more perfect your peace will become, so you can experience His wholeness even while you are waiting.

In Jesus Christ you are complete. He abundantly loads you with joy and peace to supply what your faith needs. Joy and peace are fruit of the Spirit developed and fervently expressed by the Spirit of God when you come under divine leadership. Joy and peace provide a state of contentment even during times of testing. Joy helps you to be satisfied with Jesus Christ; and peace helps you to stay in agreement with Him even when there is no answer in sight. With them working together, you can reach and maintain satisfaction and be in total agreement with what's true until you receive the manifestation of your promise.

Isaiah 55:12 declares, "For ye shall go out with joy and shall be led forth with peace. The mountains and the hills will break forth with singing and the trees of the field shall clap their hands." What you may currently refer to as a place of hindrance, will ultimately become a place of hallelujahs. The presence of joy and peace in believing, causes that mountain to bow and confess Jesus Christ as

Lord. In other words, the mountain joins in to celebrate your victory as it is removed from your path, succumbing to defeat.

PRODUCTION: FAITH WORKS BY LOVE

Faith works by love. In other words, faith is made fervently active by love. Love must be present and released to make faith fully operative. Therefore, love empowers faith to manifest the Word. Love makes a commitment to not let go until it experiences victory. As one of the fruit of the Holy Spirit, God's love is developed in us. However, to nurture it, deposit the Word of God in your heart.

I Corinthians 13th chapter vividly defines "agape", which is the Greek word for love. Agape is the kind of love God demonstrates toward us. Agape love goes beyond friendship, brotherly kindness, and even romance. Agape is not fleeting. Agape is equated with God's devotion to us, which surpasses all our understanding.

You will find faith and agape love are quite identical. Faith fosters productive plans. Possesses great expectations. Always responds appropriately.

Celebrates the truth. Believes the impossible. Endures to the end. Nothing can separate it from loyalty. Contributes beyond what is requested. Will stay as long as is needed. Extremely flexible and expandable capacity. Exhibits uncommon unselfishness. Greatness is shown through gentleness.

"Perfect love casts out fear," according to I John 4:18, so we can't be incapacitated. Faith finds the courage to be bold. Therefore, fear

is paralyzed making faith, working by love, invincible. Love never fails when it is present and actively released by faith. James 2:20 says, "...Faith without works is dead." Show your faith by your works of love. By your works of love, your faith is made perfect. It will reach the maturity of God's love.

When we comprehend the height, length, breadth, and depth of God's love, we can then parallel it with faith. Strive for your level of confidence in God to equal your level of commitment to Him.

- Height of God's love -- *Quality of coverage. No one can possibly love you better.* "We love him, because He first loved us," I John 4:19. "But God commendeth his love toward us in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us," Romans 5:8.

- Breadth of God's love -- *Diversity of coverage. Virtually there is no fault that God won't overlook; and there is no one in Christ that is unable to express His love to someone who is at fault.* "Love covers all sins," Proverbs 10:12b. "Beloved if God so loved us, we ought to love one another," I John 4:11.

- Length of God's love -- *Longevity of coverage. How long is from everlasting to everlasting?* "The Lord hath appeared of old unto me, saying, Yea, I have loved thee with an everlasting love: therefore with lovingkindness have I drawn thee," Jeremiah 31:3

- Depth of God's love -- *Flexibility of coverage. Had it been just only one person lost, he would have made the same sacrificial offering, but it was for all mankind.* "For scarcely for a righteous man will one

die: yet peradventure for a good man some would even dare to die," Romans 5:7. "For God so loved the whole world, that He gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life," St. John 3:16.

Apply your faith in the beginning, or at the climax, of a situation. Use it for the temporal or the eternal. Use it for an individual or many nations. Use it for one area, or all areas. Apply it to valleys or mountains. Faith -- with works -- is alive and well.

PRAYER OF PETITION

"Therefore I say unto you, What things soever ye desire, when you pray, believe that ye receive them, and ye shall have them," Mark 11:24. Prayer is not a form of therapy, nor is it something you do just to feel better.

Through prayer, you can fellowship with God and have His undivided attention. First, know what you want. Begin to petition Him in such a way that your request is the image of what you believe and receive in your heart, and what you confess with your mouth. By faith expect to receive your answer at the time of your request.

Your personal relationship with the Lord will determine your realized "access and boldness with confidence by the faith of him" as stated in Romans 4:16. Your level of knowledge of your covenant rights will determine your realized promises.

Use the following verses in times of prayer and confession to help to guard your mouth and your heart:

“Let the words of my mouth, and the meditation of my heart, be acceptable in thy sight, O Lord, my strength, and my Redeemer,” Psalm 19:14.

“Set a watch, O Lord, before my mouth; keep the door of my lips. Incline not my heart to any evil thing, to practice wicked works with men that work iniquity; and let me not eat of their dainties,” Psalm 141:3-4.

Use the following verses to serve as a form of closure to all your daily prayers:

“Blessed be the Lord, that hath given rest unto his people, Israel, according to all that he promised; there hath not failed one word of all his good promise, which he promised by the hand of Moses his servant.

“The Lord our God be with us, as he was with our fathers: let him not leave us nor forsake us: That he may incline our hearts unto him, to walk in all his ways, and to keep his commandments, and his statutes, and his judgments, which he commanded our fathers. And let these words, wherewith I have made supplication before the Lord, be nigh unto the Lord our God day and night, that he maintain the cause of his servant, and the cause of his people, Israel, at all times, as the matter shall require: That all the people of the earth may know that the Lord is God, and that there is none else.

“Let your heart, therefore, be perfect with the Lord our God, to walk in his statutes and to keep his commandments, as at this day.” I Kings 8:56-61.
