

The Tsunami Blessing Inside and Out, Part 434 Scriptures

This is Section H of a multi-part instruction. The Mountain of the Dynasty of the LORD is the highest mountain where you are co-seated in heavenly places in Christ above all Seven Mountains. “¹And at the last days the mountain of the Lord shall be manifest, established on the tops of the mountains, and it shall be exalted above the hills; and the peoples shall hasten to it. ²And many nations shall go, and say, Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, and to the house of the God of Jacob; and they shall shew us His way, and we will walk in His paths: for out of Sion shall go forth a law, and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem,” Micah 4:1-2, Brenton Septuagint Translation.

Jesus authorizes you with God’s authority and power to remove any mountain that is an obstruction to your breakthrough. Through Holy Spirit, speak the Word of God with the voice of Jesus! “²² And Jesus answering saith unto them, Have faith in God. ²³ For verily I say unto you, That whosoever shall say unto this mountain, Be thou removed, and be thou cast into the sea; and shall not doubt in his heart, but shall believe that those things which he saith shall come to pass; he shall have whatsoever he saith. ²⁴ Therefore I say unto you, What things soever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that ye receive them, and ye shall have them,” Mark 11:22-24, King James Version

UNSHAKEN! Don’t be moved if the mountain seems to be a giant. It’s in plain sight so you won’t miss the cue that there is colossal treasure hiding behind it. Change your perception. Only see the mountain as “raised earth” that God already has given its dominion over to you. Stop wasting energy climbing it or walking around it. Its removal is voice-activated when you exercise your faith in God. Focus your unflinching command. Speak to the mountain. Watch God’s supernatural power—as your reinforcement—remove that impossibility for you. That’s mountain-moving faith!

PRAISE PREPARES THE WAY

“He staggered not at the promise of God through unbelief, but was strong in faith, giving *glory* to God; and being fully persuaded that, what he had promised, he was able also to perform,” Romans 4:20-21.

The sacrifice of praise will cause your heart to rejoice, but it also prepares the way of the Lord. Honor Jesus Christ by honoring His blood, His Word, and His Name.

PATIENTLY EXPECTING, PATIENTLY ENDURING

“Knowing this, that the trying of your faith worketh patience. But let patience have her perfect work, that ye may be perfect and entire, wanting nothing,” James 1:3-4.

Habakkuk 3:19 says, “The Lord God is my strength, and He will make my feet like hinds’ feet, and He will make me walk upon mine high places...” Through trials or testing, be resolved that you can move forward with splendor, strength, speed, satisfaction, surefootedness, and in service to the Lord (worship).

In this case, the outcome of a “placement test” reveals your specific knowledge or proficiency of the blood covenant. If you don’t know or believe the blood covenant is God’s sworn affidavit to you, then the amount of success will be drastically reduced when your faith is applied.

The test reveals to us our level of obedience to God. Please know that God already knows what is in our heart. It is the test that gives *us* a reality check, so we will know if we are actually living by the Word of God.

Deuteronomy 8:1-3 says, “All the commandments which I command thee this day shall ye observe to do, that ye may live, and multiply, and go in and possess the land which the Lord swore to give unto your fathers. And thou shalt remember all the way which the Lord thy God led thee these forty years in the wilderness, to humble thee, and to prove thee, to know that was in thine heart, whether thou wouldest keep his commandments, or not.”

Furthermore, the proficiency test separates your loyalty to God from the lust of your prayer request. An inappropriate relationship with material things will cause you to serve an idol instead of God. Be certain not to make an idol of the thing desired at any time, even when it is in the unseen stage of your request.

A trial will always leave a trail to what your heart really treasures. The integrity of your faith will be evident during and after the trial or test. Don't allow your prayer request to be the mountain that hinders you from receiving from God.

You pass the test when you desire to worship God more than the things that are to come. The expectation of our faith is that it resounds that God is our exceeding great reward. The end of our faith is still to worship God. You must be resolved in the face of the trial to say "Nothing shall separate me from the love of God (things present nor things to come)".

PERFORMANCE FOR THE PRIZE

"For whatsoever is born of God overcometh the world: and this is the victory that overcometh the world, even our faith," I John 5:4.

The world system has already been condemned, so if you choose to live by its rules, you will experience failure in this life. Deuteronomy 28:14 tells of those who choose not to "serve the Lord with joyfulness, and with gladness of heart for the abundance of all things". They are the ones who will live under the curse; i.e., "empowered to fail". You will be subjected to live under the curse if you choose not to trust God in any given area of your life. But thanks be to God, "Christ hath redeemed us from the curse of the law, being made a curse for us: for it is written, Cursed is everyone that hangeth on a tree: That the blessing of Abraham might on the Gentiles through Jesus Christ; that we might receive the promise of the Spirit through faith," Galatians 3:13-14. Don't settle for less than the very best.

To execute mountain-moving faith, keep your eyes on the prize. Declare as Philippians 3:13b-14 does, "... Forgetting those things which are behind, and reaching forth unto those things which are before, I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus."

PROTECTIVE COVERING

In I Timothy 6:12, the Apostle Paul refers to believers “fighting the good fight of faith.” The best thing about a fight is when you are declared the winner. Faith serves as a protective covering for the believer. “Above all, taking the shield of faith wherewith you shall be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked,” Ephesians 6:16. Don’t put your shield of faith down, for it is the major artillery used against the enemy. -Pray that you have perfected faith. Nothing missing. Nothing broken. Nothing lacking. Perfected faith shows the maturity of your faith. It believes to see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living, no matter if the wait seems very long. Perfected faith is confident that it will be manifested, so time is no longer an issue. Paul said, “Night and day praying exceedingly that we might see your face, and might perfect that which is lacking in your faith?” I Thessalonians 3:10. -Pray that your faith does not fail before, during, and after the tests. Before the test of faith it is easy to become presumptuous. During the test of faith it is easy to get detracted or even offended. After the test of faith it is easy to become careless. Luke 22:31-32 says, “And the Lord said, Simon, behold satan hath desired to have you, that he may sift you as wheat: But I have prayed for thee, that thy faith fail not: And when thou art converted, strengthen thy brethren.” Pray that your faith does not faint. The scripture says the Lord gives power to the faint, and increases the strength of the one who does not have might. Therefore, fainting is not an option. Regular communication with God keeps you connected to the answer. Psalm 27:13 focuses on the power of your faith to receive the manifestation of what you prayed for. “I had fainted, unless I had believed to see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living.”

PERFECT EXAMPLE

“Looking unto Jesus the Author and Finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, is set down at the right hand of the throne of God,” Hebrews 12:2.

Be resolved with Jesus as the author and finisher of your faith. Keep looking to Jesus. Stay focused on Him. Jesus is the beginning of our faith, and He’s also the developer of it. In this relationship, you don’t exercise faith alone at any time. His role is to be your constant companion from the beginning of your faith until you receive victory in all things. He will never leave or forsake you.

Jesus Christ also represents you to God. He takes your request before God. With the leadership of the Holy Spirit, He guides you through the Word of God to ensure your request lines up with the will of God. He helps to purify your heart, and your request, so that you will be ensured of receiving the best answer.

As the High Priest of our profession, he represents God to you. He pursues us more than we pursue Him. He seeks to establish God’s purpose and plan in us. He helps to establish faith in God alone. He quickens us with the Word of God to sustain us during the trials of our faith.

As our example Jesus was triumphant, through God, on earth. The good news is that with Jesus living in our heart, so can we. The Holy Spirit can produce the same absolute, unquestionable, and unlimited results in you as Jesus experienced during his earthly ministry. What made Jesus successful was His firsthand knowledge of, and reverence for, God. Jesus clearly understood the power and authority behind the faith, which made his faith undeniable. Clearly, with the help and example of Jesus Christ, we are well able to remove mountains. THE NEW BEGINNING
