

The Tsunami Blessing Inside and Out, Part 438 Scriptures

This is Section L of a multi-part instruction. The Mountain of the Dynasty of the LORD is the highest mountain where you are co-seated in heavenly places in Christ above all Seven Mountains. “¹And at the last days the mountain of the Lord shall be manifest, established on the tops of the mountains, and it shall be exalted above the hills; and the peoples shall hasten to it. ²And many nations shall go, and say, Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, and to the house of the God of Jacob; and they shall shew us His way, and we will walk in His paths: for out of Sion shall go forth a law, and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem,” Micah 4:1-2, Brenton Septuagint Translation.

Jesus authorizes you with God’s authority and power to remove any mountain that is an obstruction to your breakthrough. Through Holy Spirit, speak the Word of God with the voice of Jesus! “²² And Jesus answering saith unto them, Have faith in God. ²³ For verily I say unto you, That whosoever shall say unto this mountain, Be thou removed, and be thou cast into the sea; and shall not doubt in his heart, but shall believe that those things which he saith shall come to pass; he shall have whatsoever he saith. ²⁴ Therefore I say unto you, What things soever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that ye receive them, and ye shall have them,” Mark 11:22-24, King James Version

UNSHAKEN! Don’t be moved if the mountain seems to be a giant. It’s in plain sight so you won’t miss the cue that there is colossal treasure hiding behind it. Change your perception. Only see the mountain as “raised earth” that God already has given its dominion over to you. Stop wasting energy climbing it or walking around it. Its removal is voice-activated when you exercise your faith in God. Focus your unflinching command. Speak to the mountain. Watch God’s supernatural power—as your reinforcement—remove that impossibility for you. That’s mountain-moving faith!

Unpack the Seven Mountains. Showcase Jesus in Arts & Entertainment, and Media paradigm: He received was provision, participation, promise, proclamation, prophecy, prayer, and praise through the presence and power of Holy Spirit in him and through him. That will help you to proceed with God’s initiative.

Jesus proved God anointed Him with Holy Spirit and *dunamis* power. He went about doing good and healing those who were oppressed of the devil, for God was with Him.

ARTS & ENTERTAINMENT

Jesus emotionally connected His audiences to God's message via His Master storytelling skills.

Luke 15, Living Bible

15 Dishonest tax collectors and other notorious sinners often came to listen to Jesus' sermons; ² but this caused complaints from the Jewish religious leaders and the experts on Jewish law because he was associating with such despicable people—even eating with them! ³⁻⁴ So Jesus used this illustration: "If you had a hundred sheep and one of them strayed away and was lost in the wilderness, wouldn't you leave the ninety-nine others to go and search for the lost one until you found it? ⁵ And then you would joyfully carry it home on your shoulders. ⁶ When you arrived you would call together your friends and neighbors to rejoice with you because your lost sheep was found. ⁷ "Well, in the same way heaven will be happier over one lost sinner who returns to God than over ninety-nine others who haven't strayed away! ⁸ "Or take another illustration: A woman has ten valuable silver coins and loses one. Won't she light a lamp and look in every corner of the house and sweep every nook and cranny until she finds it? ⁹ And then won't she call in her friends and neighbors to rejoice with her? ¹⁰ In the same way there is joy in the presence of the angels of God when one sinner repents." ¹¹ To further illustrate the point, he told them this story: "A man had two sons. ¹² When the younger told his father, 'I want my share of your estate now, instead of waiting until you die!' his father agreed to divide his wealth between his sons. ¹³ "A few days later this younger son packed all his belongings and took a trip to a distant land, and there wasted all his money

on parties and prostitutes. ¹⁴ About the time his money was gone a great famine swept over the land, and he began to starve. ¹⁵ He persuaded a local farmer to hire him to feed his pigs. ¹⁶ The boy became so hungry that even the pods he was feeding the swine looked good to him. And no one gave him anything.

¹⁷ "When he finally came to his senses, he said to himself, 'At home even the hired men have food enough and to spare, and here I am, dying of hunger! ¹⁸ I will go home to my father and say, "Father, I have sinned against both heaven and you, ¹⁹ and am no longer worthy of being called your son. Please take me on as a hired man."' ²⁰ "So he returned home to his father. And while he was still a long distance away, his father saw him coming, and was filled with loving pity and ran and embraced him and kissed him. ²¹ "His son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and you, and am not worthy of being called your son—' ²² "But his father said to the slaves, 'Quick! Bring the finest robe in the house and put it on him. And a jeweled ring for his finger; and shoes! ²³ And kill the calf we have in the fattening pen. We must celebrate with a feast, ²⁴ for this son of mine was dead and has returned to life. He was lost and is found.' So the party began. ²⁵ "Meanwhile, the older son was in the fields working; when he returned home, he heard dance music coming from the house, ²⁶ and he asked one of the servants what was going on. ²⁷ "'Your brother is back,' he was told, 'and your father has killed the calf we were fattening and has prepared a great feast to celebrate his coming home again unharmed.' ²⁸ "The older brother was angry and wouldn't go in. His father came out and begged him, ²⁹ but he replied, 'All these years I've worked hard for you and never once refused to do a single thing you told me to; and in all that time you never gave me even one young goat for a feast with my friends. ³⁰ Yet when this son of

yours comes back after spending your money on prostitutes, you celebrate by killing the finest calf we have on the place.'

³¹ "'Look, dear son,' his father said to him, 'you and I are very close, and everything I have is yours. ³² But it is right to celebrate. For he is your brother; and he was dead and has come back to life! He was lost and is found!'"

MEDIA

Without social media, Jesus became a household name. Even when He firmly told those He healed not to say a word, they publicized His name even the more. Be a carrier of Jesus' anointing! Do what Jesus did!

John 4:1-28 42, Living Bible

²⁸⁻²⁹ Then the woman left her waterpot beside the well and went back to the village and told everyone, "Come and meet a man who told me everything I ever did! Can this be the Messiah?" ³⁰ So the people came streaming from the village to see him. ³¹ Meanwhile, the disciples were urging Jesus to eat. ³² "No," he said, "I have some food you don't know about." ³³ "Who brought it to him?" the disciples asked each other. ³⁴ Then Jesus explained: "My nourishment comes from doing the will of God who sent me, and from finishing his work. ³⁵ Do you think the work of harvesting will not begin until the summer ends four months from now? Look around you! Vast fields of human souls are ripening all around us, and are ready now for reaping. ³⁶ The reapers will be paid good wages and will be gathering eternal souls into the granaries of heaven! What joys await the sower and the reaper, both together! ³⁷ For it is true that one sows and someone else reaps. ³⁸ I sent you to reap where you didn't sow; others did the work, and you received the harvest." ³⁹ Many from the Samaritan village believed he was the Messiah because of the woman's report: "He told me everything I ever

did!" ⁴⁰⁻⁴¹ When they came out to see him at the well, they begged him to stay at their village; and he did, for two days, long enough for many of them to believe in him after hearing him. ⁴² Then they said to the woman, "Now we believe because we have heard him ourselves, not just because of what you told us. He is indeed the Savior of the world."

²⁷ As Jesus was leaving her home, two blind men followed along behind, shouting, "O Son of King David, have mercy on us." ²⁸ They went right into the house where he was staying, and Jesus asked them, "Do you believe I can make you see?" "Yes, Lord," they told him, "we do." ²⁹ Then he touched their eyes and said, "Because of your faith it will happen." ³⁰ And suddenly they could see! Jesus sternly warned them not to tell anyone about it, ³¹ but instead they spread his fame all over the town.^[a]

HOW TO USE YOUR FAITH TO MOVE MOUNTAINS

Mark 11:12-25, Living Bible

¹² The next morning as they left Bethany, he felt hungry. ¹³ A little way off he noticed a fig tree in full leaf, so he went over to see if he could find any figs on it. But no, there were only leaves, for it was too early in the season for fruit. ¹⁴ Then Jesus said to the tree, "You shall never bear fruit again!" And the disciples heard him say it. ¹⁵ When they arrived back in Jerusalem, he went to the Temple and began to drive out the merchants and their customers, and knocked over the tables of the money changers and the

stalls of those selling doves, ¹⁶ and stopped everyone from bringing in loads of merchandise. ¹⁷ He told them, "It is written in the Scriptures, 'My Temple is to be a place of prayer for all nations,' but you have turned it into a den of robbers." ¹⁸ When the chief priests and other Jewish leaders heard what he had done, they began planning how best to get rid of him. Their problem was their fear of riots because the people were so enthusiastic about Jesus' teaching. ¹⁹ That evening as usual they left the city. ²⁰ Next morning, as the disciples passed the fig tree he had cursed, they saw that it was withered from the roots! ²¹ Then Peter remembered what Jesus had said to the tree on the previous day and exclaimed, "Look, Teacher! The fig tree you cursed has withered!" ²²⁻²³ In reply Jesus said to the disciples, "If you only have faith in God—this is the absolute truth—you can say to this Mount of Olives, 'Rise up and fall into the Mediterranean,' and your command will be obeyed. All that's required is that you really believe and have no doubt! ²⁴ Listen to me! You can pray for *anything*, and *if you believe, you have it*; it's yours! ²⁵ But when you are praying, first forgive anyone you are holding a grudge against, so that your Father in heaven will forgive you your sins too."

SPEAKING TO MOUNTAINS

I speak to every mountain in my life and command it to be removed and cast into the sea (Mark 11:23). I speak to every financial mountain to be removed from my life in the name of Jesus. Let every evil mountain hear the voice of the Lord and be removed (Mic. 6:2). I prophesy to the mountains and command them to hear the Word of the Lord and be removed (Ezek. 36:4). Let the mountains tremble at the presence of God (Hab. 3:10). I contend with every mountain and command them to hear my voice (Mic.

6:1). Lay the mountain of Esau (the flesh) to waste (Mal. 1:3). Put forth Your hand, O Lord, and overturn the mountains by the roots (Job 28:9). I speak to every mountain of debt to be removed and cast into the sea. Lord, You are against every destroying mountain (Jer. 51:25). Let the mountains melt at Your presence, O God (Judg. 5:5). Make waste the evil mountains in my life, O Lord (Isa. 42:15). I thresh every mountain, I beat them small, and I make the hills as chaff (Isa. 41:15). Every mountain in my way will become a plain (Zech. 4:7).

For God has planted them like strong and graceful oaks for his own glory.

¹⁶ When he came to the village of Nazareth, his boyhood home, he went as usual to the synagogue on Saturday, and stood up to read the Scriptures.

¹⁷ The book of Isaiah the prophet was handed to him, and he opened it to the place where it says: ¹⁸⁻¹⁹ "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me; he has appointed me to preach Good News to the poor; he has sent me to heal the brokenhearted and to announce that captives shall be released and the blind shall see, that the downtrodden shall be freed from their oppressors, and that God is ready to give blessings to all who come to him."^[a] ²⁰ He closed the book and handed it back to the attendant and sat down, while everyone

in the synagogue gazed at him intently. ²¹ Then he added, "These Scriptures came true today!"
